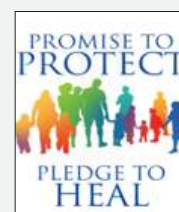

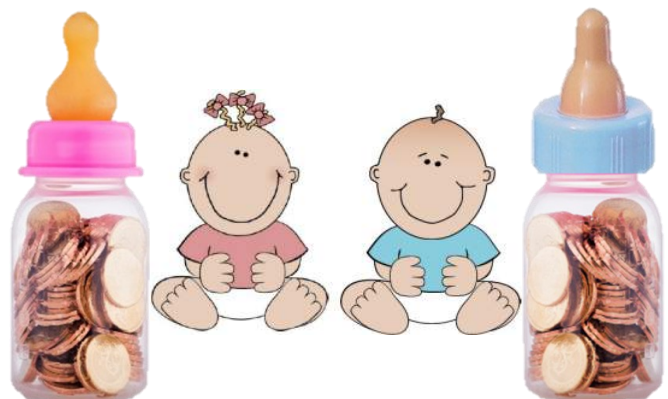

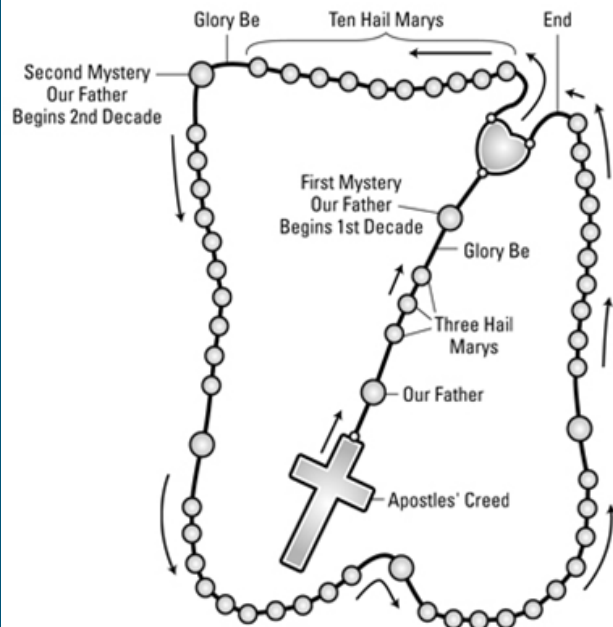
### PRAYING THE ROSARY

Since the early days of the Church, Christians have used knotted cords or prayer beads to help keep track of their prayers. The rosary as we know it today evolved in the Middle Ages, when the “Hail Mary” prayer became widely known. The term “rosary” comes from “rosarium,” or a bouquet of roses; the prayers of the rosary were seen as a spiritual bouquet offered to Mary. In fact, there’s an old tradition that Mary herself appeared to St. Dominic (1170-1221) and gave him the rosary as an aid in his preaching.

While praying each decade, Catholics meditate on key moments in Christ’s life. Many of these involve Mary (the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Assumption, etc.) For this reason, the rosary is often seen as a way to draw closer to Christ through Mary. As Pope Paul VI wrote in his apostolic exhortation *Marialis Cultus*, the rosary helps us “meditate on the mysteries of the Lord’s life as seen through the eyes of she who was closest to the Lord.”

St. Joseph has two feast days on the liturgical calendar. The first is March 19—Joseph, the Husband of Mary. The second is May 1—Joseph, the Worker.

“Saint Joseph is a man of great spirit. He is great in faith, not because he speaks his own words, but above all because he listens to the words of the Living God. He listens in silence. And his heart ceaselessly perseveres in the readiness to accept the Truth contained in the word of the Living God,” Pope John Paul II had once said.

There is very little about the life of Joseph in Scripture but still, we know that he was the chaste husband of Mary, the foster father of Jesus, a carpenter and a man who was not wealthy. We also know that he came from the royal lineage of King David.

We can see from his actions in scripture that Joseph was a compassionate man, and obedient to the will of God. He also loved Mary and Jesus and wanted to protect and provide for them.

Since Joseph does not appear in Jesus' public life, at his death, or resurrection, many historians believe Joseph had probably died before Jesus entered public ministry.

