Welcome to the Parish of St. Monica! Whether you're here for the first time or the thousandth time, know that we are very glad you have come to worship with us!

If you have not yet registered in the parish, please do so. Registration is necessary for your children to attend Religious Education classes this fall, and for you and your children to celebrate the sacraments of baptism, eucharist, confirmation. Your registration also helps our parish and our Diocese plan for the future.

HOW TO BECOME CATHOLIC

If you are considering becoming a Catholic, or you are a baptized Catholic who is considering completing your Sacraments of Initiation (Confirmation and Holy Eucharist), our Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) process can help you.

To decide whether this path is right for you, please contact the parish office, where you will be put in touch a trained OCIA team member who will meet with you and answer your questions. No immediate commitment is necessary at the time of initial inquiry.

The OCIA process is designed to offer you guidance and support in your spiritual journey towards a deepening relationship with Jesus. As you move forward through prayer, reflection, Scripture reading, storytelling, questioning, worshiping, and performing works of charity, OCIA members, along with the parish community, will accompany you on your faith journey. SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Have you been asked to be a Godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation? Congratulations! What an honor to be asked to step into the life of a child as a role model and guide in the faith!

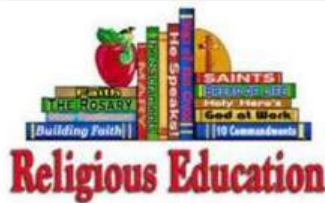
As soon as you agree to fill the role of Godparent/Sponsor, you will need to contact the parish office and request a *Sponsor Certificate*.

To receive a Sponsor Certificate, you must:

- Be a registered, active (attend Mass) member of your parish for at least 6 months
- Be at least 16 years of age
- Must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation
- If married, must have a valid marriage within the Catholic Church

Preparations for the 2024-2025 Religious Ed. year are underway.

Re-registration forms for students currently in the program were sent home with the students. If you have not registered your child/children for class, we ask that you return your forms immediately. Space is limited; the session you choose may no longer be available. Forms may be returned via mail or dropped off at the parish office. Please note that there is a black box outside the parish office doors labeled Religious Education if you need to drop off information during off hours.

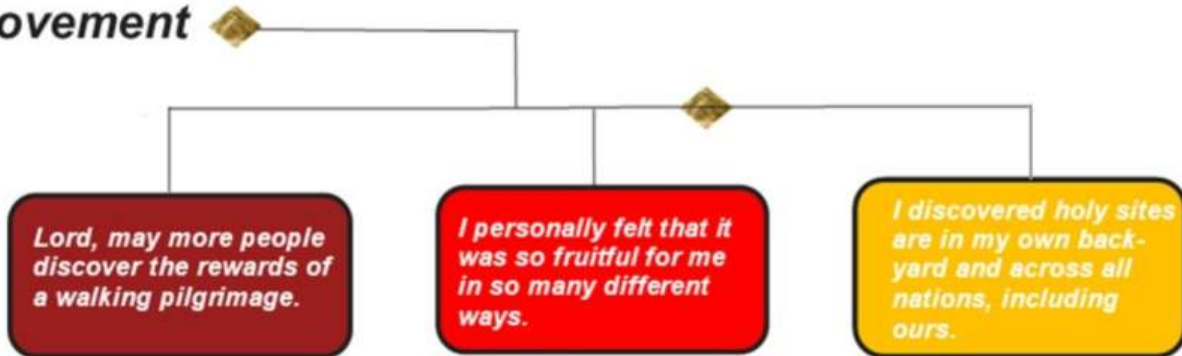

PLAN YOUR OWN PILGRIMAGE

In the Spirit of the Movement



This Year of Parish Revival is about falling deeper in love with the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and following him more closely. Mirroring this internal journey with an external one is a beautiful way to connect body and soul in the pursuit of Christ.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is not one event or a road trip—it is an exciting opportunity for American Catholics everywhere to physically embody our nation's journey of Eucharistic Revival. Whether you are on the shores of Hawaii or in the mountains of Alaska, needing to stay close to home or deployed overseas, you are invited to be a part of this journey.



Eucharistic Mini-Pilgrimage Guide

Go in peace! The journey you are making is under the eye of the LORD.

JUDGES 18:6



1. CHOOSE A PILGRIMAGE DESTINATION AND TIME FRAME

WHERE: Choose a holy site that will help you grow closer to Jesus in the Eucharist. This could be a church, shrine, or monastery. See if your diocese has a list of local pilgrimage sites.

WHEN: Make sure the site will be open when you intend to arrive. Plan your journey around the celebration of the Mass or Eucharistic adoration.

TRAVEL: Decide how you will be traveling—walking, driving, by train, etc. Make arrangements beforehand so that you can be fully present to your pilgrimage experience.

WITH WHOM: Will you be traveling alone or with a community such as your family, parish, or youth group?

