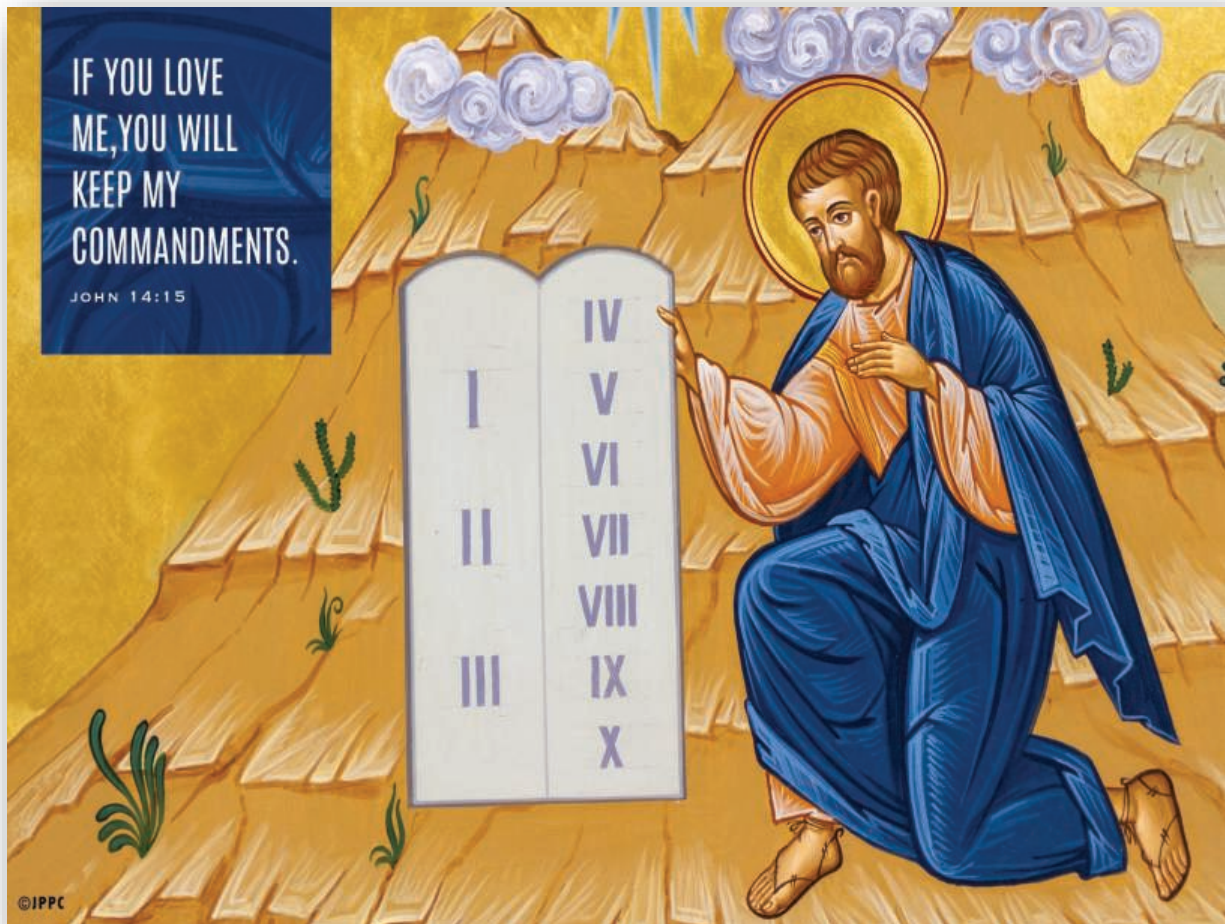

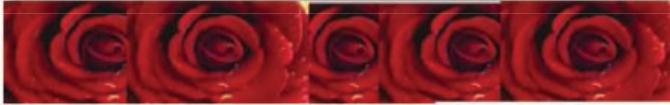

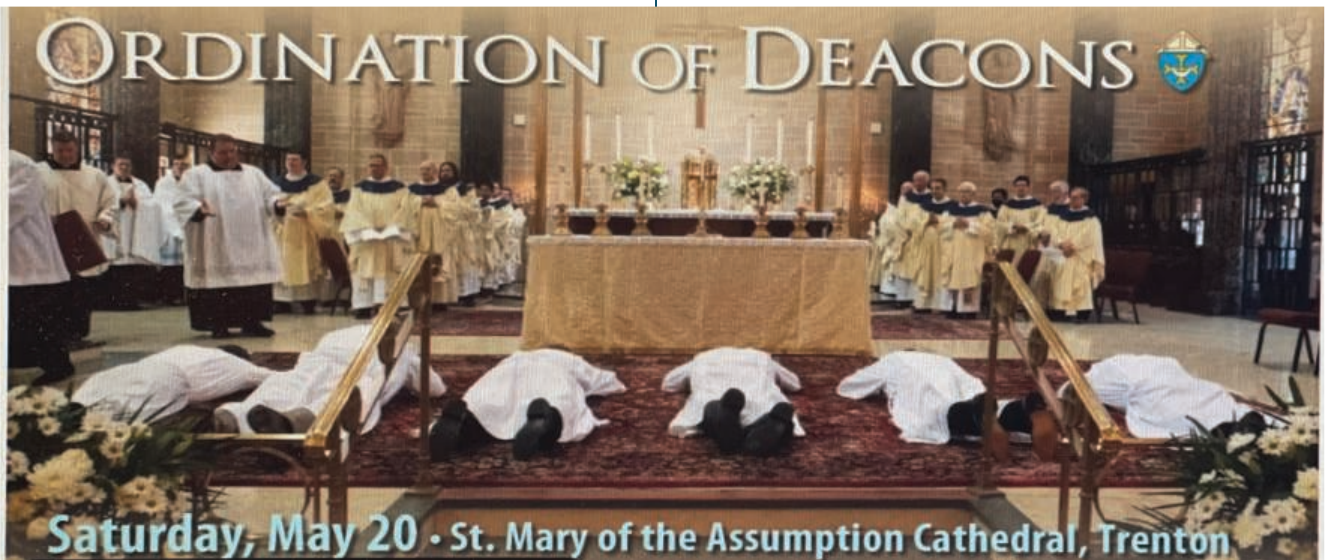

STORIES THAT UPLIFT

John 14:15-21

6th Sunday of Easter - Year A

Stashed away in a drawer somewhere around the house, now nearly forgotten, is a batch of old 45 rpm records from the '50s and early '60s. Worn and scratchy, long since outmoded by the flashy digital technology of compact discs, these primitive vinyls were once the jewels of a great treasure trove.

Here and there in this dusty stack, one can find an occasional recording by the great blues master Jimmy Reed. In placing the phonograph needle again and again in the grooves of Jimmy Reed's records, you can notice something curious.

If one listens very carefully, there can sometimes be heard, ever so faintly in the background, a soft woman's voice murmuring in advance the next verse of the song. The story that grew up around this—and perhaps it is true—was that Jimmy Reed was so absorbed in the bluesy beat and the throbbing guitar riffs of his music that he simply could not remember the words of his own songs.

