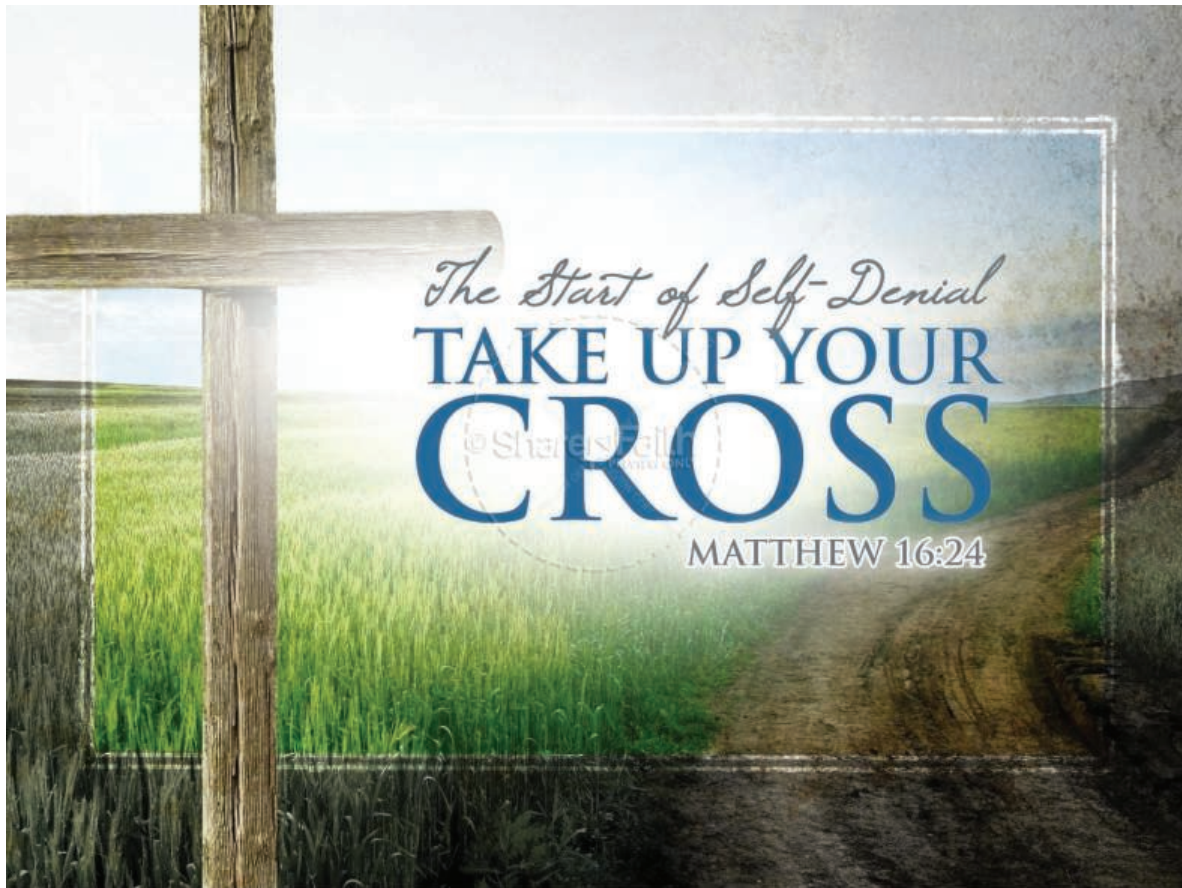

Next weekend our parish will welcome Fr. Innocent Onuh making the appeal at all Masses, September 9 & 10.

THE APOSTLES OF DIVINE CHARITY (CHARITAN MISSIONARIES)

Who We Are:

The Apostles of Divine Charity is a male Religious Association founded exclusively to help the poor and serve their needs. Our mission is primarily centered on our profound concern for the poor and the needy, especially those who are given less or zero attention in their communities. Our mission is to help this class of people reinstate their sense of value and help them become more cognizant of their relevance to human society, to themselves, their families, and to God. Our intention is to offer counseling to them, understand their needs, provide education to them, and discern the best ways of helping them become better persons, for the sake of God’s Kingdom. Making visible and practical the Mercy and the Love of God through Works of Charity and by the means of Corporal Works of Mercy is the major ingredient of our mission. Our utmost desire is to be the mouthpiece of God and "another Christ" to the poor and the needy.

Specific Means of Fulfilling our Mission:

1. **Education:** Providing education to children and youth who have an interest to go to school but have no one to support them. We also offer adult education to interested adults who did not have the opportunity to receive formal education when they were younger due to poverty and lack of money.
2. **Healthcare Provision:** Providing health care services to the people of God is also an integral means of fulfilling our Charitan mission.
3. **Youth Apostolate:** We are also into active youth apostolate aimed at providing moral and religious education to the youth.
4. **Orphanage Ministry:** Ministering to the orphans and the vulnerable children occupies a very important place in our charism. We have orphanage centers where we provide shelter, food, clothing, and sound education to the homeless, orphans and indigent children.
5. **Caring for Retired Priests/Religious and Elderly People:** We also extend our apostolate to priests and religious who are retired or inactive due to their health conditions or other reasons, and elderly people whose family members are not able to care for them.
6. **Home Visitations:** Through our house-to-house visitation apostolate, we are exposed to the needs of the community that we serve. By having healthy interactions with the people, we stand a better chance of getting to know them and the pastoral needs they have.
7. **Parish Work:** We are also open to running as many parishes as assigned to us by the local ordinary. At our parishes, we strive to be priests and servants to the people of God. In other words, the spiritual and the pastoral needs of the parishioners are our topmost priority.

