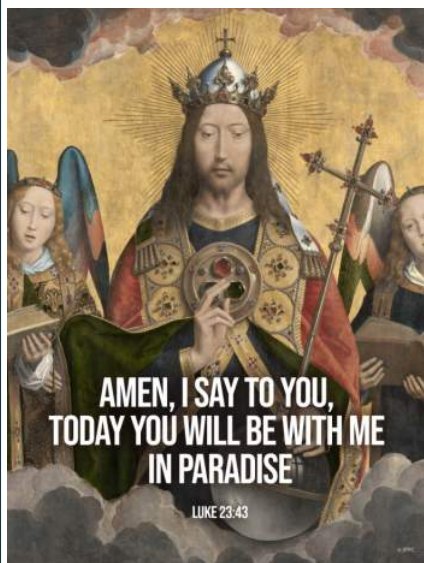
Reflection

Most of our information about kings reveals them as powerful figures, dressed lavishly and in definite control of the situation. They are rarely portrayed as less. Our American fascination with royalty seems so out of place in this context because our beloved country came into being as a revolt against a king.

Even though we have the image of power and majesty given us about kings (and queens) by way of art, sculpture and literature, we disagree with life under a monarch that is not of our choosing. Freedom seems shackled.

That is hardly the picture given us by God of our true King as found in the Holy Gospels. In fact, nearly all the depictions of the King of kings, Christ Jesus Our Lord are those of a humble poor man wearing a seamless robe most likely made by His mother. His most significant decision was to accept the cruel death of a Roman crucifixion.



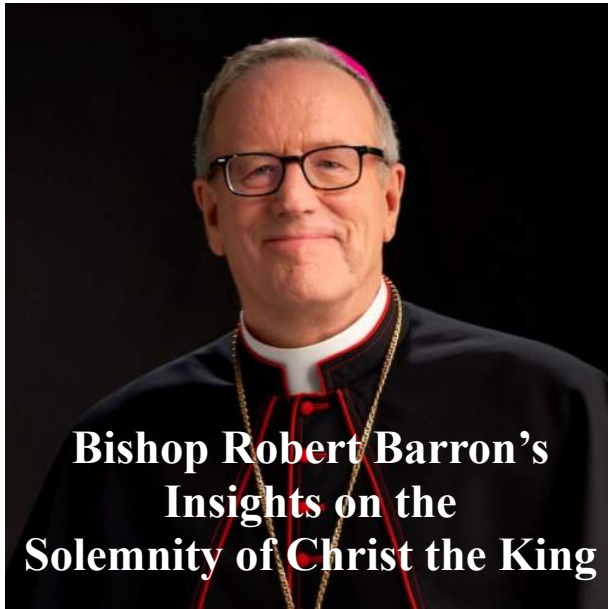
Admittedly, we have other memorable images. The calm beauty of the "Good Shepherd" for example. Or the Leonardo Da Vinci masterpiece of a loving Master at the Last Supper. Not to forget what Michelangelo painted for us of Christ as the supreme Judge at the end of the world visible behind the altar on the wall of the Sistine chapel.

But the image we find most available; the one we pray before most often, and the one that graces all our churches and makes them so easily identifiable is that of the crucified Lord. After all, even before He came among us, in those glorious days "when Jesus walked" He was named at His very presentation the Temple as a "Sign of Contradiction." Yet, when this Sunday rolls around, the last of the current Liturgical Year, we always celebrate Jesus as "the King of the Universe."

When you step back from all the usual constructs about royalty, you begin to understand that Jesus Christ is royalty in its highest form. It is one of having devoted followers, of minds and hearts swept up in a bond of love strong enough to outlast centuries of counting. "King of Hearts" we might call Him, with no reference to a card game. His steadfast love for us is the main reason why we can wake up each morning, believing ourselves so loved that we can handle whatever life throws our way with confidence. If that does not qualify as a component of true royalty, then I do not know another.

May this King give you His peace, now and always.

"Then Pilate said to Him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice.'" John 18



Bishop Robert Barron's Insights on the Solemnity of Christ the King

Friends, today we celebrate the feast of Christ the King, instituted in 1925 by Pope Pious XI. And though the very notion of kingship is rather alien to us, the metaphor should remain. For the whole idea is that Christ must become the Lord of our lives, the one to whom an absolute submission is required.

Things do become a bit easier to take when we see precisely what kind of king Jesus Christ is. Bottom line: we are not dealing with another Napoleon or Caesar Augustus; just the contrary. We are dealing with the one who rightly reigns over those earthly potentates but who bears very little resemblance to them.

Our first clue as to his identity comes from the Gospel for today, an account of Jesus' conversation with the Roman governor Pontius Pilate, who asks, "Are you the King of the Jews?" And Jesus responds that his kingdom "does not belong to this world."

So what precisely is his kingship? Worldly kingship has to do primarily with power and self-aggrandizement. But the kingship that Jesus represents is a ruling ordered to the truth. Its purpose is to guide people to the truth, which is another way of saying toward God.

The popes wanted to say there is no human figure to whom our final allegiance is due, rather Christ is King. It's not so much a valorization of Kingship politically. It's a way of saying the deepest allegiance of our heart always belongs to Christ and not any earthly ruler. It means that all earthly rulers; all Presidents, Prime Ministers, Kings, whatever, are under the judgement of God. And this brings the feast very much in line with Biblical intuitions.

There were indeed Kings in Ancient Israel but they were under the judgement of God. I think friends it's a permanent value of this feast. Whenever we feel tempted to say my total allegiance belongs to this person or this party or this culture, this feast day says "NO, Christ alone is King."
