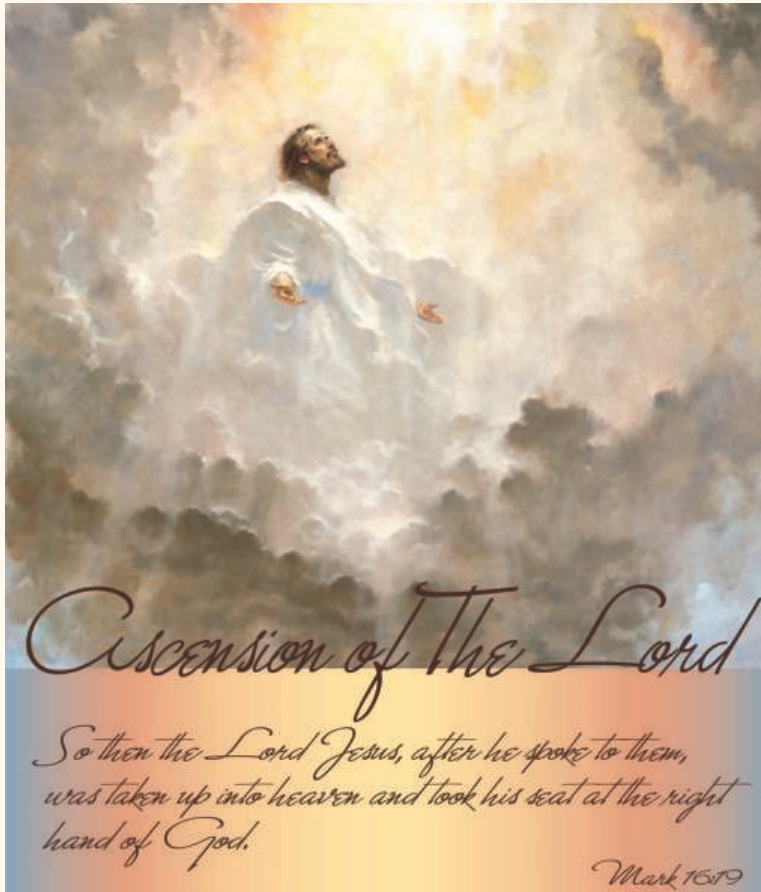

STORIES THAT UPLIFT
Matthew 28:16-20
Ascension of the Lord - Year A
Fr. Michael Brizio, IMC



One of the national coordinators of Sun Day, held early in May every year, is Denis Hayes. He worked as researcher at a Washington D.C. ‘think-tank’ and has written a book on solar energy entitled *Rays of Hope: The Transition to a Post-Petroleum World*.

Hayes claims that we are at the crossroads of making a critical choice for mankind—the choice between going solar or going nuclear for a power source. Hayes opts for the sun because it is “the world’s only inexhaustible, predictable, egalitarian, non-polluting, safe, terrorist-resistant and free energy source.”

We have already learned to use the power of the sun to grow food, make wine, and operate greenhouses. All we need to do is develop better technology to harness solar energy to heat houses, drive our cars, and run our industry. People like Hayes are looking at the sky with its sun as the main source of our future energy supply.

**Today we turn our attention to the sky for another reason—to commemorate our Lord’s Ascension into Heaven. Jesus makes a promise, “You will receive Power when the Holy Spirit comes down on you.” That Holy Spirit of the risen and ascended Lord is the power source that can give us all the energy we need to live our lives to the full. †*

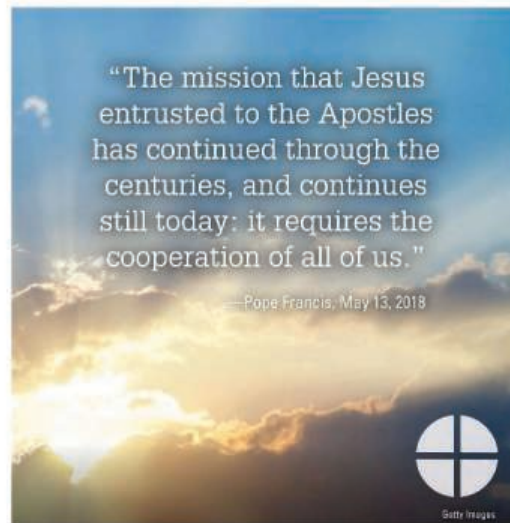

The Seventh Sunday of Easter

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

The Paschal Mystery culminates in the Ascension of Jesus. After his appearance here on earth in his risen body, and “after giving instructions through the holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen” (Acts 1:2), Jesus “was lifted up and a cloud took him from their sight” (Acts 1:9): Christ’s ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus’ humanity into God’s heavenly domain, whence he will come again (cf. Acts 1:11) . . . Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father’s glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever. Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension: The Church, the Body of Christ

