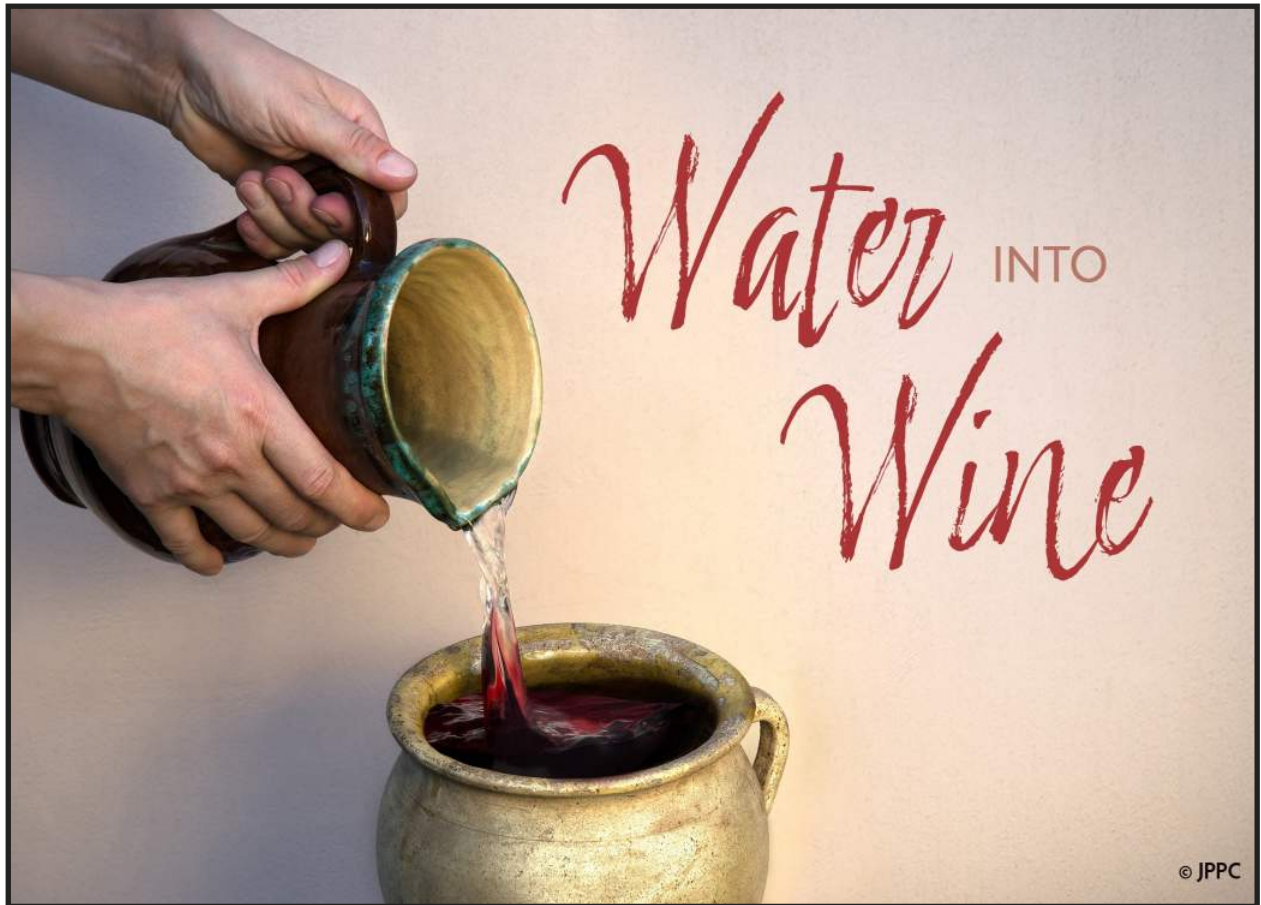

Prayer for Peace

In honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.



In 2015, Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz, president of the USCCB, released a statement in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who we remember on Monday, January 15, this year.

In his statement Archbishop Kurtz said, "Dr. King reminded us of the power of prayer and action. I invite everyone, this day and every day, to implore God to make us his instruments in creating a more just society."

He then closed with this excerpt from Pope Francis's prayer for peace:

Invocation for Peace

"Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of [those] who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

"Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words 'division,' 'hatred' and 'war' be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be 'brother,' and our way of life will always be that of . . . Peace . . . ! Amen."