OVERVIEW

The mission of the National Eucharistic Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This revival movement is in answer to a call by the Holy Spirit, and all the fruits belong to him.

The revival is an unprecedented movement of Catholics across the United States—healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—sent out on mission “for the life of the world.”

The Eucharistic Revival is not a step-by-step plan or a series of meetings. Rather, the revival is a grassroots call and a challenge for every Catholic across the United States to rekindle the fire of love and devotion for the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.



St. Monica Parish will officially launch our “**Year of Parish Revival**” on October First. At that time parishioners will be invited to join in a number of activities, all devoted to reinvigorate worship and inspire liturgies, in hopes of truly encountering the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. You will be asked to “**Come and See**” Jesus in Eucharistic Processions outside on our property, in Small Study Groups, in evening Adoration each month, in Pilgrimages to holy places in our area, and of course, in the Eucharist at Mass. And this is just the beginning! Father Alex, our Deacons, and our Adult Faith Formation Team are starting a fire, not a program! **Come and See!**

This traveling exhibit has been created to assist those who will experience it to affirm belief in the Real Presence of the Jesus in the Eucharist. It is based upon the website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis to catalogue all the eucharistic miracles that have taken place worldwide.

The exhibit is circular and is divided into seven sections or rooms. In the first six rooms, information about the Eucharistic miracles is displayed. Each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013. Be sure to notice the date on the timeline and some of the world events that will help you to place in within the historical era.

All of the rooms point to the center of the exhibit. This is to intentionally remind us that the historical miracles we are learning about on the walls of the exhibit are all pointing to the miracle in front of us—Jesus, present in the Most Holy Eucharist! In the seventh room, the Eucharist is clearly visible in the monstrance and a place has been prepared for you to rest a while in His presence.

Reflections on the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time — September 3, 2023

THE WORD BURNING WITHIN

Jeremiah is angry in today's first reading. So angry, he says that God had duped him. The connotation is that God has somehow let him down and deceived him. If you know something about Jeremiah's life, it's easy to see why he feels this way. God called him to be a prophet and then appointed him to bring very bad news to the Israelites: they were going to be sent into exile for their sins. Needless to say, such a message wasn't very popular and the prophet has to bear the brunt of the people's anger. In turn, Jeremiah becomes angry with God for saddling him with such a thankless task. In the end, however, Jeremiah concedes that even if he wanted to, he couldn't deny the Word of God that burns within him.

We can find ourselves in a similar place. When the Word of God burns within us, it can be sweet, but sometimes it can be very difficult. If we are to faithfully pronounce that Word, we must be totally in love with the Lord, for it is only when we are enamored with God that we can do what St. Paul says: offer our entire lives as a sacrifice to God to be consumed.

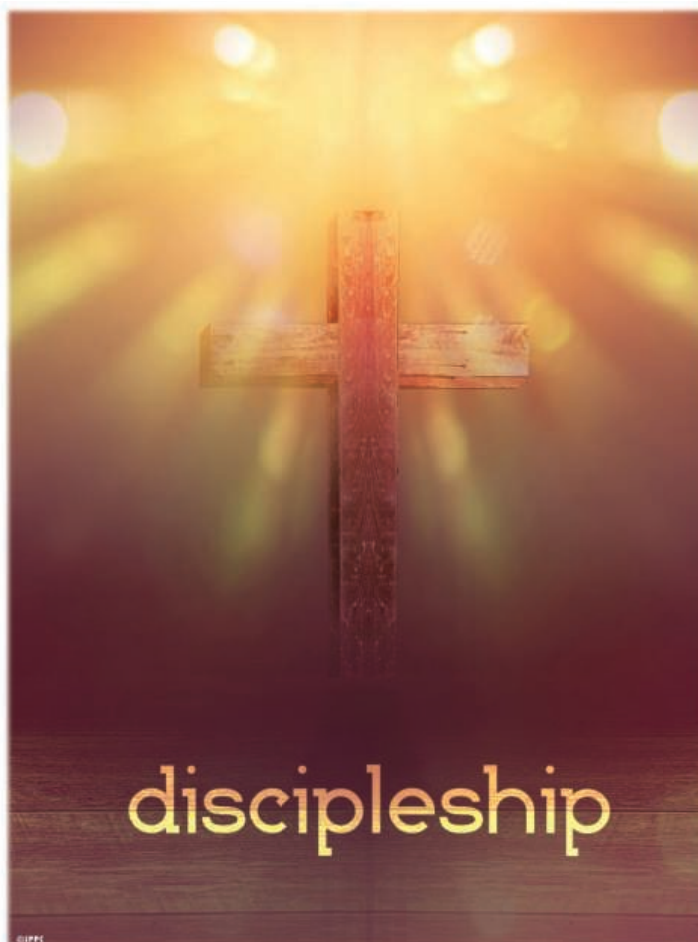
Just as Jeremiah was consumed and transformed by the Word that burned within him, we likewise need to be transformed until we become completely pleasing to the Lord. This transformation then leads us from thinking in human terms to thinking as God thinks—and putting on the mind of Christ, as St. Paul says, so that we can unite ourselves fully and completely with Our Lord.

PRAYER

"O God, you are my God whom I seek; My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God." In what ways are you seeking God right now? How is your soul thirsting for God? Consider a time when you felt particularly close to God, when you experienced some kind of inner transformation and you could say with the psalmist: "You are my help, and in the shadow of your wings I shout for joy."

RESOLUTION

This week, allow yourself to spend some quiet time in the presence of the Lord. Ask yourself how, like Jeremiah, the Word of God can burn within you. |[formed.org](https://www.formed.org)