This Eucharistic Prayer Companion is designed to help you spend 30 minutes to an hour in meditation and silent prayer with Jesus during Eucharistic adoration. Even if you cannot be physically present in a church or adoration chapel with the Blessed Sacrament, you can unite yourself spiritually to Jesus in the Eucharist as you spend this time in prayer.

THE GRACE I SEEK: to believe that Jesus wants me to be part of his living Body, the Church.

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Jesus, the Lord of Life, has given himself to you in the Eucharist. He is gazing upon you, his beloved child, with great love at this very moment. Pause for a few moments and allow yourself to rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to believe that you have a place for me in your living body, the Church.

MEDITATING ON THE MYSTERIES: EUCHARISTIC PRAYER INTERCESSIONS — *Read slowly, allowing your senses to help you enter into this moment of the Mass. Let the Holy Spirit fill your heart with his divine grace, that the hidden mystery from this moment in our memorial of Christ's sacrifice may be revealed more abundantly to you.*

Words cannot express the deep experience of your spirit as you participate in Christ's sacrifice. You become aware of your participation, in time, in the worship of eternity. You see the priest, you are aware of the assembly gathered, and of the angels and saints. Yet, even this is not enough. Now you join yourself earnestly in intercession—for the Pope, for your bishop, for the clergy, and for the whole Church around the world. You pray for a reunion of all the Father's scattered children and for the dead. In this Mass, the love of the Heart of Jesus is fully revealed—his sacrifice once and for all. You sense your own heart being drawn up into the very same desire of Jesus, and realize you, too, thirst for the complete and total communion Jesus promised, "that when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself" (Jn 12:32)

FOR REFLECTION — *Allow yourself to reflect for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.*

How can your own silence and interior composure (settled-ness) help you enter deeply into the mystery of the Body of Christ? How can your union with the assembly at Mass not be a distraction from Jesus but an opportunity for deeper communion through, with and in Jesus? How can your own *ars celebrandi* (art of celebrating/participating) in Mass help reveal the mystery of the worship of the body (us) for the head (Jesus)?

GOSPEL MEDITATION — *Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.*

All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age. (Matthew 28:18–20)

FOR REFLECTION — *Allow yourself to reflect for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.*

Jesus' parting words to his disciples are words of missionary sending. He wants everyone to be part of his body, the Church. As you sit in silence with Jesus, ask him to help you embrace more deeply your place in his Mystical Body and be filled with zeal for inviting others to be part of his body, the Church.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God, and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving, for the Ascension of Christ your Son is our exaltation, and, where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Ascension)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to participate fully, actively and consciously in the Church, the Body of Christ.

The program's dedicated volunteers provide all services FREE of charge. However, residents, must pay for materials. Reflections for The Ascension of the Lord — May 21, 2023

THROUGH THE EYES OF FAITH

The Apostles didn't get it. Despite the fact Jesus told them that he was going to die and eventually ascend to the Father, they were still confused. Even in the very last moments before Jesus was to leave them, they thought he was going to restore the kingdom of Israel and become a political ruler who would reestablish the throne of David. They really didn't get it until after the Ascension, when the Holy Spirit came and enlightened them. It's not surprising, then, that we, too, sometimes wonder why the Son had to ascend and what it means to be seated at the right hand of the Father.

Jesus returned to the right hand of the Father, not to leave us but to lead us all the way to heaven. The great paradox is because he has ascended, he is able to remain with us in a profound new way.

If Jesus had remained on earth in his physical body, he would have been present and visible in only one place. Now he is present in his Mystical Body, the Church. He is truly present in the Scriptures, in Baptism, in Confession, and in every sacramental action of the Church. And he is really present in his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. We see him, not with our human sight, but with the eyes of faith. What we are called to do, as faithful believers, is to let the world know that the Jesus who ascended into heaven is still with us, in the Church and through the Sacraments.

In prayer, ask Jesus how you can be a better witness to his Kingdom on earth today.
