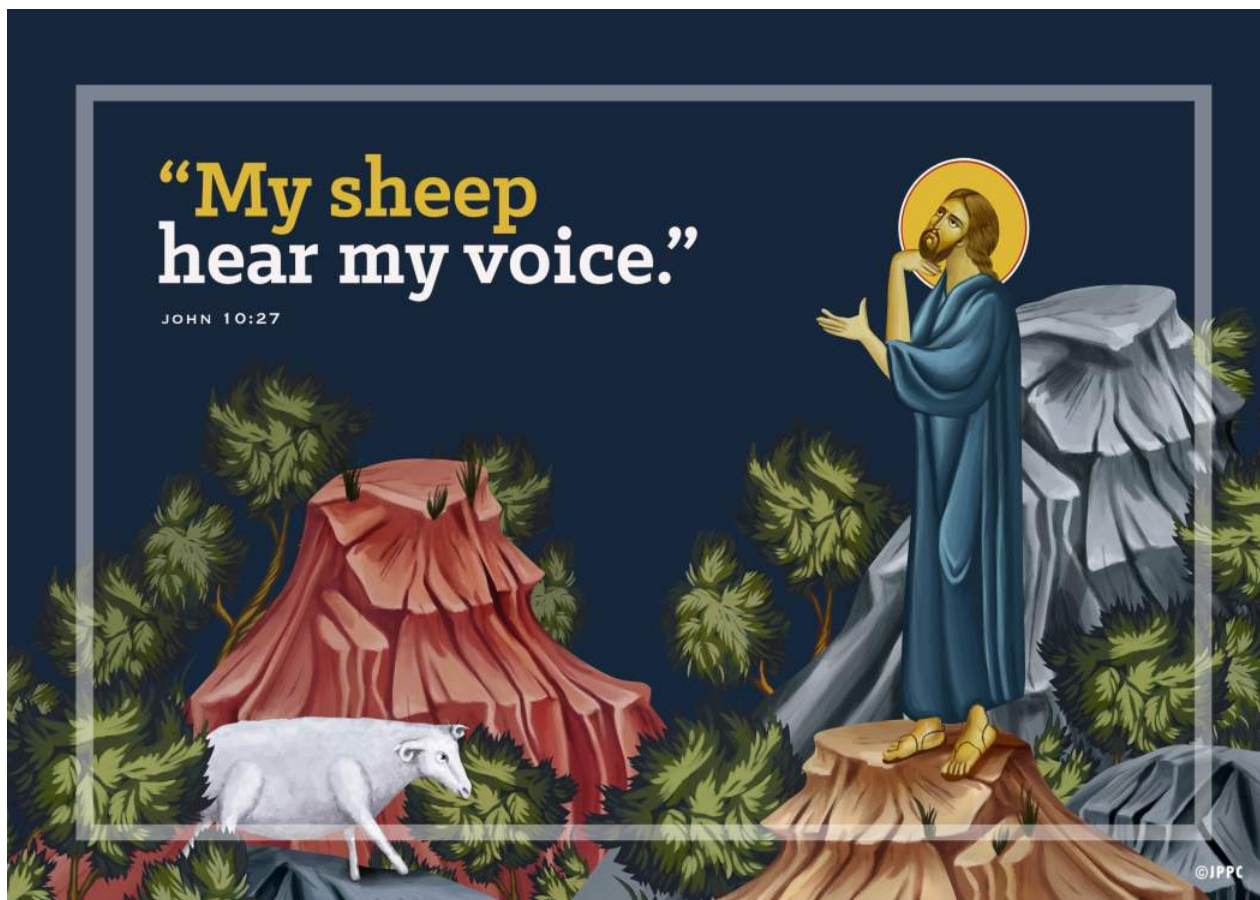

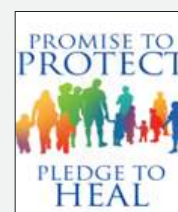

# Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

## Fourth Sunday of Easter (C)

Acts 13:14, 43–52 • Revelation 7:9, 14b–17 • John 10:27–30



## Listen for the Voice of the Shepherd

As I reflect on the simple, powerful statement of Jesus, “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me,” I am struck by the comfort his words bring. Jesus always exemplified what it means to be the faithful Lamb of God, listening intently to his Father’s instructions and carrying out every aspect of his will. Yet this Lamb is also our Shepherd.

