**HOLY WEEK**



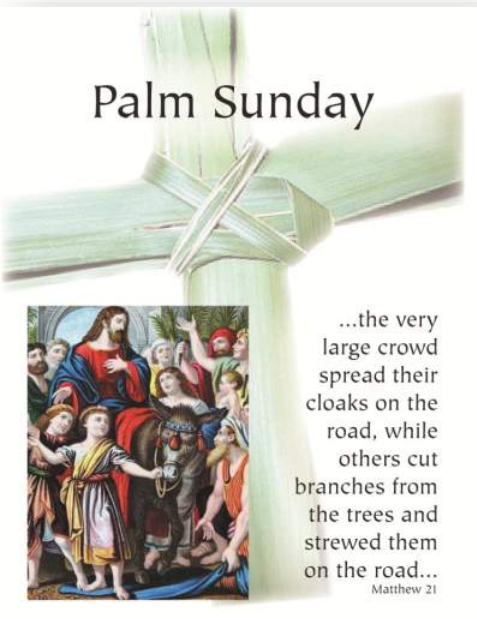

## How to make a Palm Cross



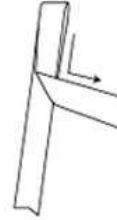
### STEP 1

Turn the palm cross over and fold the extra length diagonally down to the right, like a sash.

Turn your palm cross over. This is what your palm cross will look like from the back.



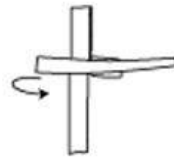
### STEP 3

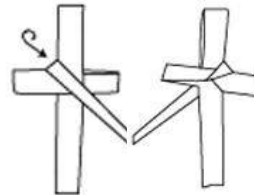

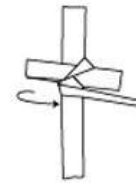

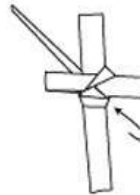
### STEP 7

Run the extra length straight across, left to right, right under the "arms."



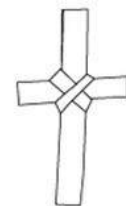
### STEP 9

## Saint John Baptist de la Salle

1651–1719

FEAST DAY: APRIL 7

**H**e was the founder of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, commonly known as the Christian Brothers. He was the oldest of 11 children from a noble, French family. John cut his studies short, when his parents died to take care of his brothers and sisters. He finally finished school and was ordained a priest in 1678. Coming from a noble family, John was named a Canon of the Reims Cathedral. As Canon, he was challenged by a layman who had established free schools for the poor in Rouen to do the same in Reims. John slowly became more and more involved with the poor children of Reims. Eventually, he would found the Christian Brothers as an Order of religious brothers dedicated to teaching the poor. He insisted that the Christian Brothers' schools be free for all students and taught in the vernacular language of the people they served. When describing his vocation, John said God led him "in an imperceptible way and over a long period of time so that one commitment led to another in a way that I did not foresee in the beginning." In 1950 was declared the patron saint of teachers.

## The Cross Is Our Path to Victory

The Palm Sunday readings are the longest of the liturgical year, spanning Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his crucifixion. I found them painfully long as a kid, but now I see their length serves a purpose. This is the center of our faith.

God has a plan to bring us into his family as adopted children, sharing in his glory and the life of the Trinity. But this plan came at a cost more than two thousand years ago. Jesus paid the price for our sins, purchasing us with his life. He has claimed us as his own and has set us free. We are now his bride, and he is our bridegroom.

The Cross might seem foolish to people who do not understand, but to us, it is power—the power of transformation through love. It frees us from sin and unites us to a tremendous mystery. As St. Paul said, “I have been crucified with Christ, yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me” (Galatians 2:20).

Isn't it fascinating that we call this public humiliation and death the “triumph of the Cross”? It is indeed a triumph over death, hell, and the grave. Even on the Cross, Jesus showed confidence in the victory to come, promising Paradise to the thief who believed.

I encourage you to pick up your cross and follow Jesus. As we die to ourselves and live for Christ, we will experience this victory. Like a seed in the ground, we must die to produce fruit. The difficulties you face are opportunities to join with Christ and experience victory, even in weakness.



