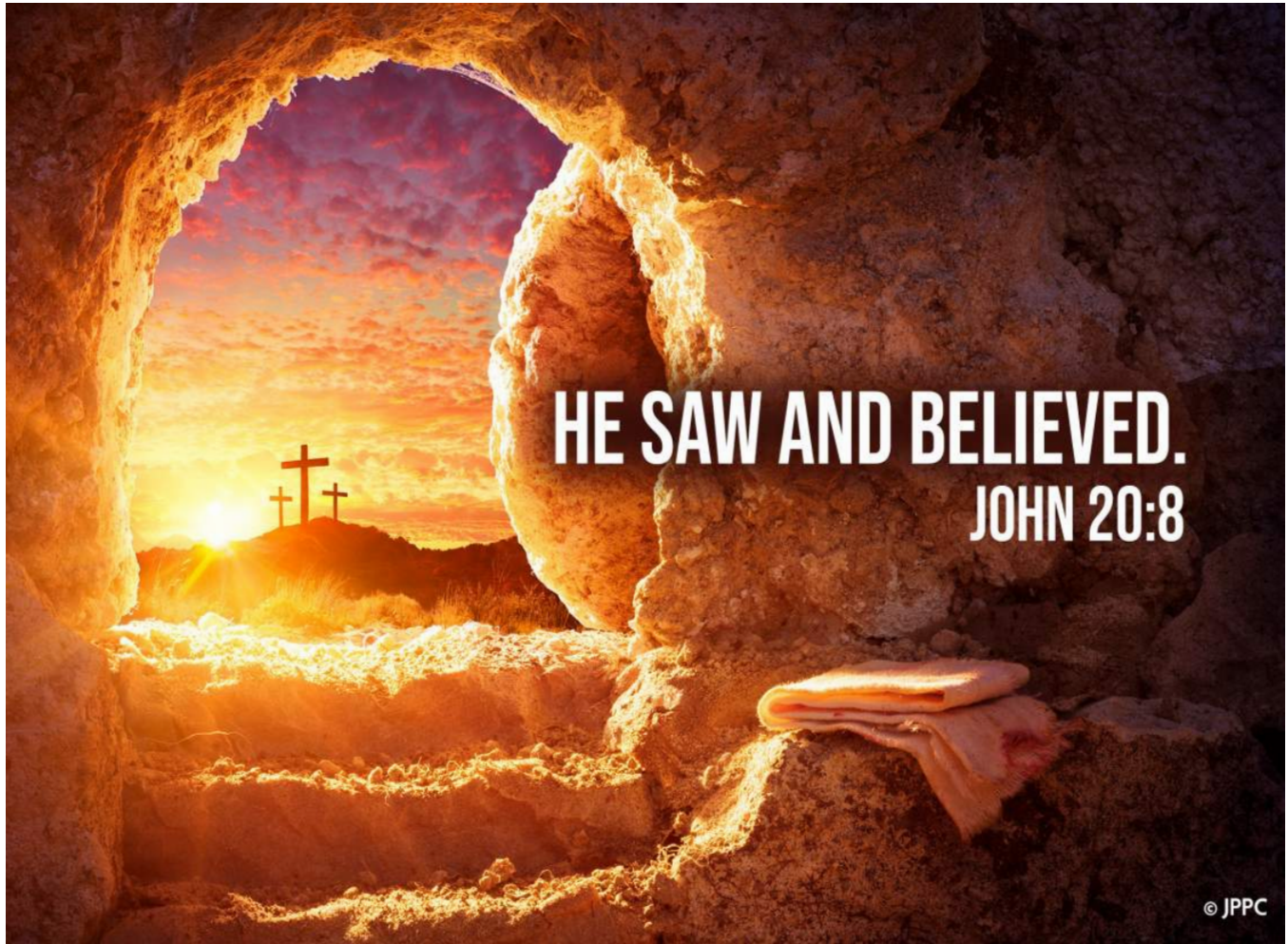

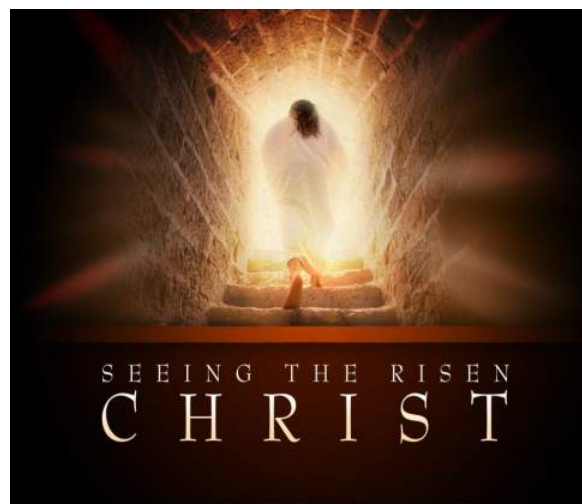

## Easter Sunday—The Resurrection of the Lord

### What is Easter?

The **Easter Vigil** is the “Mother of All Vigils.” Easter Sunday, then, is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of the Lord’s Resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday of Easter to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death, expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian, Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the Resurrection: “If Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith” (1 Cor 15:14).

“What you sow is not brought to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body that is to be but a bare kernel of wheat, perhaps, or of some other kind; . . . So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible. It is sown dishonorable; it is raised glorious. It is sown weak; it is raised powerful. It is sown a natural body; it “Easter is the celebration of the Lord’s Resurrection from the dead, culminating his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church.” is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual one. So, too, it is written, “The first man, Adam, became a living being,’ the last Adam a life-giving spirit. But the spiritual was not first; rather the natural and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, earthly; the second man, from heaven. As was the earthly one, so also are the earthly, and as is the heavenly one, so also are the heavenly. Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one” (1 Cor 15:36-37, 42-49).

The Octave of Easter comprises the eight days, which stretch from the first Sunday of Easter to the Second Sunday of Easter. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday.

The word “Easter” comes from Old English, meaning simply the “east.” The sun that rises in the east, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and is lit for all liturgical celebrations.

