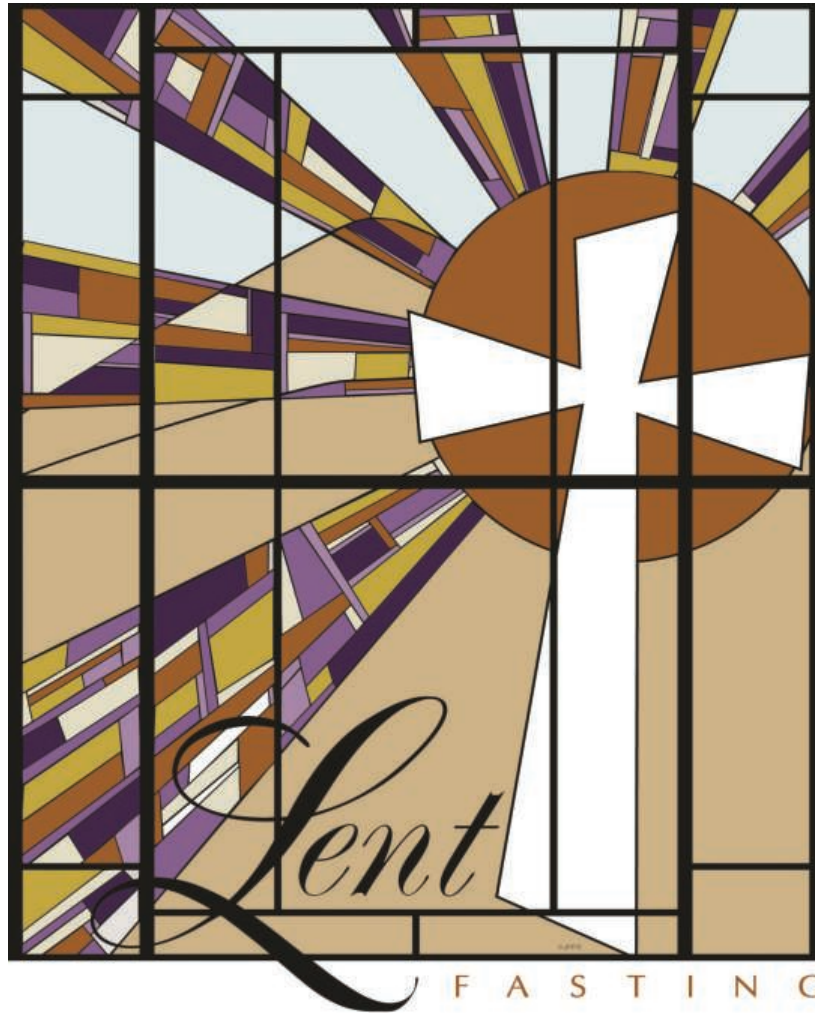

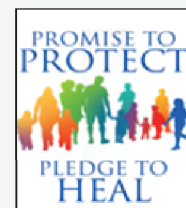

*Amazing grace, how sweet the sound,
That saved a wretch like me!
I once was lost, but now I'm found;
Was blind, but now I see.*

This spiritual song is a favorite among the elderly and nursing home residents, those for whom physical eyesight is waning, and for whom spiritual sight is increasingly significant.

Actually, it was written by John Newton, who was part of the revival of the Church of England in the late eighteenth century.

He was a self-educated man, who had gone to sea and at one time had been the captain of a ship in the African slave trade.

After his conversion, he became an ordained minister of the Church of England, finally serving as rector of a church in London.

It could well be that this personal testimony referred to his time of blindness to the awful exploitation and forced transport of the enslaved Africans. He was indeed a spiritual wretch, just as the Africans were made wretches in the stinking hold of his ship. Through an amazing grace his eyes were opened, and he could see clearly God's will for his life; and it was not to haul slaves.

