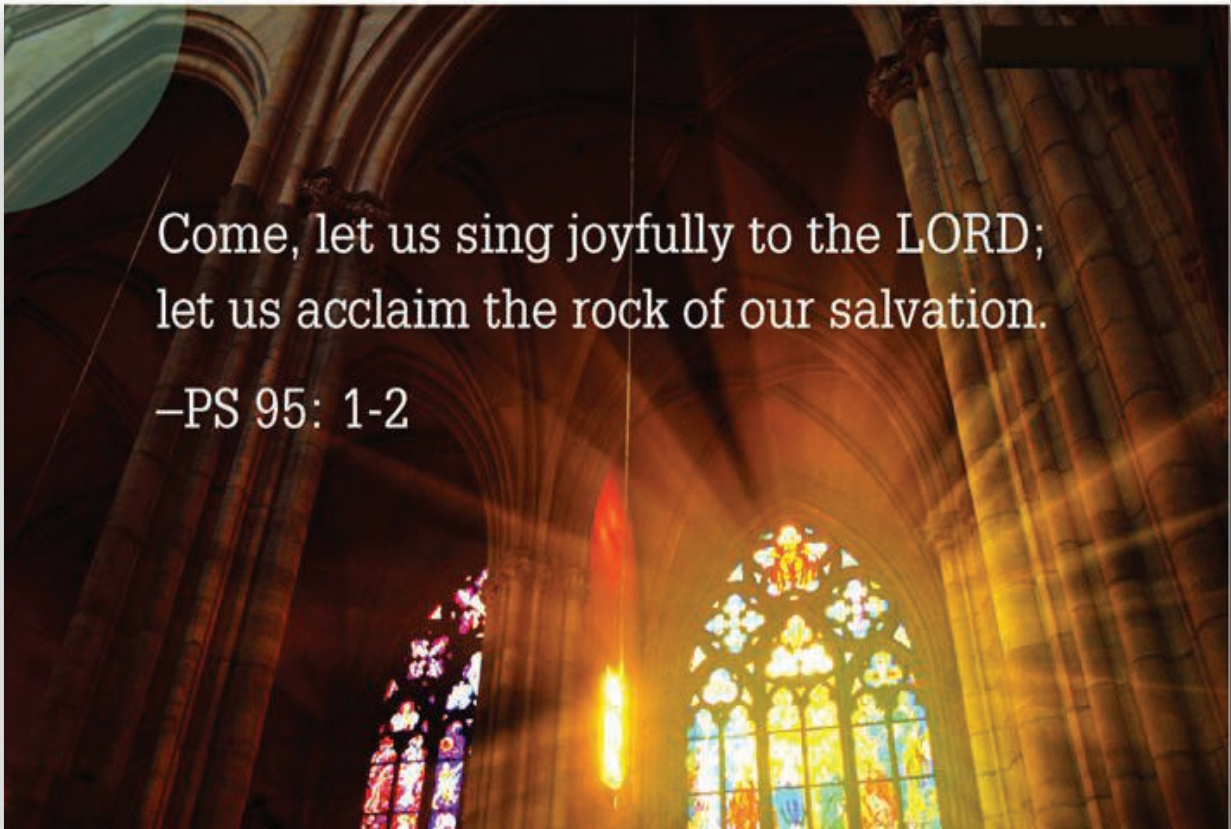

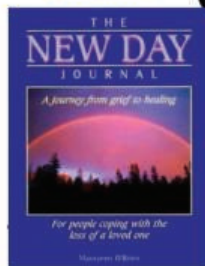

National Eucharistic Revival

OVERVIEW

The mission of the National Eucharistic Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This revival movement is in answer to a call by the Holy Spirit, and all the fruits belong to him.

The revival is an unprecedented movement of Catholics across the United States—healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—sent out on mission “for the life of the world.”

The Eucharistic Revival is not a step-by-step plan or a series of meetings. Rather, the revival is a grassroots call and a challenge for every Catholic across the United States to rekindle the fire of love and devotion for the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.



St. Monica Parish will officially launch our “**Year of Parish Revival**” on October First. At that time parishioners will be invited to join in a number of activities, all devoted to reinvigorate worship and inspire liturgies, in hopes of truly encountering the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. You will be asked to “**Come and See**” Jesus in Eucharistic Processions outside on our property, in Small Study Groups, in evening Adoration each month, in Pilgrimages to holy places in our area, and of course, in the Eucharist at Mass. And this is just the beginning! Father Alex, our Deacons, and our Adult Faith Formation Team are starting a fire, not a program! **Come and See!**

PILGRIMAGE



As pilgrims, we should first be aware that Mary bears an important title. She is called Star of the Sea, a name that harkens to the days when ship captains navigated in the night by means of the North Star.