## Live the Gospel

Jeff Cavins says, “The Cross is a focus of our worship. I invite you to do two things this week. Arrive at Mass about fifteen minutes early, sit quietly, and ponder the cross that is displayed in your parish church. What does it mean to you? We all have crosses that we bear. Offer up one area of struggle in your life to unite yourself with Christ's sacrifice on Calvary on that Good Friday.”

## Nicene Creed

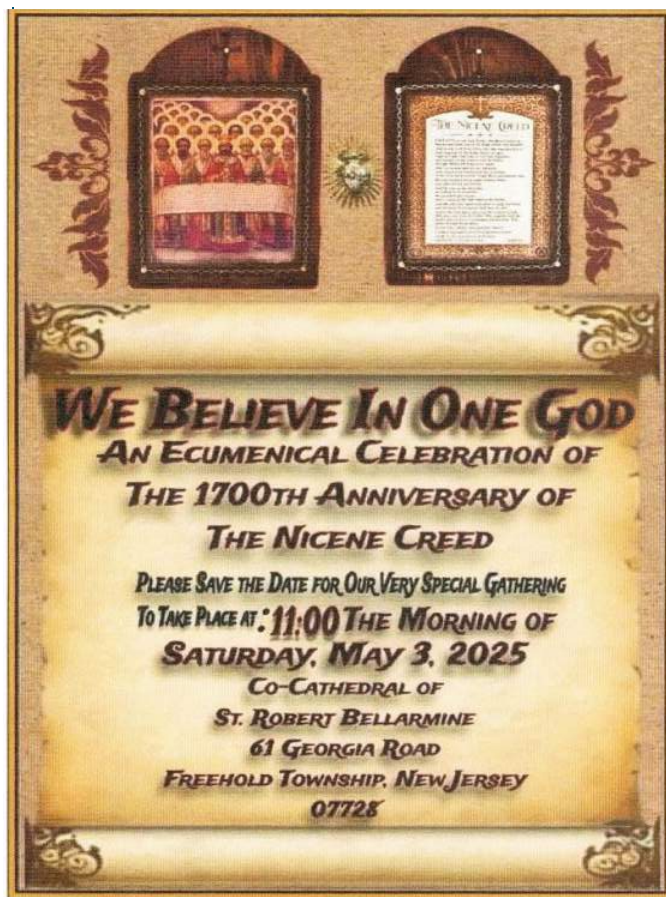
I believe in one God,

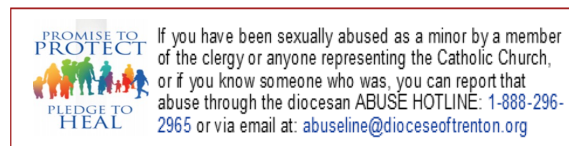

## *Reflection for Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord - April 13, 2025*

### FAITHFULNESS UNDER PRESSURE

The readings for Palm or Passion Sunday are the most dramatic of the whole year. They recount the entire story of Christ's death from Holy Thursday through Good Friday. One of the unusual aspects of this week's Gospel reading is that it is the one time during the year when all of us take part in proclaiming the Word of God by participating in the Gospel reading.

In Christ's Passion, there were saints and sinners, enemies and friends. And we can find ourselves in any one of these categories. This Gospel reading challenges us to consider areas of our lives in which we deny Christ. We might not see ourselves denying Jesus three times in front of a crowd as Peter did, but do we deny him in small ways through the little sins we commit each day? And while there was only one Judas who sold our Lord for thirty pieces of silver, we might find ourselves in Judas' company when we reject Christ completely and turn our backs on him in mortal sin.

On the other hand, the Gospel reading also holds up beautiful models of love and fidelity: Mary Magdalene, John, our Blessed Mother, and the women who go to the tomb where Jesus is buried show us the most noble characteristics of a follower of Christ.

Which characters from the Passion narrative do you identify with the most?

### PRAYER

In prayer, enter into the Passion narrative in the character from the Passion with whom you identify the most. Reread the parts of the Passion narrative in which your character appears and imagine being that person. How do you feel playing this part? How do you react to the events taking place? What do you say as the events unfold? Now imagine that Jesus sees you. What do you think he would say to you? What would you say to him?

### RESOLUTION

Imagine that you are at the foot of the cross, gazing up at our crucified Lord. What are one or two practical things you can do this week to keep in mind the Passion events and remain a faithful follower of our Lord in the face of your daily challenges? | [formed.org](http://formed.org)
