Saint of the Week

Monica

331-387
Memorial—August 27



Born in Tagaste in present-day Algeria, this North African lay woman was given in marriage to Patricius, a Roman pagan. St. Augustine of Hippo, a saint in the making, was their eldest child. Monica tried to bring him up a Christian but was also concerned for his worldly success and sent him to Carthage to study. Her prayers helped the conversion of both her husband and her mother-in-law to Christ. Her two other children, Navigius and Perpetua, were also known for righteousness, and Perpetua eventually entered religious life. But Augustine,

to Monica's dismay, joined the heretical Manichean sect. He scorned Christianity and had a son with his mistress. In 383, Monica sought his conversion and followed Augustine to Italy, where she became a follower of St. Ambrose and asked for his intervention with Augustine. Three years later, Augustine was baptized by St. Ambrose. Monica fell ill shortly after and died before their return to Africa. Years before, a bishop had famously counseled her, "It is not possible that the son of so many tears should be lost."

“ [August 27] we will celebrate the memory of St Monica, Mother of St Augustine. To the intercession of these Saints let us entrust Christian newlyweds and parents, that like Monica, they may accompany by example and prayer the journey of their children. Let us commend the sick who are most in need of comfort and constant attention as well as young people that, like Augustine, they may move towards the fullness of Truth and Love, which is Christ: he alone can satisfy the deep needs of the human heart. ”

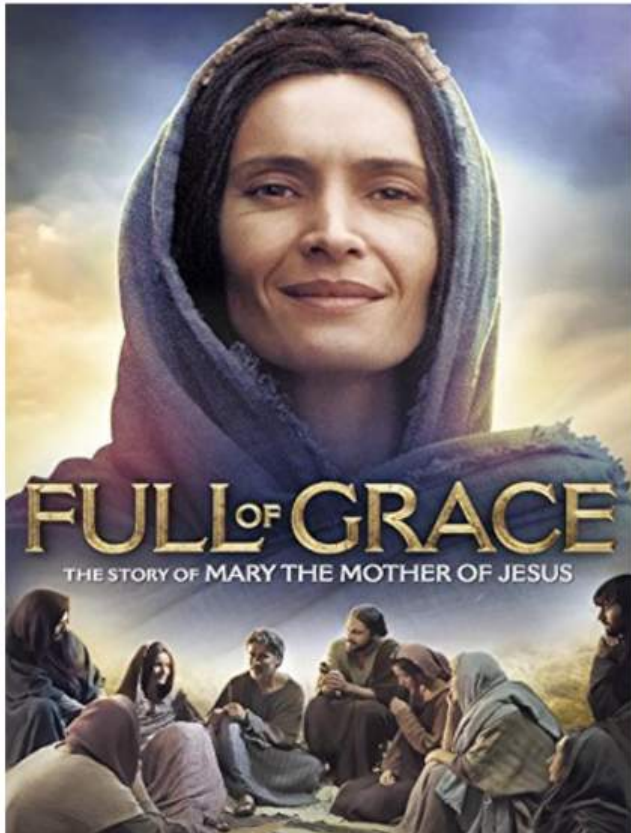

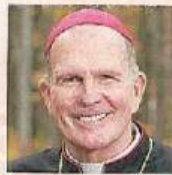

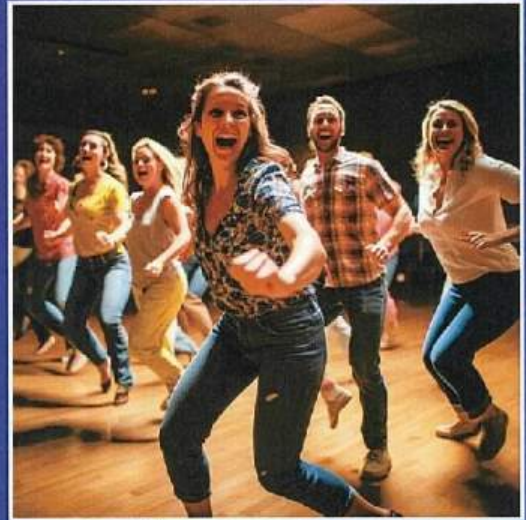

Reflections on the Readings for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 25, 2024

A HARD SAYING

The word “Christian” literally means “follower of Christ.” Because we are Christians, we are followers of Christ, but how many of us truly know what that means? Maybe we have never consciously decided to follow him, but we go to Church because of how we were raised or because of our spouse.

Unfortunately, many Catholics simply go through the motions in their spiritual life. They may receive their sacraments and celebrate holidays with their families, but is it possible that Jesus wants us to give more of ourselves to him? To follow Christ truly and fully, we can't simply go through the motions. We can't attend Mass and not reverence the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist. Jesus doesn't want us to attend Mass only to think about the upcoming football game or work on Monday. He wants us to come to Mass, ready to receive his grace and give ourselves entirely to him.

In the Gospel this week, we finish Jesus's discourse on the Eucharist. After he proclaims that we must eat his flesh and drink his blood to gain eternal life, his disciples must make a decision. Many say that his proclamation concerning the Eucharist is a “hard saying,” but some remain with him and grow in even deeper friendship with him. The same question faces us this week – will we choose to follow Jesus in all he teaches, even in the hard sayings, or will we abandon him for the easier path?

PRAYER

Return to the Gospel for today. Put yourself in the moment when Jesus is turning to his disciples to ask if they will leave him. Look honestly at Jesus and everything that he teaches. Do you want to follow him? Take the word that comes to mind and reflect on what it means to you personally. For example, the phrase, “Do you also want to leave?”, might have stuck out to you. Ask yourself what this means in your own life. Is Jesus asking you to stay with him, to follow him, and to open your heart to a deeper friendship with him?

RESOLUTION

In his book *Life of Christ*, Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen gave the following observation on our Gospel for this week: *“The announcement of the Eucharist produced one of the greatest crises in [Jesus'] life. His promise to give His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity for souls of men caused Him to lose much that He had gained. Until now, He had almost everyone behind Him: first, the masses or the common people; next, the elite, the intellectuals, and the spiritual leaders; and finally, His own Apostles. But this lofty spiritual doctrine was too much for them... If He had been only a little more worldly-minded, if He had only allowed His words to be treated as figures of speech, and if He had only been less imperative He might have been more popular. He lost the masses; He created a schism among His disciples; He even weakened His apostolic band.”*

Jesus sacrificed so much in order to give us the Eucharist—he even broke his own body and poured out his own blood (Matthew 26:26-29). To follow Him on this path will require us to sacrifice as well. Jesus gave up worldly power, popularity, and even friendship. What are some things in your own life that Jesus is inviting you to sacrifice so that you can be free to follow him? | formed.org
