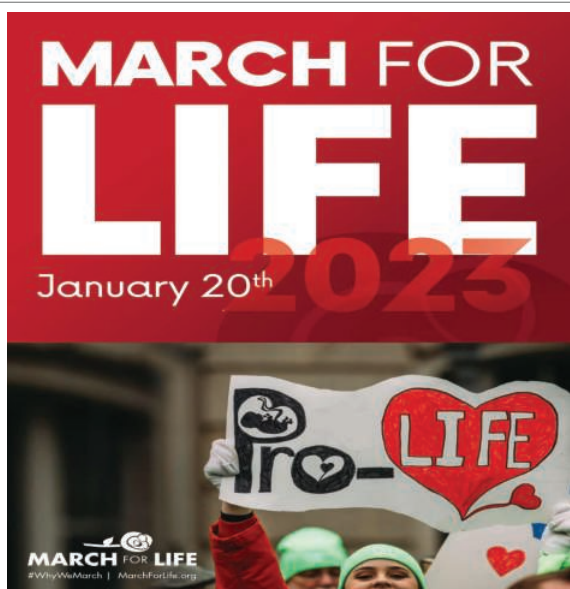

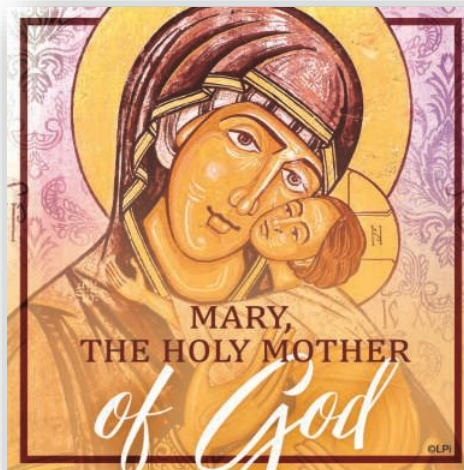

Today's Gospel repeats the proclamation that announces the naming of Jesus at the time of his circumcision. We are meant to focus particular attention on the figure of Mary.

Luke reports that "Mary kept all these things" in her heart, as she hears the message of the angels through the ambassadorship of the shepherds. Thus, we see Mary in a very real sense as the first Christian contemplative. God has communicated with her in a special way, beginning with her own immaculate conception and continuing through the birth of Jesus. Certainly, pondering within her heart led her to marvel at what God might have in store for her next.

In addition to her contemplation of divine mercy, we are also meant to see Mary as a model of obedience. Throughout Luke's initial chapters, Mary listens completely to the message of the angel and gives herself over to God's will. In reporting that Jesus was circumcised and given the name spoken by the angel, we see that Mary is faithful not only to God but to her responsibilities as a Jewish mother. Jesus is to be raised in a thoroughly faithful Jewish household. As the Mother of God, Mary is the exemplar of contemplative obedience.

*\* When we approach Mary, requesting her prayers, we approach someone who has a sublime and altogether unique relationship with God. Her role as Mediatrix of the Church is something truly singular and deserves our special recognition. That is why we honor her this day. †*





# Catechetical Corner

## PRAYER IN COMMUNION WITH MARY

“Because of Mary’s singular cooperation with the action of the Holy Spirit, the Church loves to pray in communion with the Virgin Mary, to magnify with her the great things the Lord has done for her, and to entrust supplications and praises to her” (CCC, no. 2682). This twofold movement of joining Mary in praising God for his gifts to her and seeking her intercession has found a privileged expression in the Hail Mary.

### The Hail Mary

Along with the Lord’s Prayer, the Hail Mary is one of the most widely used prayers in the Catholic Church. The first half of the Hail Mary comes from Luke’s Gospel accounts of the Angel Gabriel’s annunciation to Mary that she was called to be the Mother of God’s Son (Lk 1:26-56). The second half is an intercessory prayer developed in the Church’s tradition.

- “Hail Mary, full of grace.” This is the greeting the Angel Gabriel spoke to Mary of Nazareth. Gabriel proclaims that Mary is full of grace, meaning that she is a sinless woman, blessed with a deep union with God, who had come to dwell in her.

- “The Lord is with thee.” Mary has been chosen by God for this great privilege. He is with her, having already preserved her from sin and filled her with grace. This does not mean that Mary is deprived of her freedom. She lives in graced friendship with God and freely offers him her undivided heart.



- “Blessed art thou among women.” This was the greeting given Mary by her cousin Elizabeth when Mary came to visit and help Elizabeth with the birth of her forthcoming child (Lk 1:42). As Scripture points out, Mary holds a singular place among all God’s chosen ones in the history of salvation. Mary is the world’s most honored woman.

- “Blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.” This is another beatitude or blessing uttered by Elizabeth, who spoke these words after her child, John the Baptist, leaped in her womb at the moment she hears the greeting of Mary. Elizabeth is inspired by the Holy Spirit to bless Mary

for believing the message of Gabriel. Elizabeth acknowledges the presence of God in Mary’s womb: “How does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?” (Lk 1:43). This is the first time in Scripture that Mary’s faith is praised.

