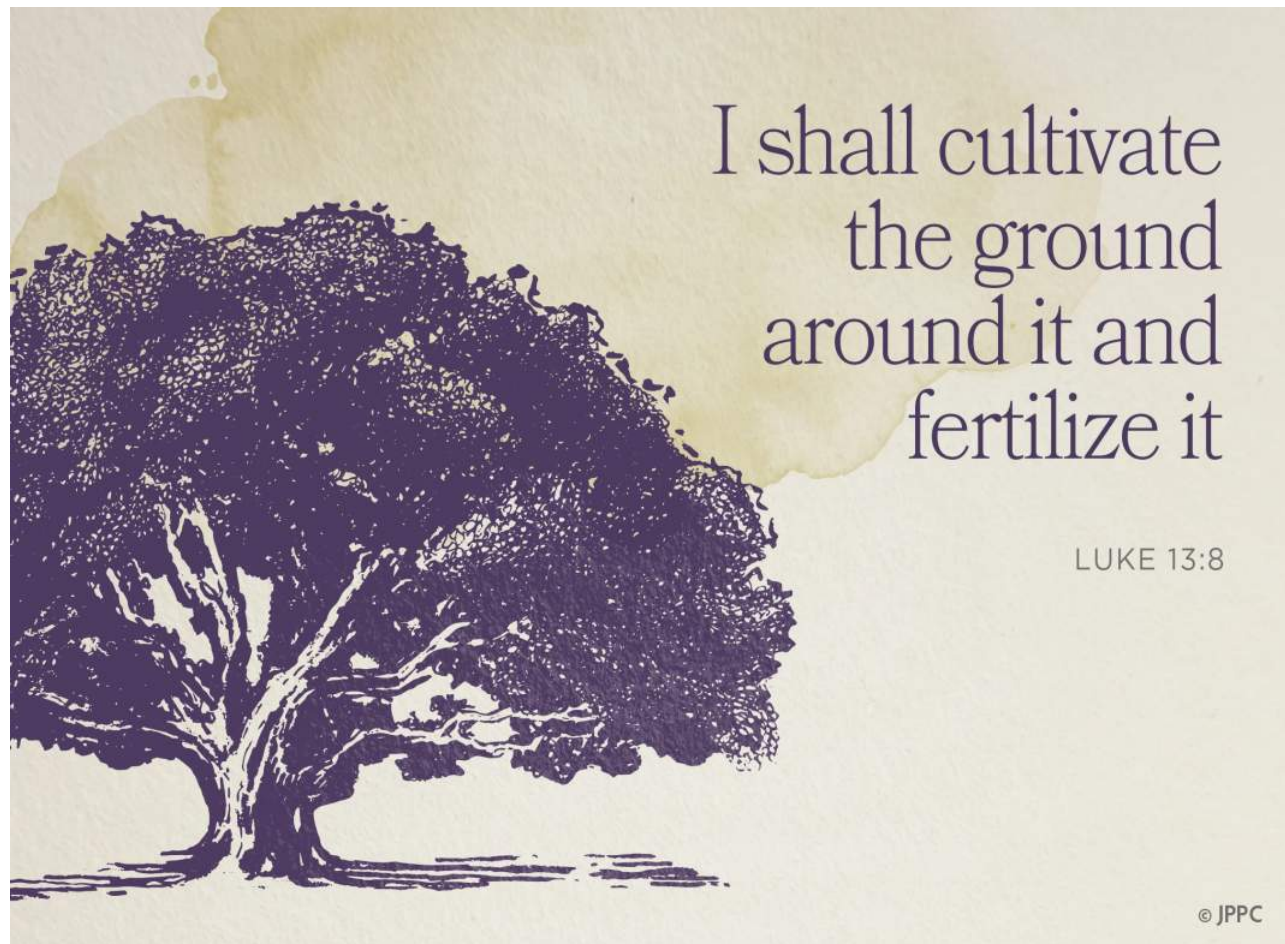

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

The Baptism of the Lord (C)

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 • Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7 • Luke 3:15-16, 21-22



Ministry Begins at Baptism

The Gospel reading today describes Our Lord going to the Jordan River, being baptized, and praying, and then the Holy Spirit descending upon him. Then we hear the Father saying in a beautiful way in Luke 3, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.”

Jesus lived for thirty years in a faithful, holy family. He grew in wisdom and stature in the power of the Word of God. To begin his ministry, he makes his way from Galilee to this remote area north of the Dead Sea that, geographically, is the lowest place on earth. It’s as if he’s saying, “I’m going to gather everything together and bring it to the Father,” and that’s what he does in his ministry.

