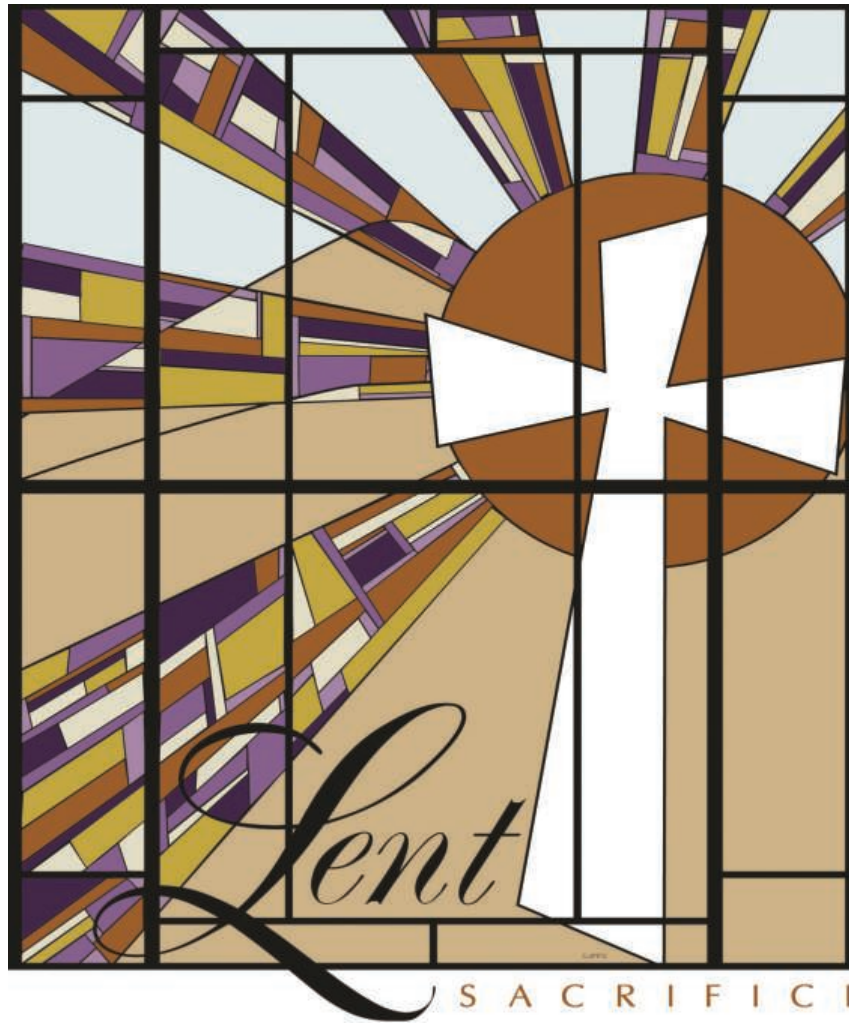

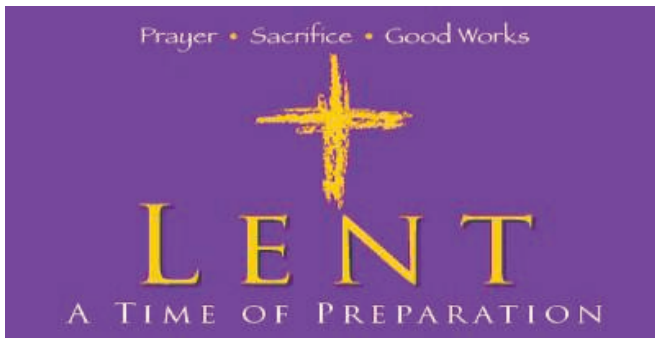

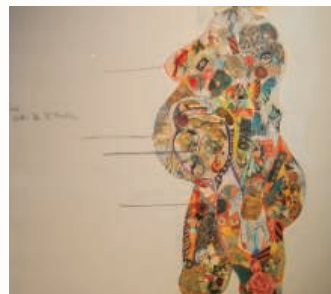

Dr. A. L. Jenkins was an emergency-room doctor for 48 years in Knoxville, Tennessee. In this capacity, Dr. Jenkins saw the best and the worst side of the field of medicine.

But his most vivid memories are of those moments that are medically unexplainable.

Dr. Jenkins recalls one man who was dead on arrival in the emergency room. It was Dr. Jenkins' policy to attempt resuscitation anyway. After fifteen minutes of CPR, the previously dead man began to show signs of life.

