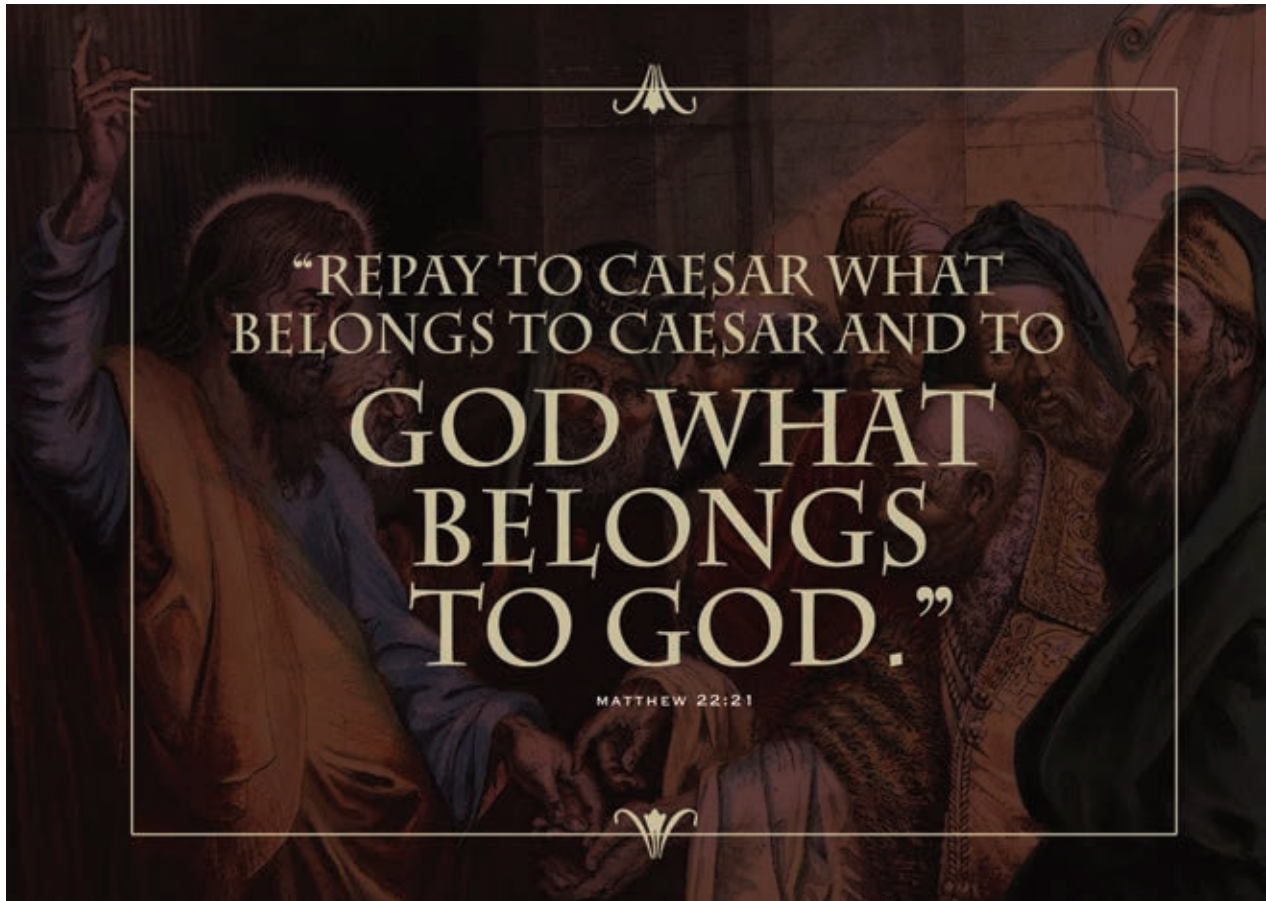

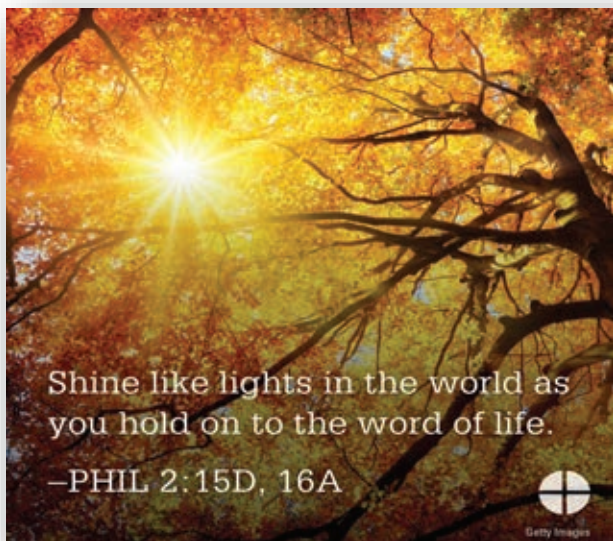

CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY

Baptism is the source of new life in Christ and for that baptismal grace to unfold, the parent's help is important. So too is the role of the *godfather* and *godmother*, who must be firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized on the road of Christian life.

