HOW TO BECOME CATHOLIC

To decide whether this path is right for you, please contact the parish office, where you will be put in touch a trained OCIA team member who will meet with you and answer your questions. No immediate commitment is necessary at the time of initial inquiry.

The OCIA process is designed to offer you guidance and support in your spiritual journey towards a deepening relationship with Jesus. As you move forward through prayer, reflection, Scripture reading, storytelling, questioning, worshiping, and performing works of charity, OCIA members, along with the parish community, will accompany you on your faith journey. 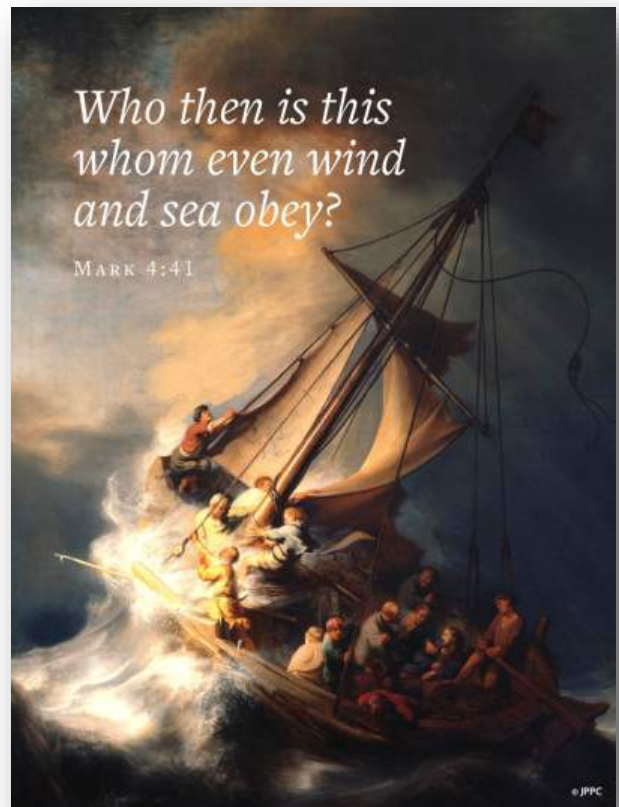

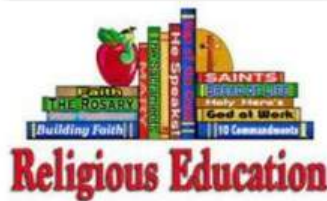

The **Fix It Program** volunteers assist residents of Ocean County who are 60 years of age or older by performing minor home repairs, which if neglected would adversely affect their health and/or safety. The program's dedicated volunteers provide all services FREE of charge. However, residents must pay for materials. The **Fix It Program** is made possible through grants from the Ocean County Office of Senior Services and is registered with the Volunteer Center of Ocean County. This is a great opportunity for both skilled and unskilled volunteers to give back to their communities and help seniors maintain independence in their homes.

TYPES OF SERVICES **FIX IT** VOLUNTEERS PERFORM:

- Install grab bars and safety hand rails
- Repair minor electrical problems (such as faulty light switches)
- Do minor carpentry repairs
- Do minor plumbing (such as leaky faucets and running toilets)
- Change storm windows and doors
- Weather stripping and caulking
- Replace batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors
- Change light bulbs
- Change furnace filters and air conditioner filters
- Install curtain and drapery hardware
- Fix small appliances
- Perform seasonal outside jobs.

Reflections on the Readings for the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time - June 23, 2024

WHO IS IN CONTROL?

We've all had moments in our lives when chaos seems to reign and we feel completely out of control. In fact, those moments appear to be rapidly increasing in current times, as everyone seems to be moving more quickly and trying to accomplish more than ever. Our days may seem to be full of storms. What hasn't changed is that God is greater than the storms. He is the one who is truly in control of our lives. But do we really believe that? Every storm we encounter presents another opportunity to trust God and to rely on his providential care.

PRAYER

Let's return to the Gospel for this week. Put yourself into this dramatic scene. Imagine the waves coming into the boat and the feeling of losing control and almost being cast overboard. What is your attitude toward Jesus? Do you trust him or not? Take a word that comes to mind and reflect on what it means to you personally. For example, the phrase, "Do you not yet have faith?" might have struck you. Ask yourself what this means. Are there times when God provided for you that you have forgotten? Does he want to remind you so that you can trust him again? Call to mind the faithfulness of God in your life and let those memories sink in.

RESOLUTION

So many times in life we get caught up in a storm of fear even though we try to trust God. Even when God tangibly provides for us, we are quick to forget. Without our memory, we lose our identity as his children. We are called to follow the psalmist who said, "I will call to mind the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your wonders of old" (see Psalm 77:11). In your prayer this week, make it a habit to remember the works of God in your life. As you remember what the Lord has done for you, give thanks! Gratitude increases our faith and keeps us from fear. We can keep many storms at bay simply by habitually praying, remembering God's mercies in our lives, and giving thanks. formed.org
