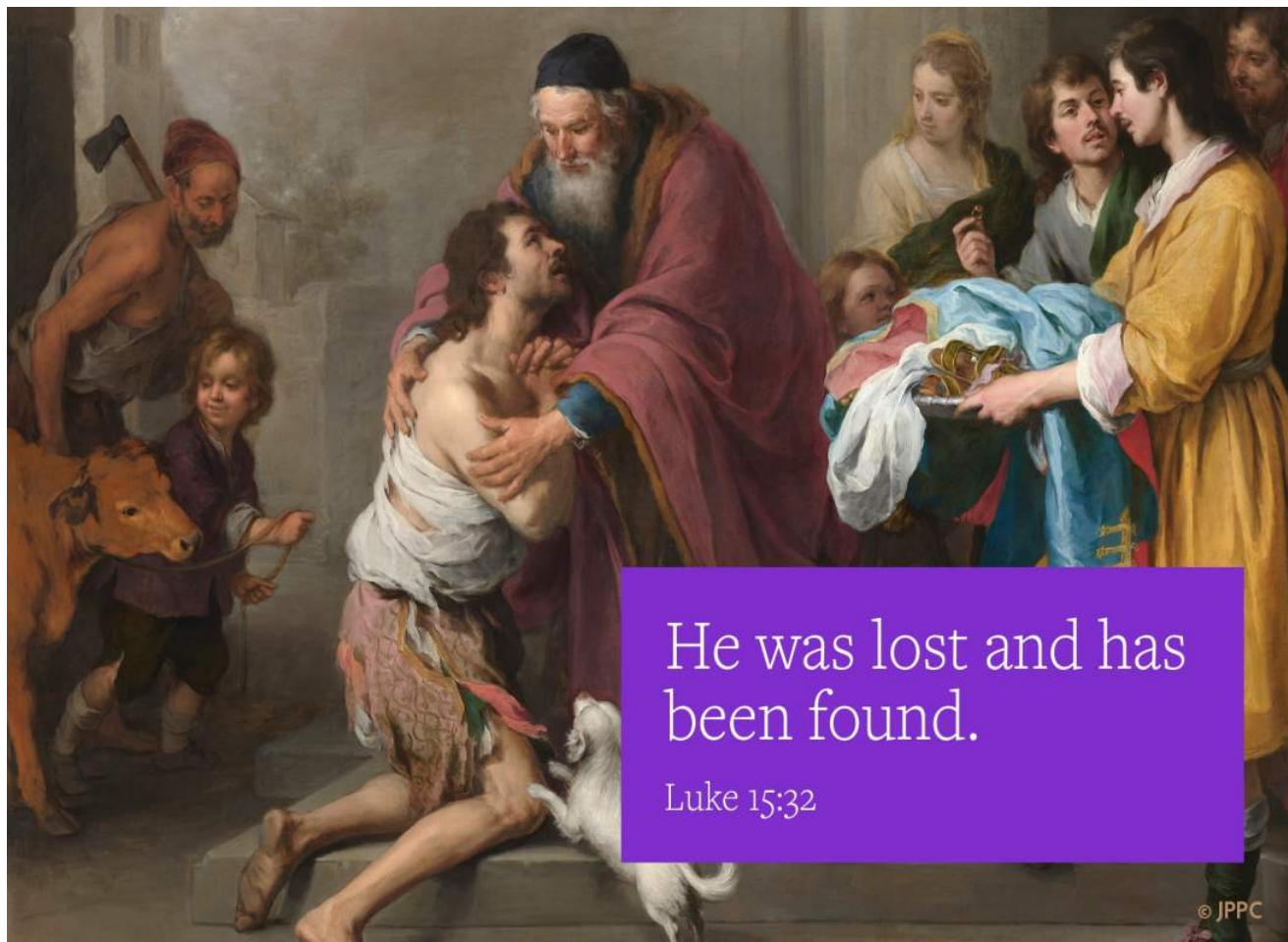

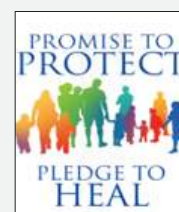

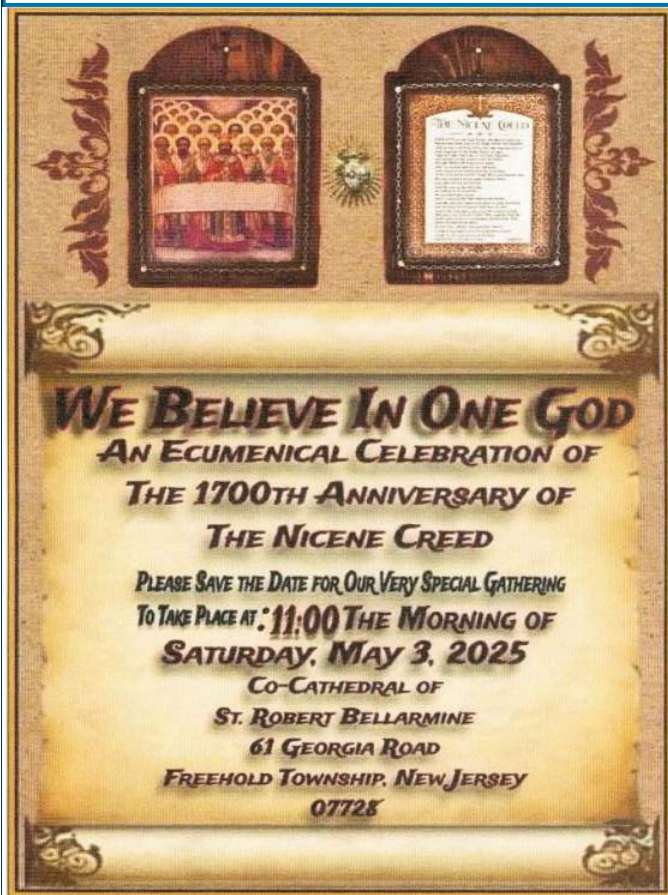
## IN-PERSON ONLY

## EMBRACING THE WAY OF THE CROSS THROUGH ART

Monday, April 7 9:30 AM – 2:00 PM

All are welcome: non-artists, artists, poets and other writers—anyone who desires to draw more deeply into the Passion of Jesus as we approach Holy Week. Using *Vizio Divina*, we will contemplate the meaning of each Station of the Cross created by Maria De Fayrod (Stations of the Cross, Lourdes, France). Through prayer and reflection, we will consider how we can unite our own life experiences with those of Christ's Way of the Cross. Our hope is to deepen our faith, strengthen our resilience in the face of struggle, and expand our compassion and forgiveness towards others. Since each station often carries a specific theme, such as betrayal, denial, the weight of the cross, or the love of a mother (Mary), we will create our own original station in the medium of choice (poetry, drawing, music or painting). # Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

## Fourth Sunday of Lent (C)

Joshua 5:9a, 10-12 • 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 • Luke 15:1-3, 11-32



## Our Father Loves Us No Matter What

We encounter one of the most cherished parables of Our Lord in this Sunday's Gospel. It is usually called "The Prodigal Son," but I prefer to think of it as "The Story of a Generous Father"... it truly captures the essence of God's love.

The parable presents us with two brothers. The elder son is dutiful and obedient, while the younger one takes his inheritance prematurely and squanders it on a life of excess in a distant land. When he finds himself destitute, the younger son experiences a profound realization, called *metanoia* in Greek—a complete turnaround from destructive patterns toward life-giving choices.

The father's reaction is remarkable. Seeing his son from afar, he runs to embrace him, celebrating his return with great joy. The elder son responds with resentment. He struggles to understand his father's lavish welcome, feeling that his own faithfulness has gone unrecognized.

This narrative speaks of the feelings of envy about another's good fortune. Envy is often rooted in a misunderstanding of our heavenly Father's love. God's affection for us is based on our relationship with him, not on our accomplishments.

The reading from 2 Corinthians complements Jesus' parable beautifully. It reminds us that, in Christ, we become a new creation. Moreover, we are entrusted with the ministry of reconciliation, serving as Christ's ambassadors in the world.

Whether we identify more with the prodigal son or the elder brother, the message is the same. Our heavenly Father welcomes everyone with open arms. Having experienced this profound love, we are called to extend it to others. This Lent, let's embrace our role in seeking out those who feel distant from God, embodying the Father's unconditional love and acceptance.

