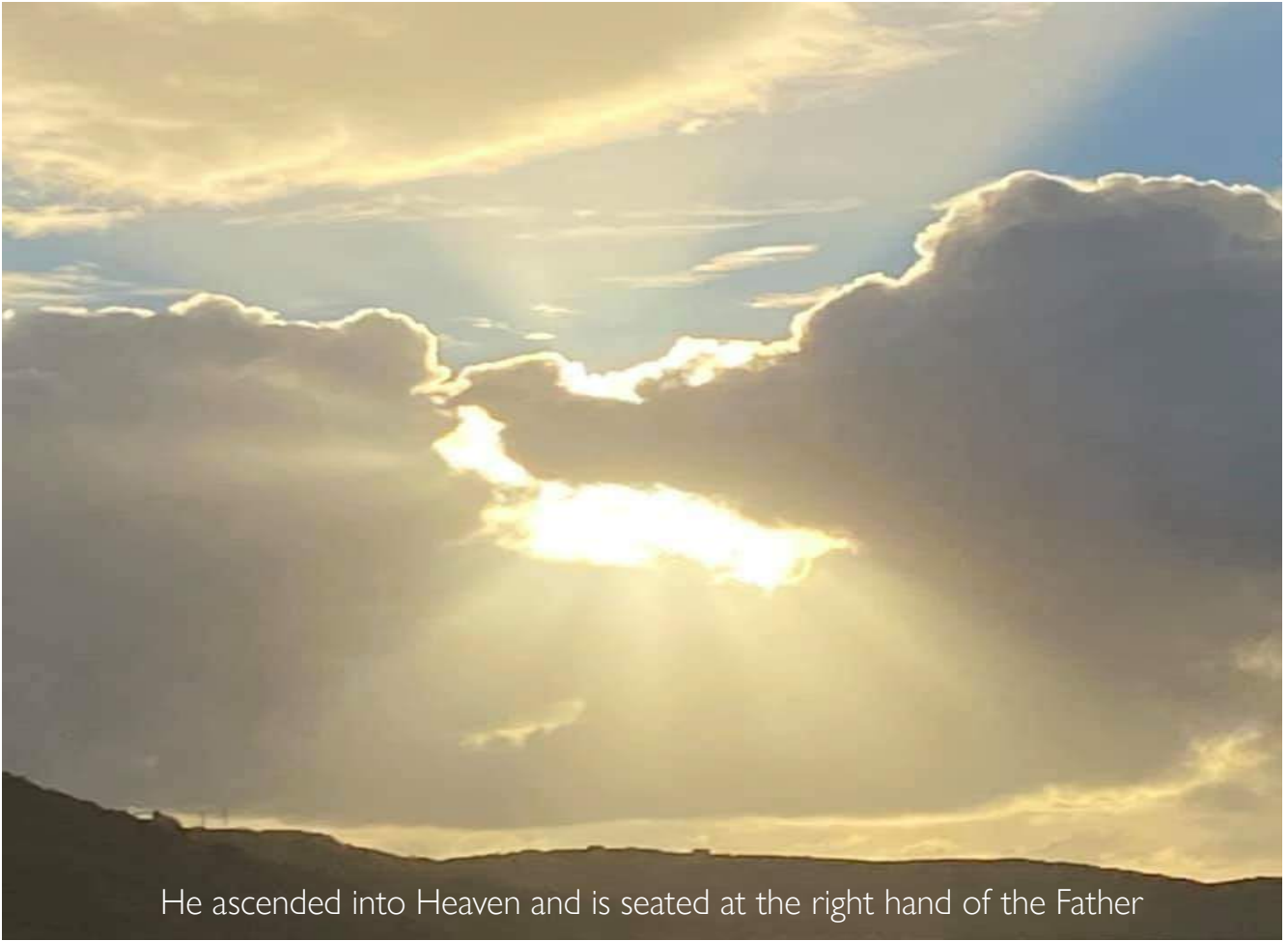

She encouraged and supported adult parishioners in their lifelong learning about their faith by conducting workshops, gatherings, and trainings. Barbara has also produced the parish bulletin for six years, and conducted Baptism preparations and RCIA.

Director of Music **Ernest Rookey** and his guitar have been with the parish since 2004. He has led both the adult and children's choirs, and provided music inside and outside for funerals, sacraments, and special events. Ernie is also a 4th Degree Knight of Columbus and has participated in many charitable projects.

