STORIES THAT UPLIFT

John 20:19-31
2nd Sunday of Easter - Year A

The story is told about Albert Einstein, the brilliant physicist of Princeton University in the early 20th century. Einstein was traveling from Princeton on a train, and when the conductor came down the aisle to punch the passengers' tickets, Einstein could not find his.

He looked in his vest pocket, he looked in his pants pocket, he looked in his briefcase, but there was no ticket. The conductor was gracious; "Not to worry, Dr. Einstein, I know who you are, we all know who you are, and I am sure you bought a ticket."

As the conductor moved down the aisle, he looked back and noticed Einstein on his hands and knees, searching under the seat for his ticket. The conductor returned to Einstein; "Dr. Einstein, Dr. Einstein, do not worry. I know who you are. You do not need a ticket. I am sure you bought one."

Einstein arose and said, "Young man, I too know who I am; what I do not know is where I am going."

** Through elation and deflation and every emotion in between, this truth remains—we know whose we are, and we know where we are going, because with his death and resurrection Jesus promised us life eternal. This is the good news of Easter. †*



Faustina Kowalska

August 25, 1905 – October 5, 1938

Feast Day—October 5

On Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated the weekend after Easter, the Gospel tells the story of when Jesus appeared in a locked room where the disciples were hiding.

John 20:19-23

Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

We recognize St. Faustina as the Saint of the Week this week, even though her feast is in October, because of her role in spreading the message of Divine Mercy. Jesus appeared to her many times and spoke of his great and unfathomable mercy to those who would trust in him. Jesus told St. Faustina that he wanted the Sunday after Easter to be celebrated as a "Feast of Mercy," as a refuge for all souls, especially poor sinners.

St. Faustina was born in 1905 into a poor Polish family and experienced a religious calling from a young age. She initially deferred pursuing a religious vocation to help her family with her earnings as a housekeeper. At age 19, after a vision of the suffering Jesus, she earnestly sought entrance into religious life. Initially turned away by many convents, she entered the order of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in August 1925. In April 1928, she took her first vows with her parents in attendance.

St. Faustina served the Congregation in Krakow, Plock, and Vilnius as a cook, gardener, and porter. While living a simple religious life, she grew in great union with God, experiencing profound sufferings as well as

consolations. She had many visions of Jesus and wrote a diary of her experiences. St. Faustina died from tuberculosis at the age of 33 in 1938.



In 1959, the Vatican suppressed the Divine Mercy devotion. But in 1978, the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith lifted the suppression after new original documents were examined and texts were retranslated. Then-Cardinal Karol Wojtyla strongly promoted the message of Divine Mercy. Later, as Pope John Paul II, he canonized St. Faustina, in April 2000, and designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Because of her work fostering devotion

to Divine Mercy, St. Faustina is known as the "apostle of Divine Mercy."

Notes and Quotes for Reflection on Divine Mercy

From Creation, God has revealed his nature as love itself, in Sacred Scripture and most perfectly in the life, Passion, Death, and Resurrection of his Son, Jesus. Saints have also borne witness to God's unfathomable love, e.g., in the writings of Augustine, Aquinas, Catherine of Siena, Francis of Assisi, Margaret Mary Alacoque, and Therese of Lisieux.

In his second encyclical, *Rich in Mercy*, St. John Paul II offers an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls "the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God" (*Dives in Misericordia*, no. 13). He returned to this theme throughout his pontificate:

As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!

Lord, who reveals the Father's love by Your death and Resurrection, we believe in You and confidently repeat to You today: Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world.

What is mercy if not the boundless love of God, who confronted with human sin, restrains the sentiment of severe justice and, allowing Himself to be moved by the wretchedness of His creatures, spurs Himself to the total gift of self, in the Son's cross . . . ?

Who can say that he is free from sin and does not need God's mercy? As people of this

restless time of ours, wavering between the emptiness of self-exaltation and the humiliation of despair, we have a greater need than ever for a regenerating experience of mercy.

He dedicated his second Encyclical to it and throughout his pontificate made himself a missionary of God's love to all peoples.

Reflection for the Sunday of Divine Mercy — April 16, 2023

PEACE AND MERCY

The second Sunday after Easter is designated Divine Mercy Sunday. It's a recent feast in the Church, instituted in 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II. He felt that immediately after Easter, while the Paschal mysteries were fresh in our hearts, we needed an opportunity to reflect more deeply on God's great mercy, manifested in the Resurrection.

So how does this feast fit with the Gospel reading of Jesus's appearance in the Upper Room? When the reading begins, the disciples are hiding in fear for their lives, certain that the officials would be coming to get them just as they came to get Jesus. Compounding their fear is the recognition that they had abandoned Jesus in his hour of greatest need. They are scared, disgraced, and guilty. At that very moment, who should enter into their sorrow and shame but Jesus himself. Jesus comes, despite the locked door, to stand in their midst, offering them both peace and mercy. In addition, he tells them that through the power of the Holy Spirit, they, too, will have the ability to extend mercy by forgiving sins.

Today, through our priests who have been ordained in apostolic succession, we, too, can receive mercy and forgiveness. All we need to do is repent and trust in the mercy of God. Indeed, today's feast invites us to trust that no matter what wrong we may have done, Jesus loves us and wants us to experience his mercy. That's why one simple prayer associated with Divine Mercy devotion sums up the confidence we should have in Christ's mercy: "Jesus, I trust in you."

PRAYER

Imagine you are in the closed room with the other disciples hiding in fear on that first Easter Sunday. The door is bolted but suddenly Jesus is standing right before you and says, "Peace be with you." How do you envision the other Apostles responding to Christ's appearance? How might you respond?

RESOLUTION

If we are to have the peace Jesus wants for us, we must learn to trust in his mercy and goodness. Consider one area in your life where you lack peace. How can you increase your peace by increasing your trust? As you contemplate this, pray, "Jesus, I trust in you."