Candidates for the sacrament of confirmation, as for baptism, fittingly seek the spiritual help of a *sponsor*. To emphasize the unity of the two sacraments, it is appropriate (but not required) that the confirmation sponsor be one of the baptism godparents. CCC 1254, 1311

Before either sacrament is celebrated, all godparents and sponsors are required to submit to St. Monica's parish office a **Certificate of Eligibility**. This form can be obtained from the godparent's or sponsor's parish. To receive the form, the person must:

- ⇒ Be an active Catholic, registered and attending Mass in their Catholic parish for at least 6 months
- ⇒ Be at least 16 years of age
- ⇒ Have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation
- ⇒ If married, have a valid marriage within the Catholic Church

If you are asked to be a baptism godparent or confirmation sponsor and you meet all the guidelines above, please call the parish office as soon as possible to obtain your **Certificate of Eligibility**. When in doubt, call the parish office for help at: 732-928-0279

ST. ISAAC JOGUES

1607-1646

FEAST DATE: OCTOBER 19

Born in Orleans, France, Isaac joined the Jesuits at a young age and was sent to his order's North American mission in 1636. He and Rene Goupil were captured and tortured by a band of Iroquois in 1642. Rene was killed and Isaac was held as a slave until his rescue by Dutch settlers. He returned to France, secured permission to continue saying Mass despite mutilated hands, and returned to Canada in 1644. He and John Lalande were tomahawked and beheaded by Huron Indians who invited them to a meal. These three and five others, the North American martyrs, are patron saints of Canada and North America. They share this feast and shrines in New York State and Ontario, Canada.

Please Note: The National Shrine of the North American Martyrs in Fultonville, NY is an easy 4-hour drive from Jackson. Plan a family pilgrimage to this holy ground in Summer 2020:

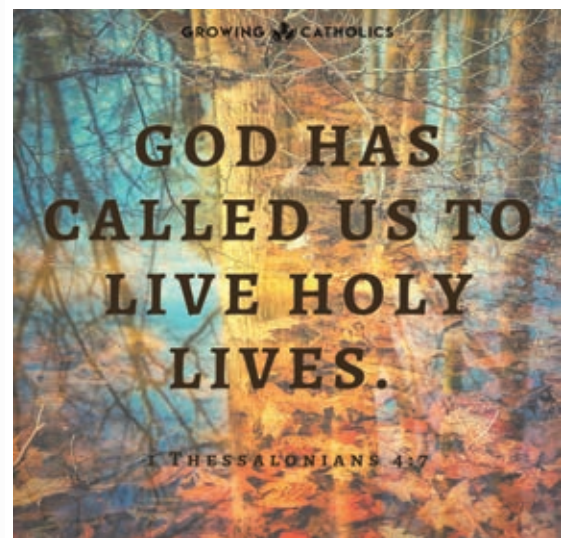

Reflections for the XXIX Sunday in Ordinary Time — October 18, 2020

RENDER UNTO CAESAR

How many times have we heard the expression, “Render unto Caesar that which is Caesar’s and render unto God that which is God’s?” Today’s Gospel gives us the origin of that phrase.

The Pharisees, who have been attempting to trap Jesus for some time, have joined forces with some of their opponents, the Herodians, to pose a tricky question: Is it lawful to pay the census tax? Since the Pharisees didn’t believe it was lawful and the Herodians did, no matter what Jesus answered, someone was bound to be angered.

Jesus’s answer shows his acumen and wisdom. Instead of giving a direct reply, he first calls out the Pharisees for trying to trap him. He understands their motive is to find a reason to kill him, and he lets them know that he recognizes that. Then he very carefully gives the reply we are familiar with, saying that some things belong to God and some things belong to Caesar. It is our responsibility to see the difference and respond accordingly.

This can be quite a challenge for us who live today in an increasingly secularized world. Many want to see how far they can push the limits and have us render unto Caesar that which belongs rightly to God. We must be ready for the test and continue to render unto God that which is God’s while still being actively engaged in the secular domain with the good news of the Gospel. Not an easy task by any means, and one that can be accomplished only with the grace of God himself.

PRAYER

Imagine that you are with the group listening to the Pharisees confront Jesus about paying the census tax. What do you expect him to say? When he says, “Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God,” are you surprised? Now think about your own life. What in your life rightly belongs to Caesar? Are you giving to Caesar what is Caesar’s? What in your life belongs to God? Are you giving that to God? Which is easier to do: pay Caesar or pay God?

RESOLUTION

As difficult as it may be, when you are paid this week, thank God that you are able to “render unto Caesar” by paying your taxes. Then set aside a donation to give to the Church or to the poor in order to “render unto God” as well.
