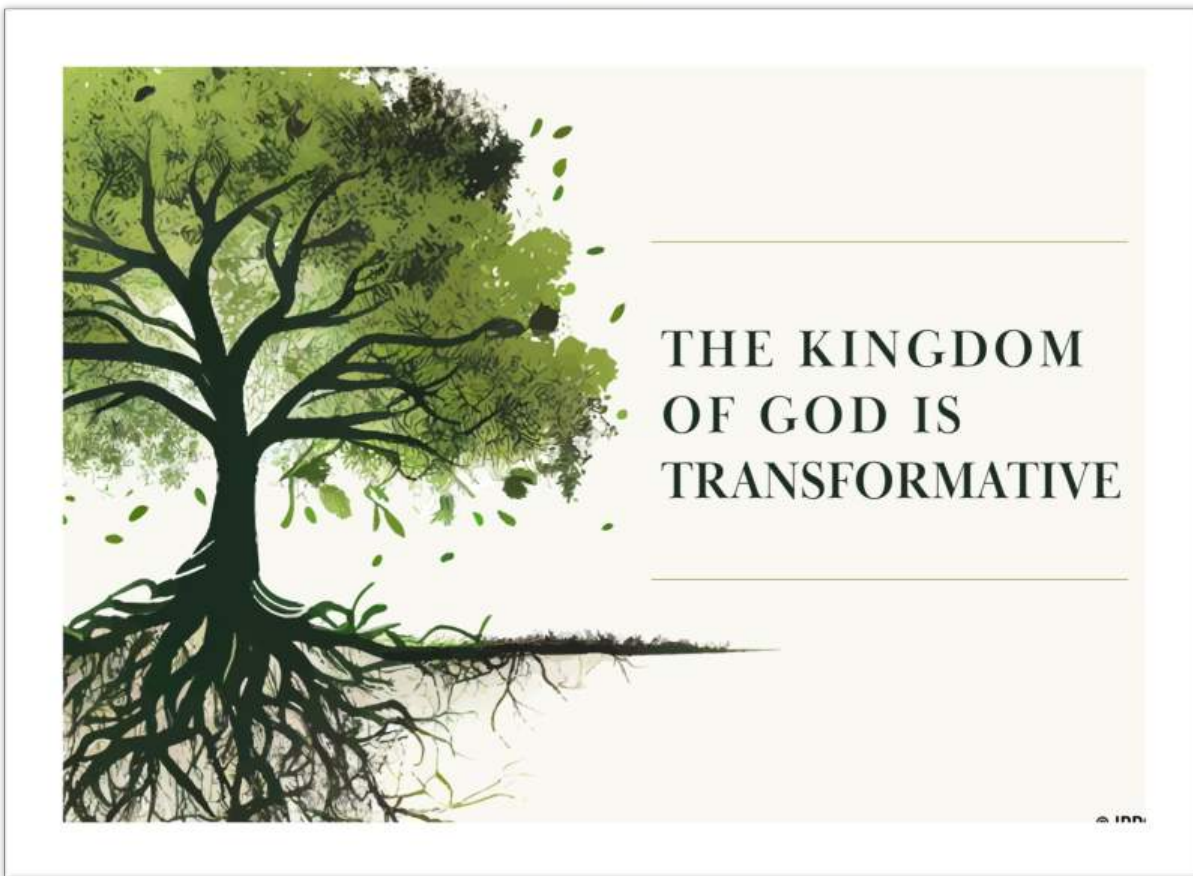

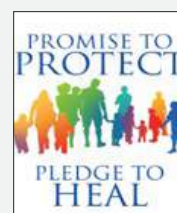

June is the start of wedding season!

The Catholic Church has a long history of helping couples to prepare for marriage. It has learned a great deal that can benefit any couple, regardless of religion.

Because the Catholic Church wants couples to form strong, lasting marriages, couples who wish to marry in the Catholic Church are asked to:

- Contact and meet with your parish priest as soon as you are engaged.
- Take at least six months to intensively prepare for your marriage. This goes beyond choosing a date and church, reserving a place for the reception, and picking out dresses. It means using this time to delve more deeply into your relationship and approach this momentous day with prayer and reflection.
- Attend an approved marriage preparation program. There are many different formats for marriage preparation programs ranging from intensive weekends, to a weekly series, to “in home” mentor couple programs. Check out the most common national programs here. To find what programs are available near you, contact your diocesan family life office. Catholic marriage preparation programs are usually presented by a team of lay married couples and a priest or deacon. They are not restricted to Catholics, but they are always in keeping with Church teaching.
- Most dioceses ask couples to take a marriage preparation inventory (such as FOCCUS, PMI, or PREPARE). These are not “tests” to determine whether you can get married in the Church, but rather discussion starters to assess what issues you already agree on and what you might need to discuss further.