Like that star, Mary will be the light that guides us through this pilgrimage to Jesus.

Let us look, for example, at the Blue Army Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, situated in the lush hills of Warren County, where a Marian procession takes place on the 13th of the month from May to October to commemorate the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima.

The traditional services at the Blue Army Shrine involve the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, a Rosary procession, the carrying of a statue of Our Lady of Fatima on the shoulders of pilgrims, a eucharistic procession and the adeus, during which pilgrims wave handkerchiefs at the statue as it is carried out of sight. Each of these outdoor events imitate traditional Portuguese ceremonies that have taken place in Fatima, Portugal, since the 1920s.

Now as our pilgrimage of words comes to a close, let us recite the prayer that Pope John Paul used in a homily at the Marian shrine of Jasna Gora: "Mother accept us! Mother do not abandon us! Mother be our guide!"

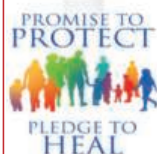

Reflections for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time - September 10, 2023

OUT OF BONDAGE

Is there someone in your life you need to forgive? If we look deep enough, most of us will admit that there is someone we still haven't forgiven for something that was done to us; perhaps something that happened years ago.

One of the great spiritual truths is that forgiveness is as much for ourselves as it is for the other person. If we do not forgive, we hold that person in bondage to their sin. And we hold ourselves in bondage both to the sin and the sinner as well.

It isn't always easy to forgive. Sometimes we don't even want to forgive. We begin the process, and it is a process, by asking for the desire to desire to forgive. Eventually, as that desire takes root, we learn to let go of our mistaken notions about forgiveness and come to understand what forgiveness really consists of.

Forgiveness doesn't mean that the sin doesn't matter. It doesn't mean that we forget something bad happened to us. It doesn't mean everything is "all better," and it certainly doesn't mean that restitution and justice aren't needed. True forgiveness is a free will action, prompted by God, that frees us from bondage. It's not an emotion; it's an act of the will. It's making a decision to let go of the chains that bind us, and then moving forward.

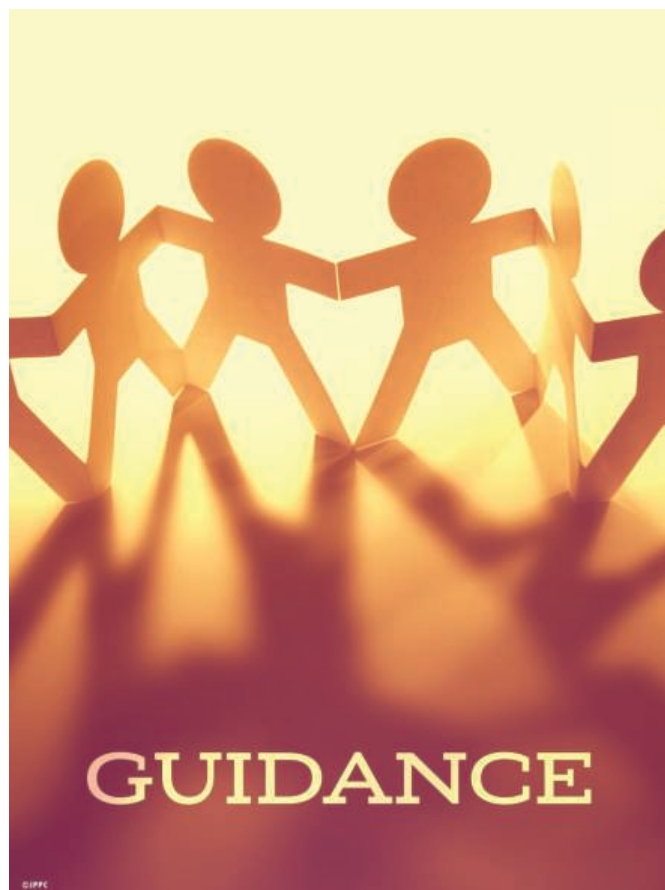
Remember that the Lord tells us that everything can be worked to the good for those who believe, including the greatest of sins committed against us. One of the keys to having that happen is our cooperation with God's requirement to forgive. But first, we have to be willing to take that first step of the will.

PRAYER

Listen now as Jesus comes before you and says, "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone." As you hear those words, is there someone you believe has "sinned against you?" Have you done as Jesus commands by telling this person how you feel, or are you harboring secret ill will? How do you respond to Jesus?

RESOLUTION

Consider the people in your life whom you may need to forgive. Make a plan to talk with them to resolve your differences. | formed.org