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Isaiah 62:1-5 • 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 • John 2:1-11

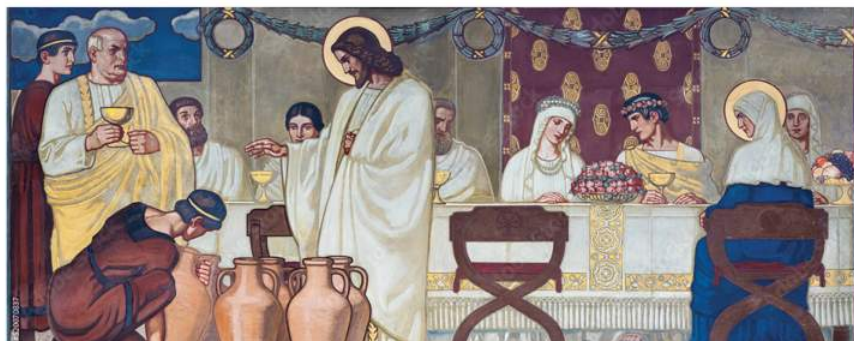
“Do Whatever He Tells You”

In today's reading in John 2, we find Our Lady bringing up a need at a wedding in Cana that she was attending with Jesus and his disciples. John writes, “When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, “They have no wine.” It should not surprise us that Our Lord's first miracle takes place at the request of his mother, who saw the concern of the bride and the bridegroom. St. John Paul II's encyclical *Redemptoris Mater* says John 2 is where Mary is introduced to us as our spiritual mother.*

If you are a Catholic, you have your natural mother and a supernatural mother, Mary. The role of our Blessed Mother is like that of the queen mother in the Old Testament. The queen mother, who was the king's mother, had a throne to the right of the king. She had a responsibility to be the intercessor on behalf of the people. She brought their concerns to the king. Mary, notes St. John Paul, brings our cares to her Son.

I love the second thing that comes out in this reading. Mary says to the servants, “Do whatever he tells you.” These important words mark the last time Our Lady is quoted directly in Scripture. When our eternal mother brings our concerns to Jesus, our response should be to listen to him and do what he tells us to do. He has something to tell us in prayer.

I remember a bumper sticker that said, “Your mother Mary hasn't heard from you in decades.” Maybe it's time you talked with her. Give her your concerns. She brings them to Jesus. Then, do whatever he tells you.

Then, Our Lord is going to speak to you.”

Reflections on the Readings for the 2nd Week in Ordinary Time - January 19, 2025

DO WHATEVER HE TELLS YOU

Today's Gospel reading on the wedding feast at Cana offers two examples of prompt obedience and Christian discipleship. The first example is Mary, the mother of Jesus. She notices the crisis about to unfold at the wedding feast: The wine has run short. To run out of wine would have brought great shame upon the family hosting the wedding feast. Mary sees the need and immediately brings the concern to the one person who can make a difference: Jesus. In her actions, Mary teaches us to go promptly to Jesus with all our needs.

The second example is the servants who give full obedience to Jesus' commands, filling the stone jars with water. Even though they do not see how jars full of water will solve the problem of the wine shortage, they trust Jesus' words and obey him perfectly, filling the jars "to the brim."

Mary's words "Do whatever he tells you" are at the heart of today's reading. These words reflect her own interior disposition to do God's will and inspire the servants to give trusting obedience to Christ. May Mary's words encourage us to show our trust in Jesus by promptly obeying him in all things, filling our "jars" in whatever he may ask of us "to the brim."

PRAYER

Imagine being at the wedding at Cana, witnessing Christ's miraculous action and the interaction of his Mother and the wedding servants. You become aware that Mary is speaking to Jesus and pointing to the empty wine jars. You see him go to the servants and give them an order. You watch in amazement as the servants begin to fill the jars with water and then, in complete astonishment, as they draw rich red wine from what was water. Now imagine Mary speaking the same words to you that she gave to the servants: "Do whatever he tells you." If Mary spoke these words directly to you today, to what one area in your life might the call to "do whatever he tells you" apply the most?

RESOLUTION

In your prayer this week, focus on this one specific area where you sense you are supposed to "do whatever he tells you" more obediently. Turn to Jesus and ask for guidance in this area of your life. Lovingly tell him you desire to serve him in this area with the same trusting obedience that Mary and the servants gave him at Cana.