** Something more spectacular happened to the man born blind, for Christ conferred on him, not only his physical sight but also spiritual insight; he opened his eyes of faith, so that the man believed in Jesus as one believes in the sun. †*

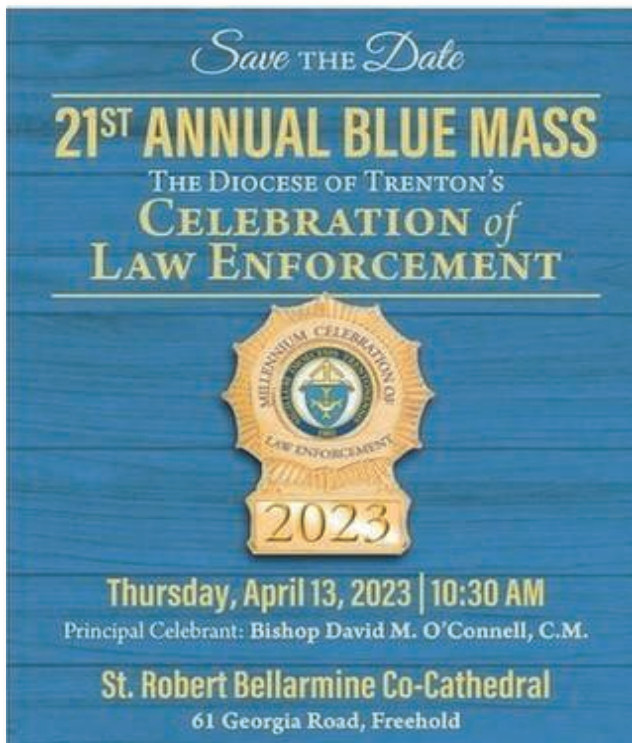
DIOCESAN BLUE MASS

The 21st Annual Mass and Celebration of Law Enforcement will be held at 10:30 a.m. April 13, the Thursday of Easter Week, in St. Robert Bellarmine Co-Cathedral, 61 Georgia Rd., Freehold. Men and women of all faiths are invited to attend this annual celebration for which Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., will be the principal celebrant and homilist.

The event, also known as the Blue Mass, has been held in the Diocese to thank God for the sacrifice and service to the communities given by police officers and law enforcement agents at every level. The Blue Mass had not been held since 2019 because of Covid-19 precautions.

This year's Mass will include the reading of names of all law enforcement personnel in the Diocese who have lost their lives in the line of duty in 2020, 2021 and 2022.

Those who are unable to attend the Blue Mass in Trenton are invited to watch via Livestream, which will be made available on the diocesan YouTube channel.

Saint Oscar Romero

1917-1980

FEAST DAY—MARCH 24

When Monsignor Oscar Romero was installed as Archbishop of San Salvador, El Salvador in February 1977, he was thrust into a tumultuous situation. A military coup in October 1979 led to a gruesome, twelve year civil war. These events were precipitated by the great disparity between a small number of powerful, wealthy families—who were backed by local politicians and the military—and the rest of El Salvador's citizens. Many people suffered extreme poverty. Laborers worked for minimal pay for wealthy landowners, yet they could not hope to obtain land for themselves. The military terrorized the people in order ensure that the families held onto land and money. The Catholic Church became a target when some clergy began to defend the poor. In response to these injustices, some Salvadorans took up arms and fought against the military.

While some Latin American clergy promoted violence as a response to injustice, Archbishop Romero advocated for a different weapon: Christian love.

Before becoming archbishop, Monsignor Romero was not aware that the government was responsible for the deaths of many civilians. Because of his quiet nature, some thought that he would be good for the position, assuming he would not meddle in controversial affairs. However, shortly after his installation, his close friend, Fr. Rutilio Grande, a priest who openly opposed the unjust practices of wealthy landowners, was assassinated by gunmen while traveling with two people to celebrate Mass. This experience awakened Archbishop Romero to the reality of the corruption in his country and prompted him to take a stand for his people's freedom.

Archbishop Romero preached many homilies that were broadcast throughout San Salvador. He persistently defended the rights of the people, calling government leaders to conversion and challenging them to uphold God's law. He reminded the people that they were loved by God and that fighting back with Christian charity was the way to victory. His vocal response to government violence against the poor led to difficulties with other clergy members and his religious superiors as well as death threats from government accomplices. In spite of these challenges, he continued to speak out on behalf of the poor.