In addition, last summer Ernie and Barbara traveled to Indianapolis in honor of the Church of St. Monica to attend the National Eucharistic Congress along with 65,000 other Catholics from every state and 35 countries.

The Seventh Sunday of Easter

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

The Paschal Mystery culminates in the Ascension of Jesus. After his appearance here on earth in his risen body, and “after giving instructions through the holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen” (Acts 1:2), Jesus “was lifted up and a cloud took him from their sight” (Acts 1:9): Christ’s ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus’ humanity into God’s heavenly domain, whence he will come again (cf. Acts 1:11) . . . Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father’s glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever. Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit. (CCC, nos. 665-667)

Saint of the Week

Boniface

c. 675 – 754
Feast Day—June 5

Boniface, the apostle of Germany, started out as an English monk, a popular teacher, preacher and writer who was ordained at 30. He compiled a Latin grammar and wrote many biblical instructions. But he felt called to missionary work, and in 716 landed in Friesland, now in the Netherlands. After a brief stay, he traveled to Rome, where he received a broad commission to

evangelize central Germany. By 722, he had become bishop of Germany, where he organized the church and secured its ties to Rome. Later, as archbishop of Mainz and papal legate, he was asked to reform the Frankish church. The patron saint of Germany was martyred in Friesland, the missionary territory he revisited in retirement.



“He left his own safe Country to proclaim the Gospel among the Germanic peoples and Franks as a ‘foreigner by God’s will.’ Unafraid and undaunted, not only did he fight against the pagan cults of his time, but he did not even fear hostility when it was a matter of reforming the Christian life that already existed.”

Ascension (C)

Acts 1:1-11 • Ephesians 1:17-23 • Luke 24:46-53



We Are Connected to the Ascension

The Ascension is a pivotal moment in Christ's journey that looks forward to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. After his Resurrection, Jesus instructs his followers to stay in Jerusalem until they are "clothed with power from on high" (Luke 24:49). This promise from the Father signals the arrival of the Holy Spirit, who will empower the early Church to become true witnesses.

There is an innate connection between the Ascension and our own Christian journey, particularly through the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Baptism initiates us into the family of God, cleanses us from sin, and imparts the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity. But this journey is not complete without Confirmation, when the Holy Spirit equips us to become powerful witnesses for Christ. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* beautifully describes this moment as one in which we are "enriched with a special strength" to defend the faith in both word and deed (CCC 1285).

The Ascension marks Jesus' return to the Father and sets the stage for the outpouring of the Spirit. The disciples return to Jerusalem with great joy, anticipating this transformative event. Our own Confirmation should have a similar lasting impact on us. As followers of Christ, we are called to carry the power of the Holy Spirit with us daily, living as true witnesses who boldly proclaim the Gospel—not only through our words but also through our actions. Let this feast, when we celebrate the ascended Christ, remind us of the strength we have received and the mission we are entrusted with!

Live the Gospel

Jeff Cavins says, "Through the Holy Spirit, we are empowered to be true witnesses for Christ. The Apostles were actual witnesses to Our Lord ascending into heaven. Afterward, they dashed joyfully from Bethany back to Jerusalem and awaited the coming of the Holy Spirit, 'continually in the temple praising God' (Luke 24:53). As you await Pentecost, to be celebrated next Sunday, decide how you will talk with someone about your faith, and then set a time for doing just that."

Eternal Access

The Solemnity of the Ascension celebrates the moment when Jesus, fully God and fully man, brought his glorified, resurrected Body into heaven. In doing so, he united his earthly sacrifice with the eternal presence of the Father. This act transformed his once-for-all sacrifice into an offering constantly present to the Father for all eternity, granting us access to his mercy and love through the Eucharist.

The Ascension invites us to reflect on this profound gift. Jesus’ eternal offering reminds us that we are no longer distant from God but are invited into a personal and transformative relationship with him. We are called to approach the Father with confidence, knowing that Christ’s sacrifice has made this access possible.

Reflections on the Readings for The Ascension of the Lord - June 1, 2025

I WILL BE WITH YOU ALWAYS

Imagine you have spent an incredible three years with your best friend. Then one day, everything changes. He tells you that he is going to leave you and won't be coming back. He gives you advice on how to live without him, reassures you of his love, and then disappears. How would you feel? The pain would almost be unbearable. That seems to be the exact situation the disciples of Jesus faced in today's Gospel reading. Can you imagine how difficult this situation was for them to see Jesus ascend to heaven and how confusing their task ahead appeared to be?

