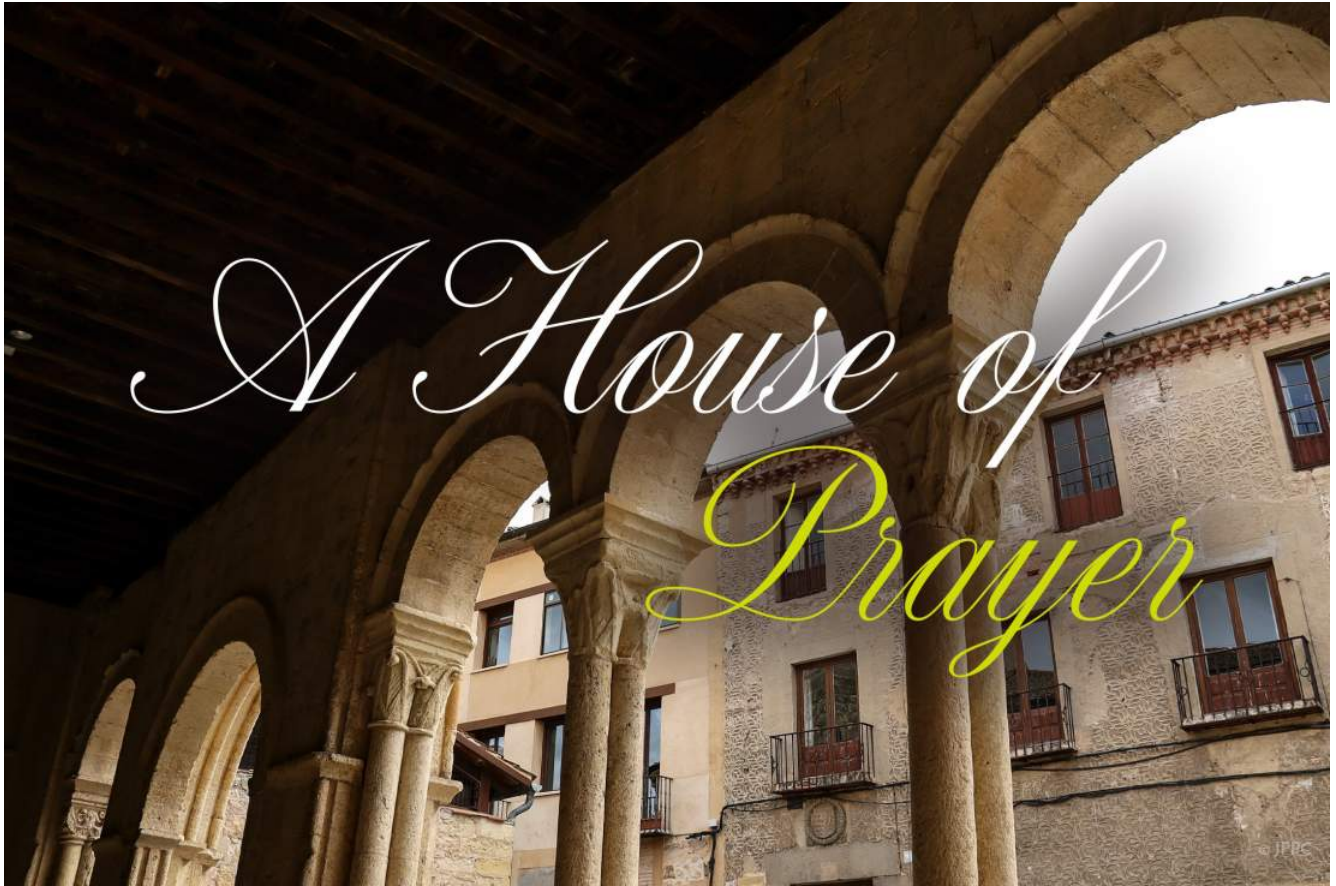

Reflection

Traffic being manageable, if not kind, I can get to it in under two hours from where I live now. It sits well shaded by trees that were once just past sapling stage. The street it sits on seems somehow smaller than when I was also small. Its present owners have put their touches on it, with a graceful arch now placed over the front patio my dad had installed. If it could speak, you would hear a collection of stories about my mom and dad, and Uncle Ed, and about my sisters, my brother and me, embracing a range of emotions from laughter to tears and everything in between. Even now I am happy to display a painting of it in the house I now call home. I refer, of course, to the house in which I grew up.

We should not be surprised that our Church celebrates the historic building in which she grew up. Such a celebration might appear puzzling at first. After all, have we here on earth “no lasting city.” Why celebrate a building?



In response, allow me to say that St. John Lateran marks a distinct moment in Church history. The original structure was built on land donated by the wealthy Laterani family to the Christian Church newly freed from persecution by the emperor Constantine and made the official religion of the empire.

We really are also celebrating fellow believers like us, from long ago and far away, who took their belief in Jesus Christ seriously enough as to have faced potential martyrdom up to this time.

The actual anniversary of the dedication of this special church dates to November 9, of the year 324 A.D. It remains to this day as the location of the episcopal chair of the pope as the bishop of Rome, just as the cathedral of your diocese houses your bishop's official chair of office.

Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. Since then, the basilica has been the site of five ecumenical councils. Beneath its high altar rests the remains of the small wooden table on which, according to tradition, St. Peter celebrated the Mass. Its ceiling features gold that came from the new world of the Americas.

Yet, for all its Roman grandeur, we must always remember that our faith is not dependent on real estate. Rather, does it stand founded on the faith of ordinary folk like us? I would like to call that a “Cathedral of the Caring.” One built to honor Jesus as a loving Savior. We can proudly celebrate the dedication of the St. John Lateran Basilica not just as revered real estate, but as a visible symbol of something more profound, and with beauty everlasting. One with prime location in the City of God.

God love you and give you, His peace.

What is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica?

Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. Saint John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake, and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes were consecrated. In the 14th century when the papacy returned to Rome from Avignon, the church and the adjoining palace were found to be in ruins. The Lateran Basilica is known as the "Mother of all the Churches of Rome and of the world," as inscribed in Latin on the basilica's facade. It is thus ranked first and most important of the four major basilicas in Rome, as well, and, owing to its preeminence, it is also uniquely an archbasilica.



Unlike the commemorations of other Roman churches, this anniversary is a feast. The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. In a sense, St. John Lateran is the parish church of all Catholics, because it is the pope's cathedral. This church is the spiritual home of the people who are the Church. There are two uses of the name basilica (from the Greek *basileus* – king). One is the honor given to a church by designation of the pope; the other is an architectural style based on the design of the ancient Roman law courts.

Historically, the ancient use preceded the Church's use. The basilicas were designed to serve as the place where the emperor's representative sat and judged. They were rectangular in shape with a central nave, at the end of which was a rounded area, the apse, in which the judge sat. Typically, there were two side aisles separated from the nave by columns. Many basilicas were given over to Church use by Constantine, as they were suitable for the public celebration of Mass. Many of these original basilicas survive, and new churches are still made in this style.

The pope, however, is the only one who can name a basilica in the honorific sense. The title is given to churches of significance to the universal Church, to a country, or even to a diocese. There are more than 1,800 basilicas in the world, with 85 in the United States. In Rome there are four major basilicas, the only ones in the Church, and numerous minor basilicas. The four *major basilicas* are also called *papal basilicas* and historically were called *patriarchal basilicas*. The Holy Father can designate a church as a basilica based on the church's history or architecture. Once a church is named a basilica, this is a permanent title.