Marriage is a vocation to holiness. Whether you are just starting out in marriage or have fifty years under your belt, the advice, real life stories, and Church teaching here can help strengthen and bless your marriage. Explore resources from For Your Marriage! <https://www.foryourmarriage.org>

Marriage is the Icon of God's Love

"The image of God is the married couple: the man and the woman; not only the man, not only the woman, but both of them together. This is the image of God: love, God's covenant with us is represented in that covenant between man and woman. And this is very beautiful!" (Pope Francis, General Audience, April 2, 2014)

Read:

It *is* a beautiful truth! A husband and wife image God in their marital union. As the Second Vatican Council taught, married love is "caught up" in the divine love of God, who is a Communion of Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit (*Gaudium et Spes*, no. 48). In the union of husband and wife there is mutual love and reciprocity, which reflects the love of God Himself. In Ephesians, St. Paul teaches that Christian spouses reflect a "great mystery": the nuptial relationship between Christ and His Church (Eph 5:21-22). In their ordinary lives, husbands and wives can be a visible sign of Christ's love for His Church by giving themselves in fidelity and service to each other and to those around them. This is a high calling...and a beautiful one!

Reflect:

Think of an example of a good marriage. The husband and wife go out of their way to do nice things for each other. They give of their time and energy without asking for anything in return. They are faithfully committed to their marriage and are ready to make sacrifices for the other. Some could say they are head-over-heels in love with one another, even after many years! Does this describe your marriage? When spouses exhibit marital behavior like this, they help us understand what it means that marriage is an image of God's love. Husbands and wives are called to display those qualities of love that Christ Himself displayed on the Cross.

Pray:

Almighty and eternal God,
You blessed the union of husband
and wife
So that we might reflect the union

of Christ with his Church:

look with kindness on us.

Renew our marriage covenant.

Increase your love in us,
and strengthen our bond of peace
so that, [with our children],
we may always rejoice in the gift
of your blessing.

We ask this through Christ our
Lord.

Amen.

Act:

1. **Pray:** Read together 1 Corinthians 13, St. Paul's hymn of love.
2. **Reflect:** Is your love for each other patient, kind, etc. (from the list in 1 Corinthians)? Where can you grow?
3. **Do:** Place a picture from your wedding day in a well-trafficked area of your home (if there's not one already), and put on it or next to it the words, "We are called to be an image of God's love." Consider this your daily reminder.

Reflection on the Readings for the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time - June 16, 2024

A SMALL MUSTARD SEED

The more we come to know God through study and prayer, the more we realize his thoughts are not our thoughts, nor are our ways his ways (*see Isaiah 55*). What we assume God would do is so often challenged by how the events of our lives actually unfold. Today's readings draw us into this mystery of God's complete other-ness.

In Jesus's time the Jewish people were awaiting the Messiah, or Anointed One, who would liberate them from the captivity of the Romans. They were looking for a military warrior who could defeat the enemy by strength of arm and raise up the Israelites to fight alongside him. But God's ways are not our ways. Jesus came and wasn't a military leader, but rather a teacher, healer, and friend. He consistently allowed people to walk away from him when his teachings were too hard. Jesus wasn't concerned with numbers—he chose only twelve men, not an army. And starting with a kingdom the size of a mustard seed, the Church has grown all over the world.

PRAYER

Return to the Gospel for today. Remember your call to childlike humility as you ponder these words. Try to get in touch with the freedom that comes from realizing that we are not the ones who build the kingdom — God is. Take a word that comes to mind and reflect on what it means to you personally. For example, the phrase “becomes the largest of plants” might have struck you. Ask yourself what this means in your own life. Is the Lord trying to give you hope in this mystery so that you can abandon yourself more fully to him?

RESOLUTION

The parable of the mustard seed should encourage us that, despite our many sins and imperfections, we have the ability to live a good life with the Lord. God transforms the humble, the little ones, into saints because they must totally rely on him. It is the same with little groups of people.

When we begin to learn more about the saints, we realize that they often come in groups. Some of them knew each other, and were sometimes dear friends, family, or spiritual directors of one another. Some met only once or twice, or were inspired by each other. It is out of these “convinced minorities” that God has changed the world:

- *St. Ambrose, St. Augustine, St. Monica, and St. Jerome*
- *St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, St. Anthony of Padua, and St. Dominic*
- *St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane Frances de Chantal*
- *St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis Xavier, St. Peter Faber, and St. Philip Neri*
- *St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross*
- *St. Patrick and St. Brigid*
- *Pope St. John Paul II, St. Teresa of Calcutta, St. Maximilian Kolbe, St. Faustina and St. Pio*
- *St. Louis and St. Zélie and their daughter, St. Thérèse of Lisieux*

What will you do this week to start living out this philosophy of the mustard seed? How can you live smaller and focus on loving those neighbors near you, trusting that out of these little acts of love God will grow his kingdom into the mightiest tree? | formed.org
