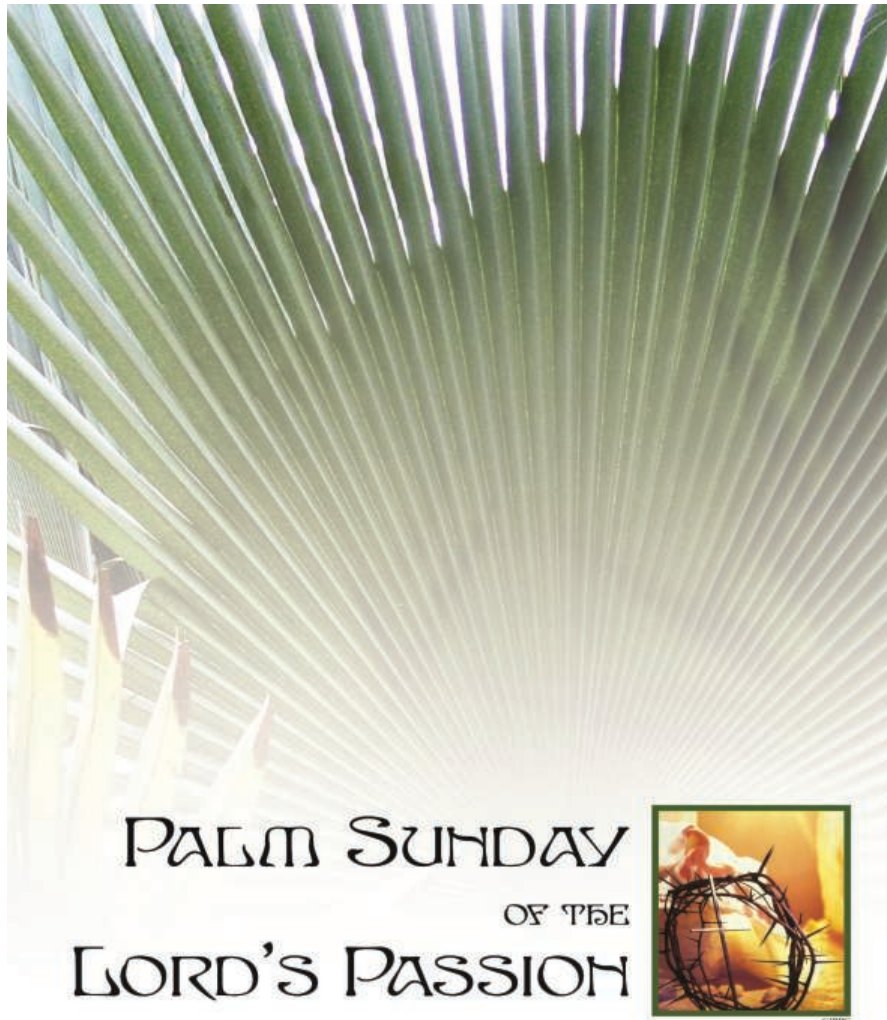
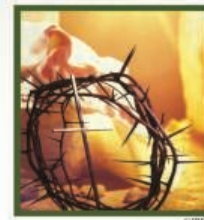

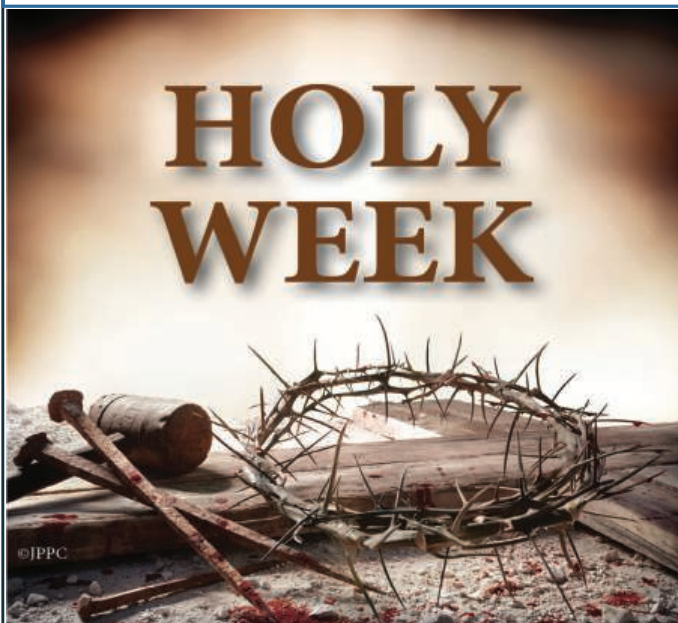

Constantine the Great was the first Christian Roman emperor. It is said that when he ascended the throne, he discovered that many Christians held important jobs in the government and the court. So, he issued an executive order to all those Christians: "Either give up Christ or give up your jobs."

The emperor was pleased with the majority who showed the courage of their convictions and gave their jobs back to them saying: "If you will not be true to your God, you will not be true to me either."

