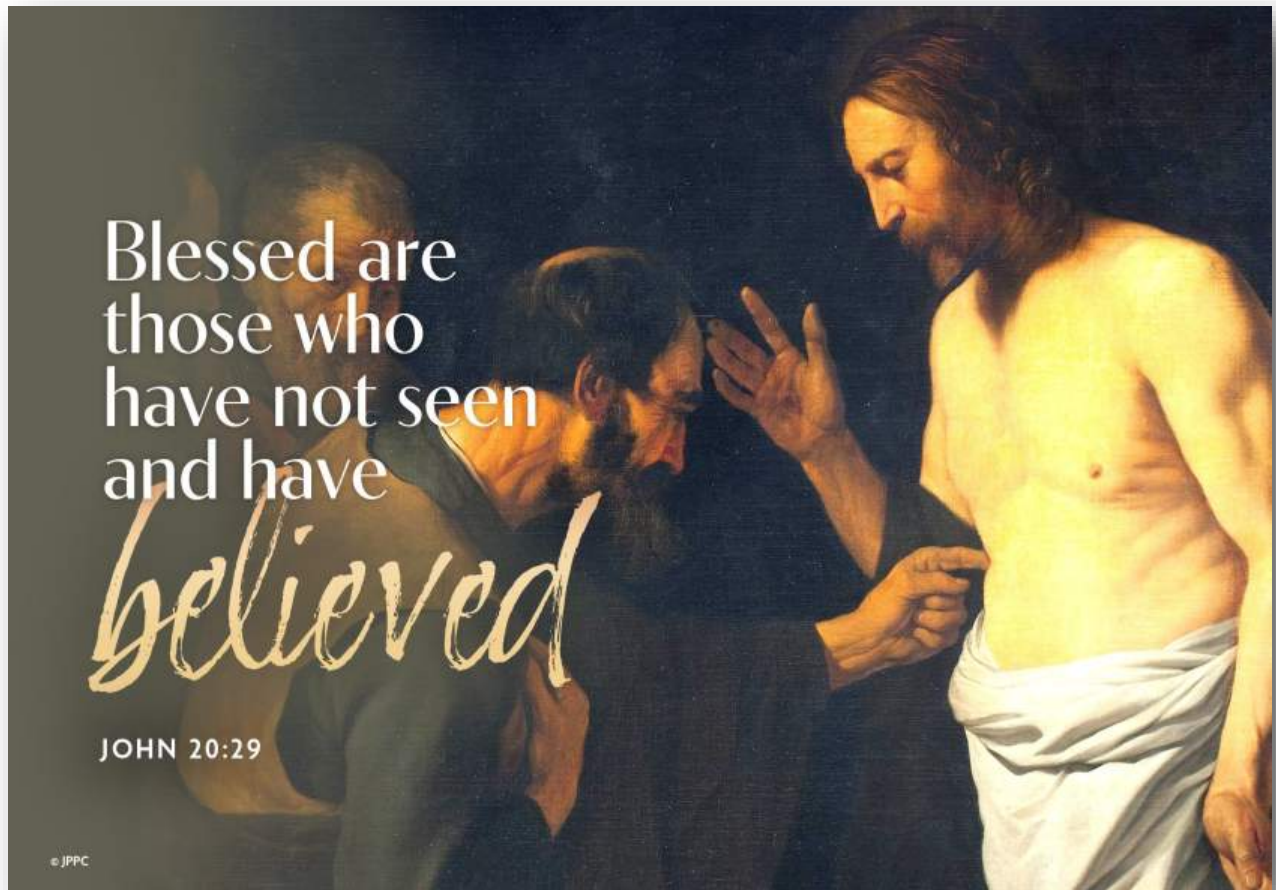

The Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been a part of the Christian tradition, appearing in the works of theologians and spiritual writers throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual well-being of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to “help our neighbor in their spiritual needs.”
(U.S. Catholic Catechism for Adults)

The seven Spiritual Works of Mercy will be listed below over the next weeks. After each work of mercy there also will be suggestions and words of advice for living them out in our daily lives.

Comforting the sorrowful

Be open to listening and comforting those who are dealing with grief. Even if we aren't sure of the right words to say, our presence can make a big difference.

- ◆ Lend a listening ear to those going through a tough time
- ◆ Make a home cooked meal for a friend who is facing a difficult time
- ◆ Write a letter or send a card to someone who is suffering
- ◆ A few moments of your day may make a lifetime of difference to someone who is going through a difficult time





Divine Mercy Sunday- The Second Sunday of Easter

APRIL 7, 2024

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary, no. 742).

Notes and Quotes for Reflection on Divine Mercy

From Creation, God has revealed his nature as love itself, in Sacred Scripture and most perfectly in the life, Passion, Death, and Resurrection of his Son, Jesus. Saints have also borne witness to God's unfathomable love, e.g., in the writings of Augustine, Aquinas, Catherine of Siena, Francis of Assisi, Margaret Mary Alacoque, and Therese of Lisieux.

In his second encyclical, *Rich in Mercy*, St. John Paul II offers an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls "the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God" (*Dives in Misericordia*, no. 13). He returned to this theme throughout his pontificate:

As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!

Lord, who reveals the Father's love by Your death and Resurrection, we believe in You and confidently repeat to You today: Jesus, I trust in You, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world.

He dedicated his second Encyclical to it and throughout his pontificate made himself a missionary of God's love to all peoples.

Reflections on the Readings for the Sunday of Divine Mercy - April 7, 2024

EMBRACING GOD'S MERCY

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! Divine Mercy Sunday was officially instituted in 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II. In the 1930's, Jesus appeared to a young Polish nun (now St. Faustina) and entrusted the message of Divine Mercy to her in a particular way for our time. Our world is full of so much evil, and Our Lord wants to remind us of his Divine Mercy and the need for repentance.

This Sunday is also the last day of the Octave of Easter, and so, in a sense, it is the climax of our celebration of Easter. As we reach the height of our Easter octave, the readings focus on God's mercy. Why is that?

God's merciful love is the Good News of the Gospel, and the reason why Christ suffered, died, and rose again. The Catechism goes so far as to say that, "The Gospel is the revelation in Jesus Christ of God's mercy to sinners" (CCC 1846). God's mercy reached down to us in our sinful state and sent us a Savior, who took on human flesh so that we might have life with him.

PRAYER

Let's return to today's Gospel Reading. Put yourself in Thomas's place. He was afraid to trust the Lord, which is something we can all relate to. Try to get in touch with that fear inside of yourself. Then imagine Jesus appearing to you as he did to Thomas, and offering you his wounded heart. He takes your hand and places it in his side, giving you complete access to his mercy that is pouring out from his heart.

Take a word that comes to mind and reflect on what it means to you personally. For example, the phrase, "peace be with you," might have stuck out to you. Ask yourself what this means in your own life. What areas of your heart do not fully trust in the Lord yet? Do you want to receive Jesus's gift of peace and mercy in those places?

RESOLUTION

To embrace God's mercy is to embrace the Gospel message. In his encyclical *Dives in Misericordia*, Pope St. John Paul II taught that "Believing in [God's] love means believing in mercy. For mercy is an indispensable dimension of love; it is as it were love's second name and, at the same time, the specific manner in which love is revealed and effected vis-à-vis the reality of the evil that is in the world" (7).

To truly live the Christian life, we have to embrace a life of mercy. What are specific things that are holding you back from living a life of mercy? Do you want to ask God for the gift of his merciful love in this place? | [formed.org](https://www.formed.org)