## Easter! Our Game-Changer



**T**he Resurrection of Jesus is the focal point of our entire faith journey. It converges on the Old and New Testaments and is the heart of our liturgical year. This momentous event represents our victory over death—humanity’s greatest fear—and offers us a new sense of certitude in our heavenly Father’s plan. Today is the greatest day of our Faith.

As believers united with Christ, we’re invited to experience everything he did. Just as we symbolically died with him on Good Friday, we now rise with him on Easter Sunday. This reality changes everything—our daily lives, our eternity, our very essence.

The Resurrection power isn’t just a historical event; it is available to us in our daily living. It realigns what is important, shifting our focus from earthly concerns to heavenly aspirations. As Paul wrote in Colossians 3:1, “If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above.”

This Easter truth provides unshakable hope, an anchor for our souls amid the storms life pours on us. No matter how dark or difficult our circumstances, the Resurrection assures us of ultimate victory. It is the basic proclamation of the Gospel—the *kerygma*—that has the power to transform lives. That is why it is important for us to look at how we live our lives.

As we celebrate Christ’s triumph over death, let us live as people of victory and hope. Let’s allow the Resurrection to be our game-changer, informing every aspect of our lives. May we, with both our words and actions, proclaim this life-giving truth to a world in desperate need of hope.

Rejoice, friends! The victory is ours, thanks to Jesus Christ. Hallelujah!

Jeff Cavins says, “Christ’s Resurrection means we are about the business of reshaping our priorities. Everything we do needs to be pointed toward the eternal reward, what we call the beatific vision. ## Nicene Creed