On March 24, 1980, Archbishop Romero was shot to death while celebrating the Eucharist in the chapel of Divina Providencia hospital. Saint Oscar Romero was beatified in May 2015 and canonized on October 14, 2018 by Pope Francis.

Reflections for the 4th Week of Lent - March 19, 2023

HEALING OUR BLINDNESS

On the surface, today's Gospel would appear to be about the physical healing of a blind man, but underneath lies a play on the word "sight." In this event, Jesus is challenging those around him, including his own disciples, to "see" the world in a new way. He points out to them...and to us...that it is entirely too easy to operate with a set of false assumptions; to be "blind" to the things of God in our lives. Like those in this account, we can think we are seeing clearly, but in fact we are blinded by our own assumptions, prejudices, and egos. Of all the characters in the story of the blind man, the only one who has the gift of true sight is the blind man himself who acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah.

In this reading, we are called to ask ourselves if we see things the way God sees them or if we are looking through the eyes of the world; to examine where we might be blind spiritually; where we are looking at appearances, not reality. As God says to the prophet Samuel in the first reading: "Not as man sees does God see because man sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart."

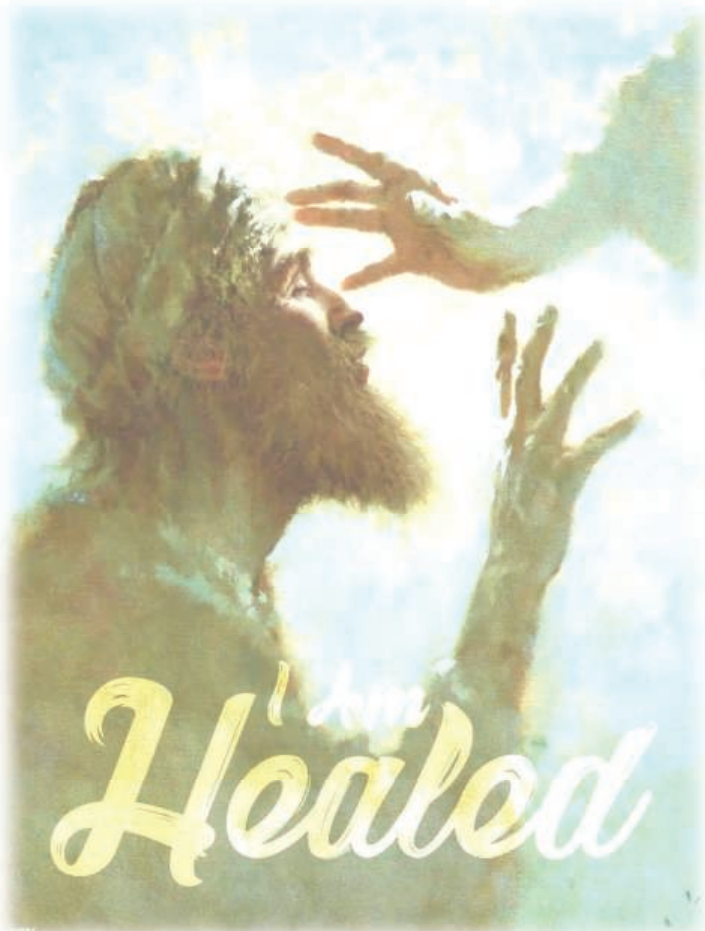
This Gospel reminds us that the way we see best is through the eyes of faith, for then we see the world the way God sees it. But first we have to recognize that without Jesus, we are truly blind.

PRAYER

Imagine that you are with the blind man who was cured when Jesus comes to find him. You hear Jesus ask: "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" and you hear the man respond, "I do believe, Lord." Then see Jesus turn toward you and ask you the same question. Do you believe that Jesus is truly the Son of Man? How do you respond to Jesus? What do you think he might say to you in return?

RESOLUTION

We all need to ask ourselves the hard questions about our beliefs so that we can grow and develop in our faith. This week, consider Jesus' question, "Do believe in the Son of Man?" and ask that he help you come to a greater understanding of who he really is and that you live your life more in union with him. formed.org