2. YOUR INTENTIONS FOR THE PILGRIMAGE

Pray for the special intentions that you and your loved ones have. You might also carry in your heart intentions for the Church, the world, or your local community. Be very specific and write them down. Jesus wants to bring healing, wholeness, and peace!

3. SPIRITUAL PREPARATION

PRAYER: Invite family and friends to join you in prayer.

PATRON: Pick a patron saint for your pilgrimage as your heavenly companion for the journey.

4. SETTING OUT/TRAVELING TO YOUR DESTINATION

PRAYER: Make your pilgrimage a time of prayer and thanksgiving. Consider vocal prayers like the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, or reading from Scripture: Mark 14:22-24, John 6:35, John 6:51-57, Acts 2:42, 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, 1 Corinthians 11:23-28.

5. ARRIVING AND PRAYING FOR YOUR INTENTIONS

As you come to the threshold of your pilgrimage destination, do so with the knowledge that Jesus is waiting to encounter you in the Eucharist.

PRAYER: Spend some time in silent adoration, thanking God for this pilgrimage and praying for your petitions. Pray individually and as a group.

LITURGY: If possible, participate in Mass, offering the Mass for your petitions.

6. RETURNING

SHARING: Spend some quality time before you leave or on the way home sharing the graces of your experience with one another. If you are traveling on your own, journal about these graces or share them with a friend.

7. POST-PILGRIMAGE

After your pilgrimage, pray about how the experience changed you. Ask Jesus to show you how he wants to be more present in your life through this pilgrimage.

If you carried the intentions of others, share something about what the pilgrimage meant for you with them.

Encounter with Jesus leads to mission. Make an act of service or kindness to share in the saving mission of Jesus.

A Eucharistic pilgrimage is a testimony to the world that Jesus is alive in the Eucharist, and he accompanies us—all of us—on our pilgrimage through life.

Reflections on the Readings for the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time — July 7, 2024

THE RIGHT THINGS TO ASK FOR

This week's Gospel contrasts sharply with the miracles of faith from Jairus and the hemorrhaging woman we read about last Sunday. *These* people have known Jesus all his life, and the fact that they are surprised by Jesus's deeds testifies to his humility. Through God, he remained for years an undistinguished member of his community. Only when the Father's plan ordained it did he begin to work miracles. But this does not win over his neighbors from Nazareth. Because of their familiarity with Jesus, they are irritated when he begins to show his mighty power.

This Gospel is a warning for all. When it comes to faith, especially for lifelong Christians, it is possible to think that we have Jesus all figured out. When this happens, we become upset when he diverges from our expectations. This might be when he asks for faith during a major change in our lives, or when something small occurs and throws off our daily routine. Whenever we experience disappointment or disillusionment, Jesus wants us to trust him. Our plans and our ideas about how God should act must not be the object of our trust. To avoid this pitfall, it can be wise to spend some time examining what our idea of Jesus is, and to pray to know him as he truly is. And as always, the one who can help us best to appreciate Jesus is his Mother.

PRAYER

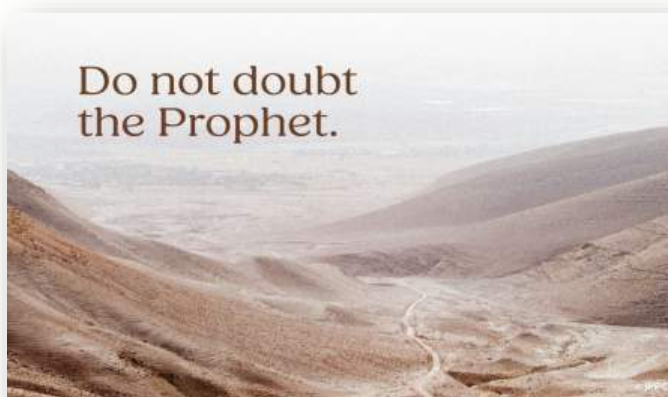
This week's readings challenge us to be people of faith, seeking after spiritual gifts and virtues rather than focusing on worldly blessings. Take some time to examine your own heart. Are you motivated to seek Christ in order to obtain wealth, health, popularity, or prosperity? Or, are you seeking after a life of virtue that will bring you intimacy with God, despite the trials you may face along the journey?

What holds you back from having faith in God? What attachments cause you to lose focus of spiritual goods? Do you make time to read and accept the Word of God in your life?

RESOLUTION

Have you ever felt like the prophet Ezekiel or Jesus in this week's readings where they are most misunderstood in their hometown? How did you respond to family and friend's misunderstandings? Are you able to remain charitable and still hold on to your convictions?

Sometimes, it can be hardest to go home. Even Jesus experienced misunderstanding and rejection among the people who knew him. We can be easily frustrated that people haven't changed or that they don't know how we have changed and grown. We can feel judged and misunderstood. While we may be amazed at their lack of understanding, it's most important for us to focus on responding with charity. We can still be true to our faith, but sharing our faith with love and pastoral sensitivity is important. | formed.org
