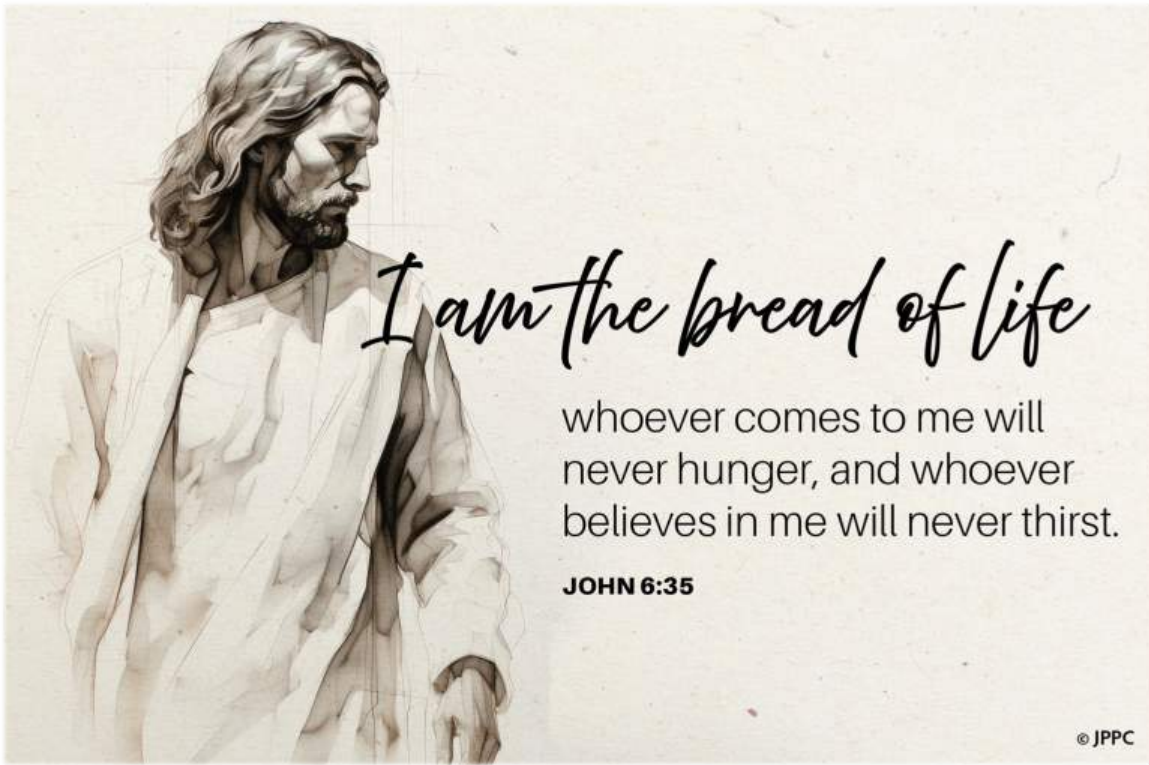

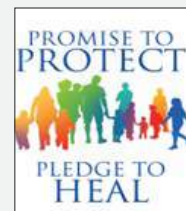

FIX IT PROGRAM VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



The **Fix It Program** volunteers assist residents of Ocean County who are 60 years of age or older by performing minor home repairs, which if neglected would adversely affect their health and/or safety. The program's dedicated volunteers provide all services FREE of charge. However, residents must pay for materials. The **Fix It Program** is made possible through grants from the Ocean County Office of Senior Services and is registered with the Volunteer Center of Ocean County. This is a great opportunity for both skilled and unskilled volunteers to give back to their communities and help seniors maintain independence in their homes.

