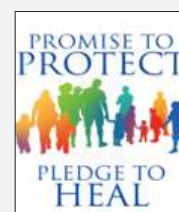

Using *Vizio Divina*, we will contemplate the meaning of each Station of the Cross created by Maria De Fayrod (Stations of the Cross, Lourdes, France). Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Second Sunday of Lent (C)

Genesis 15:5–12, 17–18 • Philippians 3:17–4:1 or 3:2–4:1 • Luke 9:28b–36



Embrace Your Transformation at Mass!

Isn't it exciting how our readings this Sunday talk about change and transformation? If you're like me, you're always looking for positive change in your life. Let's start with Abraham's story in Genesis 15. God made three promises to Abraham, but Abraham struggled to see how these would manifest in his life. Have you ever felt that way about God's promises?

When God promised Abraham a son, Abraham couldn't imagine it happening because of his older age. But God took him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able." And here's the kicker: When God asked the question, it was likely daytime! Abraham couldn't see the stars, but he believed God anyway, and it was counted to him as righteousness. That's faith, folks!

Moving to St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians, we are promised that Christ will transform our bodies one day. Then, in Luke's Gospel, we witness the incredible Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. Jesus, shining in glory, discusses his "exodus" with Moses and Elijah—meaning his upcoming sacrifice in Jerusalem as the Paschal Lamb.

This brings me to my main point: Our greatest transformation happens through active participation in the Mass. In both the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, God changes not just bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Our Lord, but he changes our very lives. This Lent, I encourage you to dive deeper into Scripture and to fully engage in the Mass. Let's allow God to work his transformative power in our lives, just as he did for Abraham and the disciples on that mountaintop.

Live the Gospel

Jeff Cavins says, "During this transformative season of Lent, I encourage you to arrive at Mass ten minutes early each Sunday. Use this time to read the Scripture passages for the day to help prepare your heart to be transformed by the Word and the Eucharist. This will help you become a better person of faith. Trust me, it will make a world of difference!"

Reflections on the Readings for the 2nd Sunday in Lent - March 16, 2025

LONGING FOR GLORY

Consider today's reading from the perspective of apostles Peter, James, and John. What an amazing experience it must have been for them to have witnessed the Transfiguration!

Jesus singles these men out to join him as he ascends a mountain to pray. When they reach the summit, they see their master like never before. Jesus' face changes and his clothes become dazzling white, as Peter, James, and John catch a glimpse of his glory. They also see Jesus conversing with two of the most famous men in Israel's history: Moses and Elijah. These men represent the two key parts of the Old Testament: Moses, as the author of the Torah, represents the Law; and Elijah, a great prophet, represents the Prophets. Together, their presence at this moment of Jesus' transfiguration symbolizes how the entire Old Testament—the Law and the prophets—finds fulfillment in Christ.

Finally, Peter, James, and John hear a heavenly voice—the voice of God the Father—say to them: “This is my chosen Son; listen to him.” This mysterious event continues to have spiritual application to our lives today. Like the three apostles, we are called to ascend with Jesus every time we pray. And in prayer with our Lord, we are called to seek his glorious face and listen to him.

PRAYER

Prayerfully place yourself in today's Gospel reading. Imagine being one of the three apostles who had been chosen to ascend Mount Tabor with Jesus. If you had been one of the apostles, you would have seen Jesus practically every day for about three years following him in his public ministry. But now, you see Jesus like never before—transfigured and radiant in glory. Suddenly, in the midst of this extraordinary revelation of Jesus, a voice from heaven speaks. It is God the Father, saying “This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him” (RSV). The one command the heavenly Father gives you in this most amazing moment of divine revelation is to listen to Jesus, his Son. Take time now in prayer to consider what ways Jesus may want you to listen to him more in your life.
