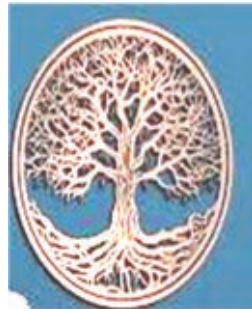

## Directives for In-Church Masses

Media reports have indicated significant spikes in coronavirus cases in 31 states that have re-opened or relaxed restrictions since limited in-church public masses began eight weeks ago. Bishop David M. O’Connell, C.M., reminds the faithful of several key points from the established diocesan directives. Please review them here:

1. COVID-19 is still extremely contagious, especially indoors or in closed settings;
2. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday/Holy Day Masses remains in effect so that all Catholic faithful, in good conscience, are not required to be physically present in church; live-streamed Masses will continue in most parishes;
3. Anyone who is sick or at risk should not come to church; that is not punitive but, rather, common sense and an act of charity toward your neighbors;
4. All parishes are expected to abide strictly by occupancy limits/restrictions and other regulations of the Diocese with care;
5. Masks must be worn (no exceptions), physical contact of any kind must be avoided, social distancing must be practiced, proper sanitation must be observed at all public in-church Masses;
6. Before attending public, in-church Masses, the Catholic faithful are asked to consider any possible health and safety risks involved.

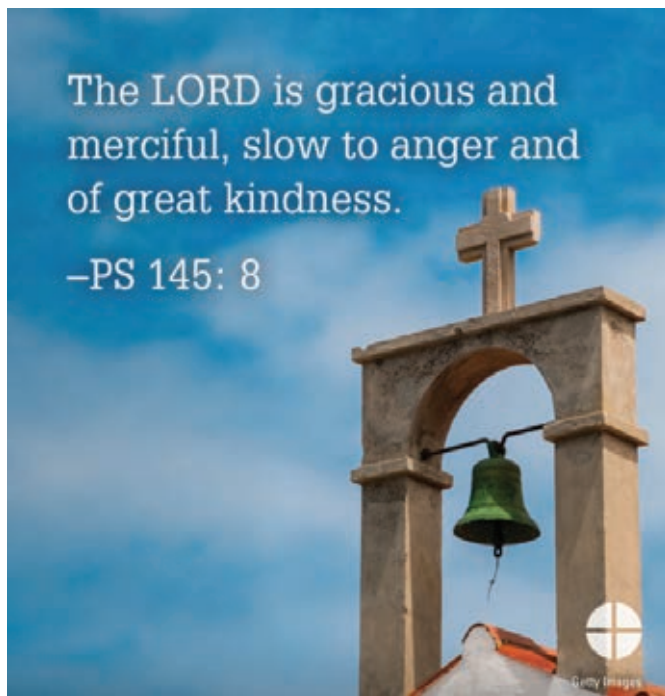

### **Diocese Responds to media report on COVID relief funding**

An article written by the Associated Press and published by multiple media outlets July 10 seems to call into question the legitimacy of the Church's request for COVID relief funding made available through the U.S. government. The Diocese of Trenton has responded to this article with the following statement:

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Trenton represents a community of parishes, schools and organizations who together employ some 7,000 individuals, many of whom have been profoundly impacted by the pandemic shutdown and are struggling like everyone else to provide for themselves and their families during these difficult times.

Our communities gratefully participated in the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) offered through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act passed by Congress and signed into law by President Trump on March 27, 2020. As defined by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, PPP "is providing small businesses with the resources they need to maintain their payroll, hire back employees who may have been laid off, and cover applicable overhead."

The Diocese and its local communities were deemed eligible and qualified to receive such government funding for these purposes and we are using these funds exclusively for these purposes. The suggestion by some in the media that previous legal settlements paid by the Church have anything to do with needing this COVID relief is false and slanderous.

**Before you write your essays please answer these several questions about your faith. Answer the questions to the best of your ability.**

- 1) *There were three (3) individuals who were born without original sin. In any order, who are they?*
- 2) *Adam and Eve fell from God's Graces in the Garden of Eden. As a result, we are all born with their original sin. How are we able to be forgiven this original sin?*
- 3) *Our Blessed Mother was Assumed into Heaven. Hence, we celebrate the Holy Day of Obligation, **The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, August 15<sup>th</sup> each year. **Ascension Thursday** is a Holy Day of Obligation and occurs forty (40) days after Easter Sunday. Why was Mary Assumed into Heaven and did not Ascend into Heaven the way her son Jesus was?*
- 4) *Explain the difference between the Immaculate Conception and the Virgin Birth. These are major beliefs in our Faith as Roman Catholics.*

Now choose **only one**, either topic A **or** B and show how the life principles mentioned inspire guidelines for your life:

- A) One of Jesus' sermons gave us the Beatitudes. As Catholics we believe there are eight (8) of them. Focusing on the eight, which one do you identify the most with and why? What are our obligations to the Catholic Faith? What are you doing to profess your faith? What changes do you need to make in your life to fulfill all of these obligations and be a better person and better Catholic?
