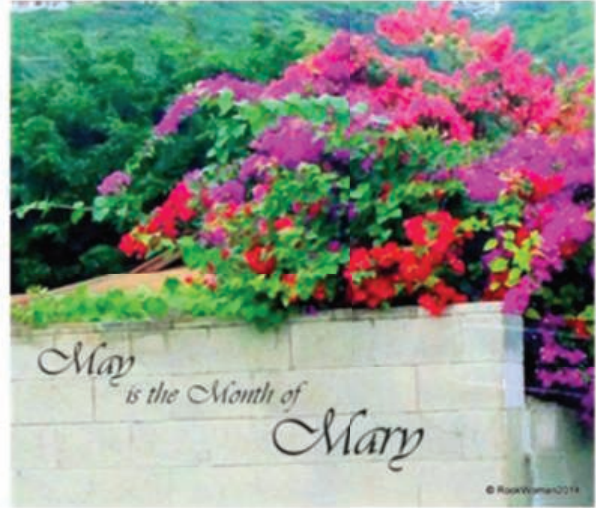

The Origin of the Creed

If you ask most people what the longest prayer is that they pray at a Catholic Mass, most will probably respond with the Creed. The only problem with that answer is that the Creed isn't really a prayer.

The Creed, after all, isn't addressed to God. It's a statement of beliefs which we recite together as an expression of our unity in the faith. It may be spoken reverently or even prayerfully, but that doesn't in itself make it a prayer.

So: where does the Creed come from? As a summary of the most central Christian doctrines, it arose from times when those beliefs were in question-- when various factions held different theological positions. The older version of the Creed is the Apostle's Creed, which traces its origin to the 4th Century. Although legend says that the Apostle's Creed was penned by the Apostles themselves, the earliest evidence we have is a letter from St. Ambrose, after the Council of Milan.

The creed we use most frequently at Mass is the Nicene Creed. Although its origins at the Council of Nicea in 325 place it in the same century as the Apostle's creed, the Nicene creed

is longer, and more explicitly defines what we believe about the human and divine natures of Jesus Christ. This was in reaction to the Arian heresy, which denied Christ's divinity. The version of the Nicene Creed we use today includes additions made at the Council of Constantinople in the year 381.

The Creed was further revised based on other theological controversies. In the late sixth Century, the Latin-speaking Churches of the west, under the banner of Rome, added the words "and the Son" to the phrase explaining the giving of the Holy Spirit. The Orthodox Churches of the East believe that the Holy Spirit is sent only from the Father. While this may seem like a minor point to most of us today, literal battles were fought over this "filioque" controversy.

When we recite the Creed at mass, we're part of the Church's long theological Tradition, re-affirming the results of centuries of theological study and debate that has helped us understand with ever-greater precision who God is, and what He has done for us.

STORIES THAT UPLIFT
Luke 24:13-35
3rd Sunday of Easter - Year A

There is a painting by a Dutch painter, Rembrandt, of Jesus sitting at the table with two of his disciples. Once, a guide was explaining the painting to some visitors to the museum where it was on display. He told them the story behind the picture as we read it in the gospel.

In the group was a couple, Mr. and Mrs. Browne, whose only son had been recently killed in a car accident. They were still in a state of shock and had come to the museum that day merely in the hope that it might take their mind off their sorrow for a little while.

As the guide started the story, the Brownes were only half listening. However, he told it in such a way that by the time he had finished, they were captivated. Afterwards they approached the guide and complemented him. "We've heard that story before, but it never moved us till now. You told it with such feeling and conviction."

"There was a time when I told the story badly," replied the guide. "What happened to change that?" the Brownes asked. "Three years ago," the guide began, "my wife got cancer and died a slow agonizing death. I could see absolutely no meaning in her terrible suffering and untimely death. She was a good person. She did not deserve all this. I was heartbroken. It was as if the world had come to an end.

"Nevertheless, I was persuaded to go back to work here at the museum. So once again I found myself telling the story, only more mechanically than before. "Then one day something clicked with me, and suddenly, I realized that the story was not just about those two forlorn disciples but about me too. Like the two disciples, I was going down a sad and lonely road. Even though I am a believer, regrettably, up to this Jesus had been little more than a shadowy figure who lived only in the pages of the Gospels.

"But now he came alive for me. I felt his presence by my side, the presence of a friend who knew all about human suffering. It was as if at that moment my eyes were opened, and I saw things differently. My heart began to burn within me. As I went on telling the story, a healing process was at work inside me. Even though at times I am still fragile, I had begun to hope and live again."

The Brownes were unable to hold back their tears. "Strange, they said, but as you told the story, we too felt our hearts burn within us." They told him the story of the tragic death of their son. As they parted, the Brownes said, "Thank you for what you did for us. You are a true disciple."

** The two disciples meet Jesus who makes them see things differently, and suddenly they understand it all with eyes of faith. The events remain the same, but the disciples have changed, and they see the old experience with new meaning. †*

Reflections for 3rd Sunday of Easter — April 23, 2023

OUR ROAD TO EMMAUS

The two disciples on the road to Emmaus is today's reading came to know the Lord "in the breaking of the bread"— the Eucharist. We can see that their encounter with Jesus that day parallels the way Jesus comes to meet us in every Mass.

First, just as Jesus spoke to the two disciples on the road about the Scriptures, so Jesus speaks to us through the scriptures in the Liturgy of the Word. Then, just as Jesus explained the Scriptures to the disciples on the road, so do we have those words interpreted for us by the priest so that we can begin to understand what they mean for our lives. The first half of the Mass, like the first half of the journey to Emmaus, centers on meeting and recognizing Jesus.

Then, as we experience the "breaking of the bread," Jesus gives us his very self, his Body and Blood. At that moment, our eyes can be opened and we are able to see Jesus in our midst. When we receive the Lord with an open and receptive heart, we know that he is alive...and with us. We begin to have a glimpse into the awesome plan of God for our own lives. The second half of the Mass, like the second half of the Emmaus story, centers on meeting and recognizing Jesus.

Finally, like the disciples who run back to Jerusalem to share the Good News, we too, at the end of every Mass, are commissioned to be ambassadors of Christ who has revealed himself in the Word and in the Eucharist.

PRAYER

Imagine you are in the inn with the two disciples. During the meal, the man who has been talking to you all day takes bread and blesses it. In that moment, you realize that he is Jesus. He is alive! The women were right—Jesus has been raised from the dead. He disappears, but you think: "Was not my heart burning within me when he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scripture to us?" How do you recognize Jesus today in the Scriptures? In the Eucharist?

RESOLUTION

As you read Scripture this week, be open to the ways Jesus reveals himself to you.