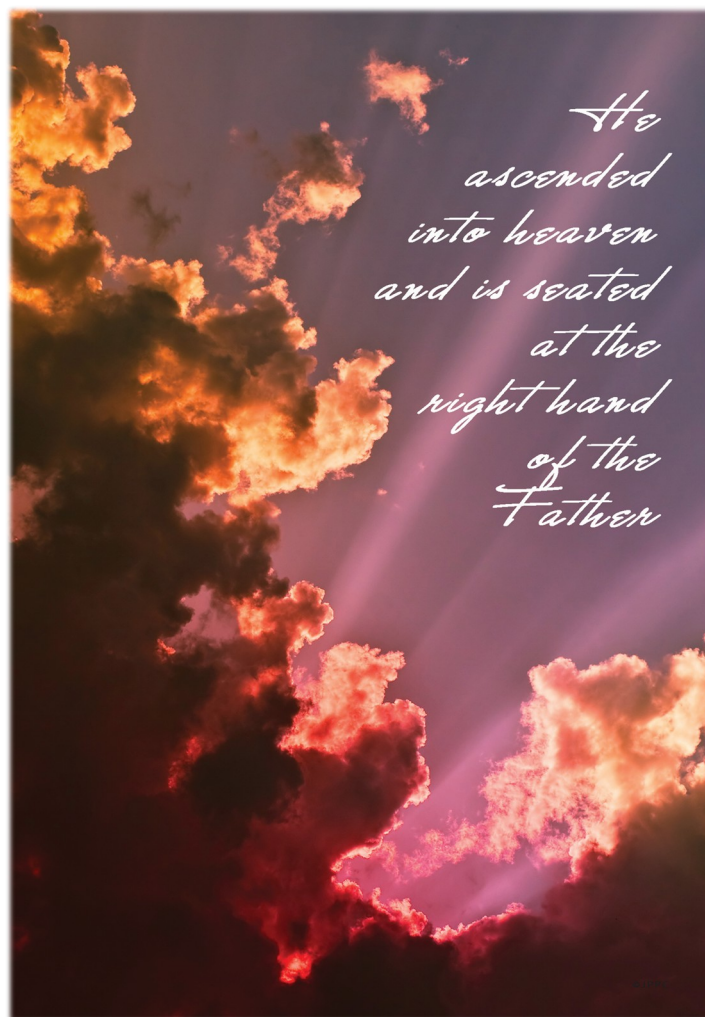
And yet, Jesus promised them—and he promises us all—that he would never abandon us. Though he ascended to the Father in heaven, Jesus does not leave his disciples alone. He gives all Christians his Holy Spirit, to be our guide and eternal friend. Moreover, he shows them what their reward will be if they remain faithful. Just as Jesus ascends to the Father, so too will we fully enter into God's life if we remain faithful to his promises.

PRAYER

Place yourself in the position of one of Christ's followers. You've been with Jesus for forty days. Now he tells you it's time for him to leave. You go out into the countryside and watch as he rises into the sky, and soon disappears. What sorts of emotions are you experiencing? Are you afraid? sad? Now recall that just before he left, he promised never to abandon you, and he assured you that help would soon come in the form of the Holy Spirit. Now how do you feel? What would you say to the people around you? As you walk back to the town, what might you talk about?

RESOLUTION

Just as the disciples were given a great mission to spread Christ's kingdom to the ends of the earth, so too does each of us carry a unique mission through the power of the Holy Spirit. This week ask God to show you what this mission is in your life, and choose one small way that you can carry out your mission as a follower of Christ.



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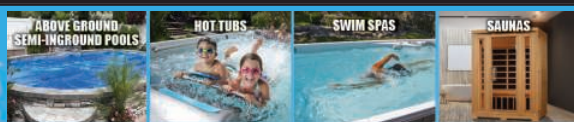
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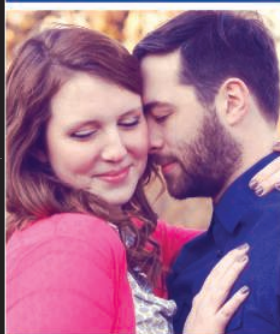
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