Why does Jesus have to be baptized? Did he sin or need to repent? No. He was baptized to fulfill all righteousness. In his life, the entire story of the Bible is fulfilled. So, he is baptized. Then, while he is praying, the Holy Spirit descends upon him. This is how he started his public ministry. The reason this is so important to you and me is that this is the way we start our public ministry in proclaiming the Good News and living a life that shows people what the Trinity and God’s love are all about.

When we’re baptized, we are forgiven of original sin, brought into God’s family, and equipped with this new life. The Father looks at you and me, saying, “You are my son. You are my daughter.” Jesus went from that river and changed the world. Now, it’s our turn.

Live the Gospel

Jeff Cavins says, “The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us in the very first paragraph that God has a plan of sheer goodness, and that plan involves going out and gathering everyone together and into his family. Maybe you don’t know exactly how to tell people about God. That’s where trusting in the Holy Spirit comes into play. Jesus says to simply open your mouth, and the Holy Spirit will give you the words.”

Reflections on the Readings for the 3rd Sunday in Lent - March 23, 2025

TO WHOM MUCH IS GIVEN

Today's readings are the midway point in our Lenten journey, and today's readings are all about the great journey of the Jewish people out of Egypt—the Exodus. For many of us, the story of the Exodus is embedded in our psyche from stories we heard as children or movies we might have seen. When we think of the Exodus, we may imagine Moses parting the Red Sea, the burning bush, or the famous cry, "Let my people go!"

Particularly in this week's second reading, St. Paul gives us a crash course on what the Exodus story has to do with Christians. He says that all of the generation that was released from slavery in Egypt saw the amazing works of God. Unfortunately, most of them fell away from their faith. Perhaps we've heard the saying "to whom much is given, much is required." The Exodus generation was given many gifts, which made the consequences all the more dire when they fell into great sin.

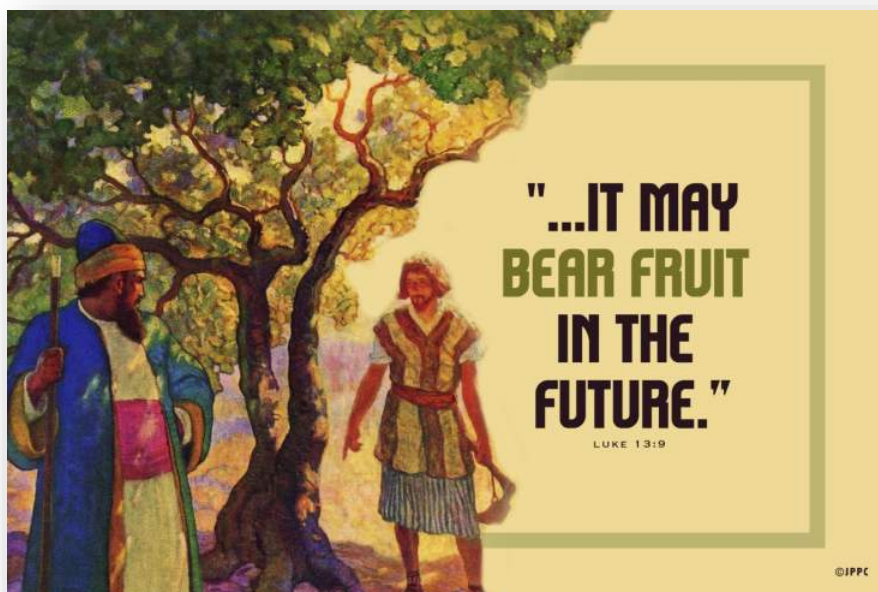
Like that generation, we, as Christians, have been given a lot: the Church, the Sacraments, and the Holy Scriptures. Paul is warning us that we must not presume that because we have these gifts we're home free. We must be on guard against desiring evil things lest we fall like the Israelites in the desert did.

PRAYER

Put yourself in today's Gospel reading and imagine that you hear Jesus talking about the fig tree that didn't bear fruit but was allowed to live another year. Imagine that he is saying those words to you. If you were given one more year to bear fruit, what sorts of things would you do?

RESOLUTION

In what areas of your spiritual or moral life have you found yourself tempted to be like Israel and want to "turn back"? What can you do to persevere so that you can bear more fruit in your life? Ask Jesus to show you where you need to make changes in your life in order to become a fruitful fig tree. | formed.org