The man sat up, looked around him, and then said to Dr. Jenkins, "Oh, I wish I was still out there! It was beautiful!" The man would never explain what he meant but would only repeat that the place he had been was "so beautiful, so beautiful."

**Now, many explanations have been given for so-called near-death experiences, including chemical changes in the brain.*

But all explanations aside, it is amazing how these experiences affirm what the Bible teaches us about life beyond the grave.

There will come a time when the doctor can do no more for us, but somewhere on the other side, Christ will say, "Mike, Joe, Sally, come out of your tombs!" †

Reflect on what strengthens your faith and ways in which you can continue to build a strong foundation. How can you be more open to God's will in your life?

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Every April Catholic parishes and schools across the U.S. participate in National Child Abuse Prevention Month. While dioceses work year-round to prevent abuse, during the month of April a special emphasis is placed on the importance of learning how to protect the vulnerable from this evil.

Safety for All

Every child deserves a safe environment. Ministry to children and young people is a privilege, not a right. The sexual abuse of minors is a crime and a grave sin. In accordance with diocesan policy, when a single act of sexual abuse is admitted or established, the offender is to be removed permanently from ministry. To help hold offenders accountable, report all abuse to local police authorities. You can also contact the diocesan victim assistance coordinator to make a report and seek outreach for the abused. These individuals are available to assist you in making a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese/eparchy, in arranging a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative, and for obtaining support for your specific needs.

Rights and Responsibilities

The principles that guide Catholic Social Teaching are derived from both Scripture and Tradition. Centuries of reflection on both God's revelation and the human condition have led the Church to delineate a set of underlying principles that reflect our moral theology, and the Christian anthropology that shape our teaching and preaching.

One important aspect of Catholic Social Teaching is the balancing of rights and responsibilities. The Church believes that every human being has certain rights as a child of God. The Second Vatican Council's document, "Gaudium et Spes," or The Church in the Modern World, says:

There is a growing awareness of the sublime dignity of human persons, who stand above all things and whose rights and duties are universal and inviolable. They ought, therefore, to have ready access to all that is necessary for living a genuinely human life: for example, food, clothing, housing, the right freely to choose their state of life and set up a family, the right to education, work, to their good name, to respect, to proper knowledge, the right to act according to the dictates of conscience and to safeguard their privacy, and rightful freedom, including freedom of religion.

But these rights are balanced by responsibilities. Every human being has the duty to one another, to our families, and to our society. These responsibilities include moral rectitude and a willingness to make sacrifices for the common good of all. Without these responsibilities, human rights can too easily become a personal competition for scarce resources.

Reflections for the 5th Week of Lent - March 26, 2023

THE RAISING OF LAZARUS

The story of the raising of Lazarus is more than just an account of a miracle. The raising and unbinding of Lazarus sheds light on how God wants to heal the dead areas of our lives and free us from whatever sins, burdens, or wounds prevent us from living life to the fullest.

When Jesus arrives at the tomb, he has the stone rolled away and calls Lazarus to come out. Lazarus emerges, although he is still bound in the burial cloths. We are often like Lazarus. We have areas in our lives that are dead and need to be enlivened again by Christ. But we also may be bound either by our own sins or by the hurts that have been inflicted on us. We may carry great burdens or worries or dysfunctional patterns of relating to others that bind us down and keep us from peace and happiness. Jesus wants to free us from those wounds; he wants us, like Lazarus, to be unbound.

This week's Gospel shows us Jesus wants us to let him into all those places that have been rendered dead by sin. He wants to weep with us in his humanity, but also to reveal his divinity and bring about a total healing. He wants our better selves to step forward as he says to each of us, "Come out." Even if our situation seems hopeless—and certainly Lazarus' death seemed hopeless for his many mourners—nothing is impossible for God. All we need to do is surrender our lives to him and trust in him, for him to be able to bring us to new life.

PRAYER

Think back over your life and choose a moment where, through your sin or the sin of another, you might have become spiritually dead and entombed like Lazarus. Feel the way the sin binds you, entrapping you in ways that prevent you from being the whole and holy person God created you to be. Take a few moments to consider that sin and all the ways it has hindered your life. Ask God to forgive you if it is a sin you committed. If the sin has been committed against you, ask God to forgive that person and to help you let it go. Imagine Jesus calling your name and saying to you what he said to Lazarus: "Come out!" Hear him say that you are now untied and free.

RESOLUTION

This week, ask Jesus to release you from any sin or hurt that might still be binding you. Consider receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation for forgiveness and for the grace to be unbound. | formed.org