As we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we are reminded that Lent is coming to close and the Resurrection is nearing. What have you learned about yourself this Lent? What have you learned about your relationship with God?

Palms vs. Passion

Each year at around this time, as Lent draws to a close, and Easter nears, Catholics everywhere look at their parish bulletins, missalettes, and publications, and wonder why the last Sunday in Lent is called "Passion Sunday" and not "Palm Sunday."

The formal designation changed in 1970; still, many people are much more accustomed to calling it "Palm Sunday."

The palms, of course, are a commemoration of the ancient custom of covering the path of an honored person as he passed by. In many parts of the Near East, this was among the highest honors, often reserved for royalty. All four of the Gospels speak of Jesus receiving this honor as he entered triumphantly into Jerusalem, days before his execution. In Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the crowds are said to have laid their cloaks in the street, as well as cut rushes. Only John's Gospel specifically mentions palm fronds.

It's the custom in Catholic churches to give people palms that are blessed at the beginning of the liturgy and carried in procession at the start of the mass. It is many people's private custom to weave these palms into crosses or other shapes during the liturgy. I would like to believe that they're not doing this during my homily, but experience tells me they are.

Ultimately, the celebration of this day isn't about the palms, any more than the celebration of Christmas is about decorated evergreen trees. As the prayers and scripture readings make clear, the liturgy is really about Christ's passion—his willingness to suffer for our salvation and the forgiveness of our sins. By the end of the reading of the passion narrative, the palms seem sad and ironic, as the crowds who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem would be transformed into the crowd shouting "Crucify him!" during his trial. Human fickleness and frailty are contrasted with Jesus' integrity and courage.

So, it makes sense to call it "Passion Sunday." Still, old customs and old terminology don't change easily.

Holy Week

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

We look forward to celebrating these liturgical services that take place during the Triduum with you:

Holy Thursday—April 6, 2023
Mass of the Lord's Supper

Good Friday—April 7, 2023
Good Friday of the Lord's Passion


Easter Sunday—April 9, 2023
Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

Reflection for Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion — April 5, 2023

NOT MY WILL

The week that begins with Palm Sunday contains what are sometimes called the “High Holy Days” of Christianity. They are called this because they commemorate the last days of the life of Jesus as he goes from the Last Supper to the tomb, and contain the most sacred moments of Christian history. Over the past few weeks one of our Adult Faith Formation groups has undertaken a study of these iconic moments in the life of Jesus.

While there are many aspects of this week that we can look at, our focus this week is on the Garden of Gethsemane. After the Last Supper, Jesus goes to the Garden to pray and prepare for what lies ahead. Knowing that he will face incredible suffering, he prays to the Father, asking that if it is possible that the “cup” he must drink could pass.

In these moments, we see Jesus, the man. He is fearful and anxious, even to the point of sweating blood. Yet, he unites his suffering—he dreads the coming events—with his Father and is able to not just passively acquiesce to his Passion, but embrace it. He doesn't deny his pain, but unites it to the Father in an act of perfect love.

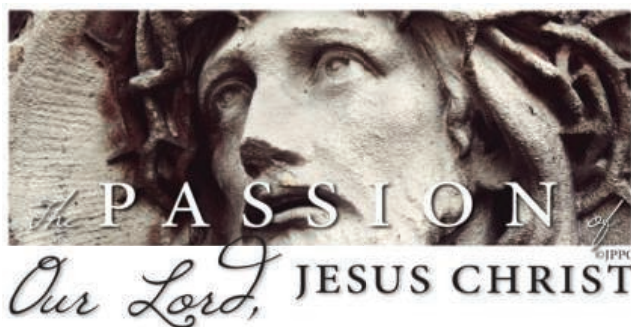
The lesson is clear for us. We all are called to love God and do the Father's will, even when it is difficult. But love involves sacrifice—dying to one's self and making sacrifices for the ones we love. Indeed, love demands that we sometimes do things that we don't want to do to serve the good of others. We can use the example of Christ in the Garden to accept our crosses as well.

PRAYER

Put yourself in the scene of Jesus in the Garden at Gethsemane. You are with the other disciples in the Garden as Jesus leaves you to pray alone. Dimly, through the darkness, you can see him fall prostrate in prayer and you hear him say, “My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will.” What do you think as you hear Jesus, the strong, confident man, cry out to the Father to be spared the “cup”? Now imagine that you can say something to Jesus. What would you say? What does he say back to you? Hold those thoughts in your heart for a few minutes.

RESOLUTION

Is there a bitter “cup” that you are being asked to drink? Perhaps you sense you that you should do something you dread to do—such as admit a fault, apologize to someone, tell someone the full truth about something you've been hiding, or confess your sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Or perhaps you are facing some trial with family, an illness or a financial problem. This week, remember Jesus in the Garden and pray for the strength and resolve to do God's will and accept your cup. | formed.org