God speaks to us regularly, but we are not often in a position to hear him, or we doubt that he speaks to us at all. God created us to speak to him and hear his voice. Do you know what God’s voice sounds like? He longs for you to listen, for he has things to tell you and wants you to walk in his perfect will.

Hearing the Lord’s voice begins with our response to his desire to communicate with us. There are two key aspects to this. It starts in the heart of the Church. We gather to listen to God’s Word, the teachings of the Church, the *Catechism*, the saints, and the Holy Father. This helps us get to know the tone and tenor of our Shepherd’s voice.



Second, we must spend time privately with the Great Shepherd, listening to what he is saying to us personally. But we have busy lives and struggle to find the time to get to know God’s voice.

I urge you to make knowing his voice a goal. Cultivate this through regular church attendance, Confession, and setting aside personal prayer time to be with the One who loves you. It is worth the time to know our Father’s voice.

## Live the Gospel

This week, I invite you to commit to spending fifteen minutes each day in silent prayer, asking God to speak to you through a chosen Scripture verse, such as the Gospel reading for that day’s Mass. Write down any insights you receive. *Lectio divina*, the ancient practice of praying with Scripture, is another excellent way to deepen your connection with God. Choose a Scripture passage daily, meditate on it, and let it sink into your heart.

## Reflections on the Readings for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter—May 11, 2025

### UNITED AS ONE FLOCK

Have you ever watched a herd of animals as they journey toward a destination? It's remarkable that their every move seems to be in sync with the entire group. Whether it's a herd of cows, sheep, or even a flock of geese, the group seems to move as one body. Yet the key aspect that holds these groups together is their willingness to struggle—even suffer—to remain united as one body.

Imagine if Christians were united in this way! Our actions, beliefs, and movements would appear as one body, united in a deeper purpose. By uniting in this way, we would demonstrate our willingness to suffer for each other for the sake of deepening our unity as a body of Christ.

This has always been the call for followers of Christ. Jesus redeemed all of humanity in himself and even commanded his disciples to “be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you” (John 17:21). And yet theological, cultural, and liturgical disputes have often split the Body of Christ from its intended unity.

So how can we achieve a united front? We must not only turn to our eternal good shepherd for guidance, but we must be willing to suffer for our fellow Christians in the hopes of uniting more deeply in Christ's love. This unity will not only draw us closer to each other, but in remaining united we can endure whatever sufferings may come our way, in the hopes that all Christians will be reunited one day with our great king and eternal shepherd.

### PRAYER

Let us begin our time of prayer by placing ourselves in this scene in Jerusalem with Jesus teaching his disciples about following him as the good shepherd. Imagine that Jesus has just said that no one can take his flock out of his hand. How does his willingness to lay down his life for his sheep make him a trustworthy shepherd who will never lose his sheep? Just as Jesus laid down his life for his flock, you now recognize this call extends to you as well. Ask Jesus to show you how you can lay down your life for others, seeking to deepen Christian unity.

### RESOLUTION

With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, choose one or two ways you can sacrificially give of yourself for others this week to deepen the unity of Christ's flock, whether that is in your family, your workplace, your parish, or another community setting. When you do so, offer up your sacrifices (and possibly sufferings) for the unity of all Christians. | [formed.org](http://formed.org)

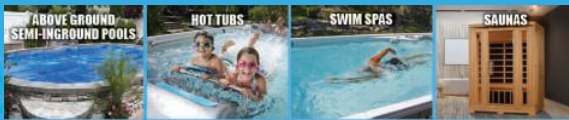

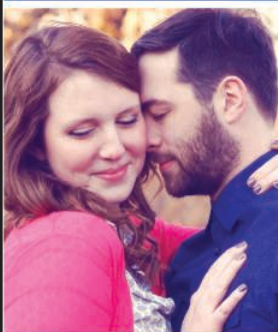