## Live the Gospel

Jeff Cavins says, "This week, I invite you to identify someone in your life who might feel like a 'prodigal son'—someone who feels far from God, the Church, or both. Be like the father in Jesus' parable and—without conditions—reach out to this person with a message of love and invitation. By embodying God the Father's welcoming embrace, you will give and receive love at the same time."

## Reflections on the Readings for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent - March 30, 2025

### A TALE OF TWO SONS

This Sunday's Gospel reading from Luke is a familiar story for many Christians—the story of the prodigal son. However, when we look more closely at the historical setting for this story we see that for Jesus's original audience in the first century, it would have been a shocking story.

The younger son is desperately restless. He goes about seeking fulfillment for his life in all the wrong places. In asking his father for his share of the inheritance right away, he is essentially telling his father, "I wish you were dead" because the inheritance usually wouldn't come until after his father's death. He then sells his share of the inheritance and squanders it on prostitutes. The son is looking for happiness in wealth and pleasure rather than in his relationship with his father.

But this son isn't the only character to act in a surprising way. When the father sees him returning, he runs to meet him. Fathers were expected to act with dignity, so running to meet anyone—let alone a son who has shamed the family—would have been shocking. Indeed, the action is completely incomprehensible to the older son. He has remained obedient to his father, but he views his father more as a master and himself as a servant. In this story the father goes out to meet both his sons and invite them into the feast—and into a better understanding of his love.

### PRAYER

Take time now to consider your relationship with your heavenly Father. Prayerfully place yourself in the Gospel story. First imagine that you are the younger son leaving home, squandering your inheritance in a distant land, and ending up destitute, starving, and alone. How do you feel? What do you say to yourself? What do you do?

Next imagine you are the older son dutifully working at home but not recognizing the love and generosity of your father. Now decide with which son you identify more at this point in your life. Put yourself in the position of that particular son and imagine the father coming out to meet you and inviting you into the feast. What would you say in response? How do you feel when your brother appears on the scene?

### RESOLUTION

Just like the father in the parable, our heavenly Father comes out to us and invites us into his love. In prayer, talk to God about what he is inviting you to do to go deeper into your relationship with him this week. | [formed.org](https://formed.org)