Joseph is the patron of many things, including the universal Church, fathers, the dying and social justice.

# Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

## Third Sunday of Easter (C)

Acts 5:27–32, 40b–41 • Revelation 5:11–14 • John 21:1–19 or 21:1–14



## Like Peter, We Are Pursued by Grace

On the shores of the Sea of Galilee, we see in today's Gospel that Peter is seemingly retreating from his calling. "I'm going fishing," he says, suggesting more than a casual outing. He is hinting at a return to his old life, perhaps driven by shame over denying Jesus three times.

But Our Lord doesn't let Peter go so easily. In fact, Jesus pursues him, offering a meaning-filled restoration. Three times—mirroring the three denials—Jesus asks, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" With each affirmation, Jesus recommissions Peter: "Feed my lambs ... Tend my sheep ... Feed my sheep."

Jesus' question, "Do you love me more than these?" is a poignant reminder of Peter's earlier boasts of unwavering faithfulness. Yet now, chastened by experience, Peter simply affirms his love.

Like Peter, many of us have experienced moments of failure or shame in our vocations—as parents, priests, whatever our calling may be. Like Peter, we might be tempted to retreat to old, unfruitful ways. But Jesus pursues us with relentless grace, offering forgiveness and renewed purpose.

"For his anger lasts but a moment; a lifetime, his good will," says the psalmist (Psalm 30:5). Jesus' mercy extends to us again and again. It never stops. And just as he did with Peter, Jesus invites us to receive his forgiveness and to channel that love into service—to "feed his sheep."

Today, I encourage you to hear Jesus calling you back to your vocation, whatever it may be. Receive his mercy, return to your calling, and find joy in passing on his love to others. In pursuing Peter, Jesus ensured that we would be fed—with his Word and his Body and Blood—forevermore.

## Live the Gospel

Have you felt discouraged or stepped back from your calling? Is this going on in your life now? It sometimes happens. If that describes you, this week, I invite you to identify one area where you have felt discouraged or have moved away from what God called you to do. Take a concrete step to reengage. Pray for and trust in God's grace and forgiveness, and he will light your way.

## Reflection on the Readings for 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter - May 4, 2025

### DO YOU LOVE ME?

Today's Gospel reading zooms in on an intimate conversation between Jesus and Peter. Not long before this, at the Passion, Peter had denied Jesus three times. Now the risen Lord asks Peter three times, "Do you love me?"

What's particularly interesting about this scene is the language that Jesus and Peter use. When the Lord asks Peter, "Do you love me?" he uses the Greek word "agape," which refers to an unconditional, sacrificial, self-giving love; the deepest love you can imagine. Surprisingly, Peter answers, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you," but instead of "agape," he uses the Greek word "philia," which refers to a friendship; it's not quite the same depth of love as "agape."

Clearly, Peter is not ready to give all that Jesus is asking for, but today's readings are all about God's willingness to take whatever we're willing to give him and work with it. In the first reading this week, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, we see that Peter eventually does become willing to give his whole life for the risen Lord. This Sunday's readings challenge us to consider what our response would be to Jesus' question: "Do you 'agape' me?"

### PRAYER

Imagine that you were one of the disciples in today's Gospel scene. You have followed Jesus, learned from him, walked with him. But now imagine he pulls you aside and asks you the question that he asked Peter that day, "Do you love me?" What goes through your mind, knowing that Jesus will know your heart and the truthfulness of your answer? How would you respond? Are you willing to "agape" Jesus—to love Jesus with total, unconditional, self-giving love? If, in truth, you would answer as Peter did with a "philia" love, what do you think Jesus would say to you in response?

### RESOLUTION

Ask Jesus to show you one or two things in your life that might be holding you back from loving him with your whole heart, giving him that agape love. If you (like Peter) can't love God like this yet, ask him for the grace to be able to "agape" him and trust in the meantime that he will accept your "philia" love as he did Peter's. 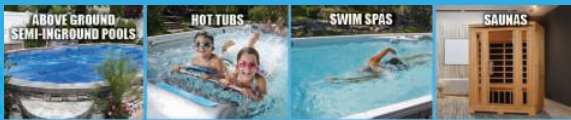