He needed help with the lyrics, and the woman's voice was none other than that of his wife, devotedly coaching her husband through the recording session by whispering the upcoming stanzas into his ear as he sang.

**Whether or not this story is accurate, we will surely recognize a parallel experience. Jesus tells his followers that the role of the Holy Spirit is, in effect, to whisper the lyrics of the Gospel song in our souls, all the time. †*

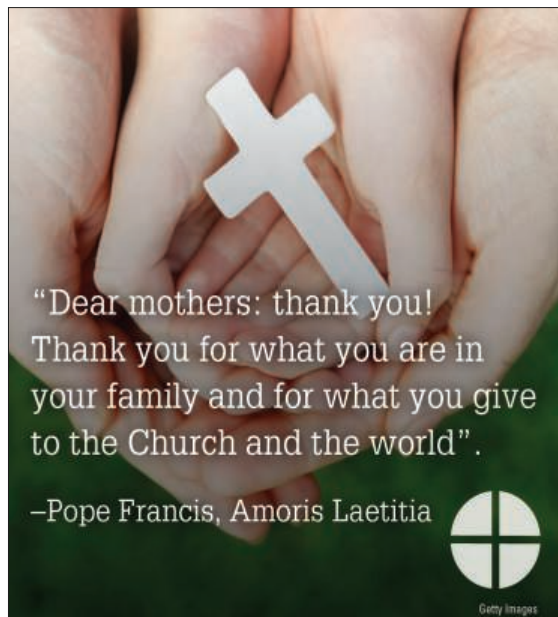


May 31, 2023: Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Sixth Sunday of Easter: The Paschal Mystery



This Eucharistic Prayer Companion is designed to help you spend 30 minutes to an hour in meditation and silent prayer with Jesus during Eucharistic adoration. Even if you cannot be physically present in a church or adoration chapel with the Blessed Sacrament, you can unite yourself spiritually to Jesus in the Eucharist as you spend this time in prayer.