- “Holy Mary, Mother of God.” Sometime in the Middle Ages, the second half of the Hail Mary, which begins by invoking her title of Mother of God, was composed. This title comes from the earliest days of Christian faith. Mary is the Mother of God, because she is the mother of Jesus who is true God and true man, as defined by the Council of Ephesus in AD 431.



The Eastern Churches call Mary *Theotokos*, or “Birth-giver of God” (sometimes translated as “God-bearer”). Mary’s response to God engages her in the plan of human salvation through motherhood of Jesus.

- “Pray for us sinners.” We have noted that intercessory prayer concerns the needs and hopes of others. Jesus Christ, our High Priest, always intercedes for us before the Father, and he calls us to intercede for others as well. The saints and the Blessed Virgin Mary continue this prayer of intercession in heaven. As Mother of the Church, Mary continues to pray with a mother’s care for the Body of her Son on earth. At Cana, Mary interceded with Jesus on behalf of the couple who had run out of wine. Jesus heard her prayer and turned water into wine. Mary’s last words in Scripture are spoken to us: “Do

whatever he [Jesus] tells you” (Jn 2:5). Our holy Mother always brings us to Jesus.

- “Now and at the hour of our death. Amen.” In her life, Mary walked a pilgrimage of faith. Even with all the grace she received from God, she encountered the mysterious ways of God and profound suffering, especially at the death of her Son. She knows what a journey of faith entails, and she accompanies us with prayer

as we make our journey to God throughout our lives and at death.

### Other Prayers to the Blessed Virgin

In the Latin Church, the Rosary, a venerable and powerful form of prayer, developed out of popular piety. Praying the Rosary involves the recitation of vocal prayers, including the Our Father, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be, while meditating on mysteries in the life of Jesus. In the Eastern Churches, litanies and hymns to the Mother of God are more commonly prayed.

We do not pray to Mary in the same way we pray to God. In praying to Mary, we invoke her intercession on behalf of our needs, whereas when we pray to God we ask him directly for gifts and favors.





# Saint of the Week

## Basil the Great

Memorial—January 2  
329-379



Born in Caesarea, capital of Cappadocia (central Turkey), Basil studied rhetoric there and in Constantinople and Athens. He was baptized with his friend, St. Gregory Nazianzen, about 358 and ordained around 365. After being chosen bishop of Caesarea in 370, he championed the faith defined at the Council of Nicaea and refuted the Arian heresy. Many of his homilies and treatises are extant, and the monastic Rule of St. Basil is still observed in the Eastern Church. He is revered as a Doctor of the Church.

On his feast day, remember St. Basil said, "Do everything possible to make yourself worthy of the Kingdom. Do not disdain the invitation you have received" (St. Basil the Great, *Exhortation to Baptism*, 7-8, as quoted in *Advent and Christmas with the Church Fathers* [2010], 33).



"St. Basil, in a much-quoted homily, once declared that the bread we clutch in our hands belongs to the starving, the cloak we keep locked in our closet belongs to the naked, the shoes we are not using belong to the barefooted. In these ways in the post-biblical age Christians strove to keep a religious perspective on their use of material things."

## Reflections on the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God - January 1, 2023

### THE ROSARY, A TRUE TREASURE

Today is a beautiful and important feast in the life of the Church. Our focus today isn't on starting the new year--although that is certainly reason for celebration, and what better way is there to start out the new year than by going to Mass? Our focus today is on Mary and her motherhood. There is no Christmas without Christ, but there is no Christ without his mother.

Very early on the Church gave Mary the title of *Theotokos*, "God-Bearer" or "Mother of God," in recognition of her unique role in God's Plan. Some people objected (and many still object) to the title "Mother of God" because Mary is human just like us and the title seems to elevate her far above our humanity. But Mary is undeniably the mother of Jesus, and if we believe that Jesus is God, then Mary is clearly the Mother of God.

In declaring Mary to be the Holy Mother of God, we are recognizing the honor that God has already bestowed upon her by choosing her to be the mother of his Son. We are not elevating her any higher than God has already raised her. And in recognizing and proclaiming her privileged role as the Mother of God, we also recognize and claim her as our beloved Mother, entrusting ourselves to her loving care and allowing her to lead us ever closer to her Son.

### PRAYER

Prayerfully place yourself in today's Gospel reading. Imagine that you are one of the shepherds, hurrying to Bethlehem after receiving the angel's message. What do you experience when you find Mary, Joseph and Jesus in Bethlehem? What do you see? What do you feel? What do you say? What about this experience do you keep and ponder in your heart?

### RESOLUTION

Think of a time when you have encountered God in a powerful way. It might have been an answer to prayer, consolation in a time of trouble, physical or mental healing, an overwhelming sense of peace amidst anxiety, or something else. Set aside time this week to remember and reflect on that encounter with God and to praise him for it. | [formed.org](https://formed.org)