TYPES OF SERVICES **FIX IT** VOLUNTEERS PERFORM

- Install grab bars and safety hand rails
- Repair minor electrical problems (such as faulty light switches)
- Do minor carpentry repairs
- Do minor plumbing (such as leaky faucets and running toilets)
- Change storm windows and doors
- Weather stripping and caulking
- Replace batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors
- Change light bulbs
- Change furnace filters and air conditioner filters
- Install curtain and drapery hardware
- Fix small appliances
- Perform seasonal outside jobs

Reflections on the Readings for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 4, 2024

MIRACLES AND WHISPERS

Have you ever asked yourself why God doesn't just perform miracles all the time to reveal his presence so that everyone will believe in him? It's a valid question, but one of those questions that we might ignore or push to the back of our mind because we don't think there's a good answer. But these questions have answers in Catholic theology, and we are called to pray about these questions, because God will illuminate the answers to them.

The readings today invite us into this mystery of our faith – why not miracles? Of course, there are extraordinary miracles of physical healing, for example, that do happen, but God does not ordinarily reveal himself to us in this way. Ordinarily, God moves in more gradual ways that invite us into deep friendship with him. We tend to ask for miracles that provide for our physical, worldly needs, but God is also concerned for our spiritual well-being and our final end of eternal life. Therefore, our spiritual well being may not entail physical healing.

In the Gospel today, Jesus chides the Israelites for seeking only earthly fulfillment. He calls them, and likewise us, to open our hearts to our deeper desire for God. Ultimately, God wants to fill our deepest longings for his infinite love.

PRAYER

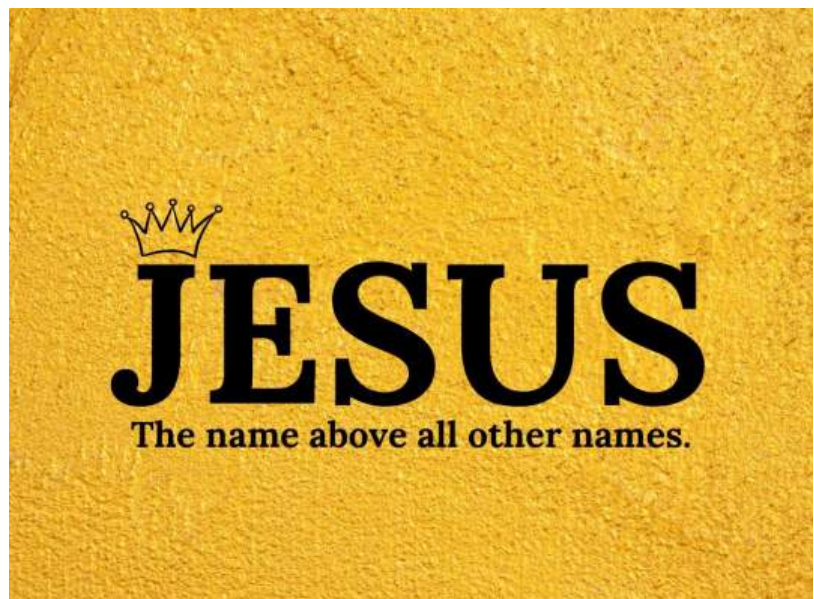
Return to the Gospel for this week. Put yourself in the place of the crowds and the disciples. Imagine that you had come to Jesus to satisfy only your earthly needs. What is your reaction to this man who instead reminds you of your deeper hunger for divine love, and promises to fill it?

Take this image that comes to mind and reflect on what it means to you personally. For example, the phrase, “do not work for food that perishes,” might have stuck out to you. Ask yourself what this means in your own life. Is Jesus inviting you to put aside the material things that are preventing you from attaining deeper friendship with him? Is he mercifully calling you into deeper intimacy with him, for which you are truly longing?

RESOLUTION

While we are called to cultivate silent prayer, when we can hear the whisper of God in our hearts, the celebration of the Eucharist is the public worship of the Church, which is the miracle that is the source and summit of our Catholic life (Lumen Gentium, 11). The sacraments, particularly the Eucharist, are the places where whisper and miracle meet. If we are unable to hear God's gentle whisper, the miracle of the Eucharist will remain hidden from us. Cultivating this kind of deep prayer life, in which we come to true communion with God, prepares us for the gift of ultimate communion in the Eucharist.