THE GRACE I SEEK: to believe that the graces of the Paschal Mystery are always available to me.

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Jesus, the Lord of Life, has given himself to you in the Eucharist. He is gazing upon you, his beloved child, with great love at this very moment. Pause for a few moments and allow yourself to rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to believe that what you accomplished through your Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension is a gift of grace for me.

MEDITATING ON THE MYSTERIES: ANAMNESIS — *Read slowly, allowing your senses to help you enter into this moment of the Mass. Let the Holy Spirit fill your heart with his divine grace, that the hidden mystery from this moment in our memorial of Christ's sacrifice may be revealed more abundantly to you.*

As the Sacred Victim lies peacefully upon the altar, you remain kneeling, as moments of silence mingle with the prayers that evoke the drama of redemption. The priest stands in the "orans" position, hands at either side of his body, prayerfully erect. "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven ... Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church, and recognizing the sacrificial Victim by whose Death you willed to reconcile us to yourself ... grant that we may become one body, one spirit in Christ." You know this is real. You know this is true. Not only is the sacrifice of Jesus made present to you so that you may participate in it, but so too is his triumph! Sacred, living memory draws you up and into this mystery, as Heaven truly kisses Earth. That desire deep within you for eternity is awakened, and you are sure in these moments that Jesus makes all things new.

FOR REFLECTION — *Allow yourself to reflect for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.*

How can you be more fully, actively, and consciously present at Mass—body, heart, and mind? How can the truth of the Paschal Mystery move your heart and soul to be more engaged with praying the Mass? How can your whole being truly be one in worship of your loving Jesus?

GOSPEL MEDITATION — *Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.*

I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. (John 14:18–20)

FOR REFLECTION — *Allow yourself to reflect for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.*

Jesus wants us to be one with him. It is through the Paschal Mystery—his Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension—that he makes this communion possible. What is the next step Jesus is inviting you to take toward a deeper encounter with him through the Paschal Mystery?

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — Grant, almighty God, that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy, which we keep in honor of the risen Lord, and that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Sixth Sunday of Easter)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to be faithful to the graces of the Paschal Mystery.

Reflection for 6th Sunday of Easter — May 14, 2023

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH

While our salvation was won by Jesus's Death, our lives in Christ are not completely fulfilled until we receive the Advocate, the Spirit of truth, that Jesus promised to send us. That Spirit of truth is the Third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit. It is only through the Spirit that we are able to enter into the fullness of communion with the Father and the Son and embrace the Good News of the Gospel in our daily lives.

Today's First Reading shows us how that works. Although Jesus himself had passed through Samaria, and even revealed himself as the Messiah to the woman at the well, it wasn't until after the Holy Spirit had come that the people in that region were able to fully accept Philip and his teachings about Jesus. Then, once they were able to accept Jesus through Baptism, Peter and John came, prayed, laid hands on the people, and the Holy Spirit descended upon them.

This reading may shed some light in the important distinction between the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Baptism brings us into the family of God, but Confirmation enables us to live out the Christian message with greater courage and conviction through the Holy Spirit.

Moreover, Jesus says that not only is the Spirit *with* us, but he actually remains *within* us. This is why Jesus tells us that "I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you." Through the action of the Spirit, we are united in an unprecedented way with God and can truly become his sons and daughters.

PRAYER

Picture yourself in the crowd in Samaria as Peter and John pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. You watch as they lay hands on the people. Now imagine that Peter comes to you and lays hands on you. What do you tell him? What does he say to you?

RESOLUTION

Ask the Holy Spirit to enter into your being in a new and profound way this week. Watch for evidence of his presence and give thanks. | formed.org