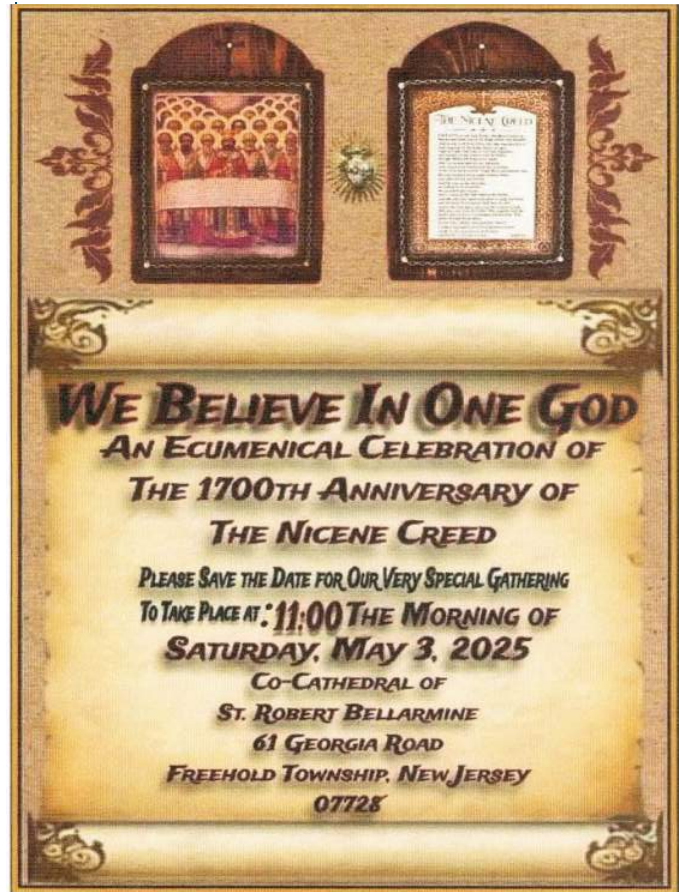
I believe in one God,

## *Reflections on the Readings for Easter Sunday - April 20, 2025*

### FROM SORROW TO JOY

Today we celebrate the greatest of all Christian feasts: Easter Sunday. We come together rejoicing in the goodness of God, knowing that Christ's resurrection from the dead gives us the hope that we too will rise someday with him.

And yet, this one Sunday of the year should not be our only day of rejoicing in our risen Lord. We take on the identity of an "Easter people" because we believe that each Sunday echoes the greatest of all Christian feasts. Each Sunday we celebrate "mini-Easters," remembering in a special way the day the Lord rose so that we might have life.

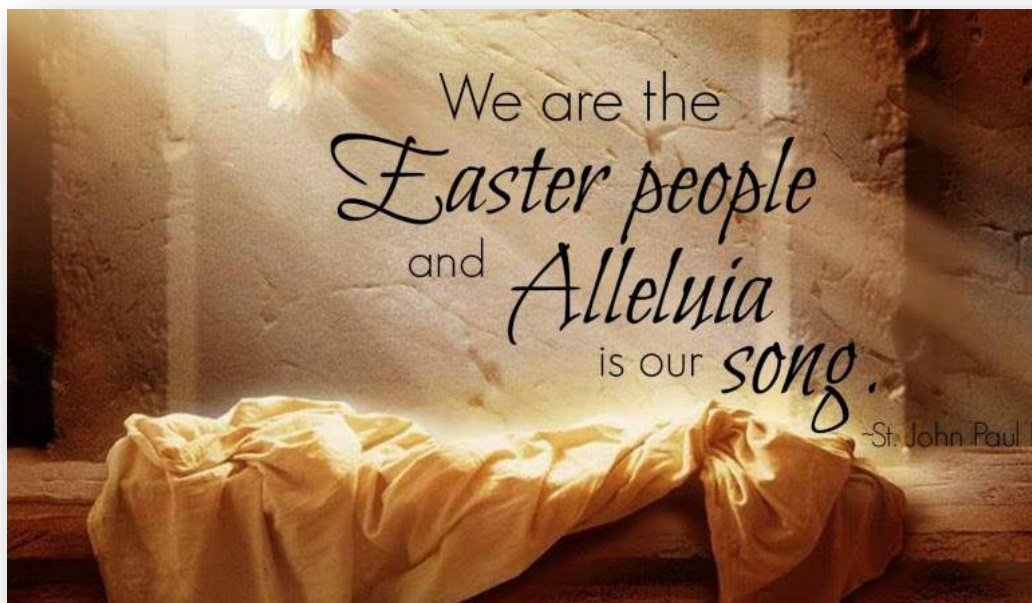
Just like the early Christians, we have the hope that the God who made us is waiting to remake us through the incredible transforming love of Jesus. This love, which culminated in his Passion and Resurrection, can and should convert our hearts to joyful praise. Just as Mary Magdalene's heart changed from sorrow to joy when she encountered her risen Lord, so are we called to enter into that same joyful spirit as we approach Christ risen this Easter—the spirit of a new creation.

### PRAYER

Place yourself in the footsteps of St. Mary Magdalene on Easter morning. You go to the tomb to anoint the dead body of the Master you loved and followed for so long. You approach the tomb in darkness and in great sorrow, remembering the suffering you watched Jesus endure on Good Friday. Now, as you encounter the resurrected Lord, what do you feel as you become aware that Jesus is truly alive and risen?

### RESOLUTION

As you imagine being present at the joy of the Resurrection, ask Jesus what he would have you do with your life from this point on. Think of one "dark" or difficult area of your life, and ask him how you can replace that area of darkness with the light of the Resurrection or transform an area of sorrow into joy. |[formed.org](http://formed.org)
