EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES EXHIBIT



This traveling exhibit has been created to assist those who will experience it to affirm belief in the Real Presence of the Jesus in the Eucharist. It is based upon the [website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis](#) to catalogue all of the eucharistic miracles that have taken place worldwide.

The exhibit is circular and is divided into seven sections or rooms. In the first six rooms, information about the Eucharistic miracles is displayed. Each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013. Be sure to notice the date on the timeline and some of the world events that will help you to place in within the historical era.

All of the rooms point to the center of the exhibit. This is to intentionally remind us that the historical miracles we are learning about on the walls of the exhibit are all pointing to the miracle in front of us—Jesus, present in the Most Holy Eucharist! In the seventh room, the Eucharist is clearly visible in the monstrance and a place has been prepared for you to rest a while in His presence.

FROM THE DIOCESE

Short Term Counseling is Available for Parishioners Through Parishes

Parishioners have access to short term professional counseling at locations throughout the Diocese of Trenton through *Parish Counseling Services* developed by Catholic Charities and the Diocese of Trenton. Licensed counseling professionals will be available to help parishioners, through difficult issues such as marital problems, raising children, eldercare, bereavement, or the stress of job loss that can be successfully addressed by brief counseling support. Short term counseling is not appropriate treatment for severe or persistent mental illness.

Referrals to "*Parish Counseling Services*" can only be made by pastors and parish priests, by emailing a completed referral form to *Parish Counseling Services*. A coordinator will contact the parishioner to arrange for counseling after the request has been received.

Please note *Short Term Counseling* is defined as a maximum of six sessions. The fee is \$90/per session. If financial assistance is needed, *The Diocese of Trenton Parish Counseling Services* will assist with a grant of \$65/per session. However, the co-pay of \$25/per session is the responsibility of the individual and is paid to the counselor at the end of each session. At the parishioner's request their insurance can be accessed for these counseling services as long as the coverage for the service is available under his/her health plan and the counselor is on that plan.

FROM BISHOP DAVID M. O'CONNELL, C.M.



With the Blessed Virgin Mary Towards the Sixteenth Ordinary Synod of Bishops

*Mary, the mother of God, is always with us on the synodal path, for she is also 'Mother of the Church' (Mater Ecclesiae); mother of all those who are companions and disciples of her son. Whenever we are feeling lost, confused, or hesitant about the way, we only have to look to her to point out the way. Mary does not speak. She does not need to. She only needs to direct our gaze to her son. In her wordless gesture, she sums up the whole mission of the Church. Even when the People of God are 'in via'—on the journey—they are always in mission. The two cannot be separated, for there is but one way and one object of our desire, one source of our life and our hope: Jesus Christ. (General Secretariat for the Synod, **Towards a spirituality for synodality, p.45**)*

Through the General Secretariat for the Synod, our Holy Father Pope Francis has asked all Dioceses throughout the world to observe a "World Day of Prayer for the Sixteenth Ordinary Synod of Bishops 2021-2024," on the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Wednesday, May 31, 2023, entrusting the "Synod on Synodality" to loving protection, care and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

All the clergy, religious and lay faithful of the Diocese of Trenton in all the parishes of the Diocese, especially those named in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary under any of her titles, are asked to pray for this special intention on May 31, 2023. Catholic schools, and other Catholic organizations and institutions are also encouraged to join in this prayer intention.

As Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, I especially recommend prayer to Our Blessed Virgin Mary through her most holy rosary.

Mother, help our faith! Open our ears to hear God's word and to recognize his voice and call. And may this light of faith always increase in us, until the dawn of that undying day, which is Christ himself, your Son, our Lord! Amen.

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.



Reflections for Pentecost Sunday—May 28, 2023

THE HOLY SPIRIT

This week we celebrate Pentecost, the feast of the Church's birth. With a roaring of the heavens and in tongues of fire, the Holy Spirit comes and enlightens the Apostles. Peter begins to preach with boldness and authority what Christ's life truly means. From that moment the great mission of the Church begins.

The Apostles were emboldened to spread the Gospel, not on their own, but through the power of the Holy Spirit who descended on the upper room that spring day.

Who and what is the Holy Spirit? In many ways, the Holy Spirit is the most difficult of the three Persons of the Trinity for us to comprehend, yet he is fully and truly God, co-equal with the Father and Son. Indeed, the Holy Spirit is the bond of love between the Father and Son. The mutual, eternal, perfect love of the Father and the Son is the third Person of the Holy Trinity—the Holy Spirit.

When we are baptized, the Holy Spirit is breathed into our souls, but the Spirit's work within us is intensified in the Sacrament of Confirmation. When we are confirmed, like the Apostles, we are strengthened to give greater witness to the faith. The Holy Spirit comes to each of us, bestowing his gifts. He directs us in a particular way, as a member of the Body of Christ, for the common good of the entire Church.

PRAYER

“The Spirit makes one person a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power of casting out devils, enables another to interpret holy Scripture. The Spirit strengthens one man's self-control, shows another how to help the poor, teaches another to fast and lead a life of asceticism, makes another oblivious to the needs of the body, trains another for martyrdom. His action is different in different people, but the Spirit himself is always the same.”

What action of the Holy Spirit that St. Cyril mentions do you notice most in your life? What action of the Spirit do you want to allow more into your life? Spend a few minutes in silent prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to help you in that way.

RESOLUTION

Once you have determined a potential gift of the Spirit in your life, consider ways that you might bring that gift into fullness in your family, your work, and your parish.
