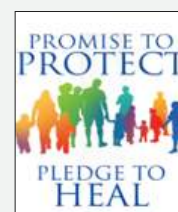

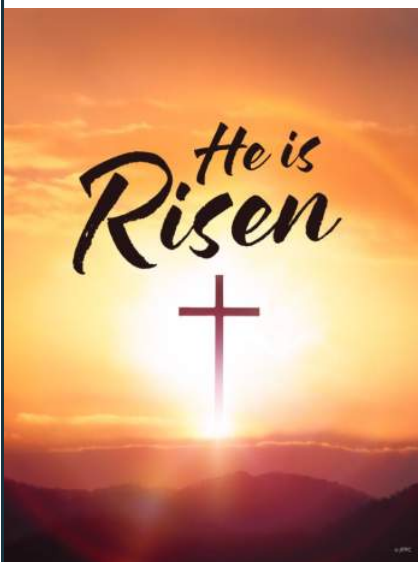


# Reflection

The arrival of "AI" in our world, particularly its proven ability to fool our eyes into believing that what we are seeing is reality when all along it is artificial, can make us doubtful observers. That has the cumulative effect of turning us all into being suspicious types.

What has this to do with Easter 2026? I would suggest that the doubts or the denial that non-believers have all along professed about Jesus' resurrection could be bolstered if they are strong "AI" converts, acting mostly on emotion.



Meanwhile, the collection of witness statements that we will be hearing and reading about in our bibles for the next 50 days are too real and strong to deny. The fact that the Apostles and many early disciples faced death rather than deny what they believed is more proof, if you happen to need any.

What is left to us is an application of a principle usually attributed to one Steven Covey. He wrote this: "The main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing." It is a powerful reminder to focus on our highest priorities. We must avoid distractions and dedicate energy to what truly matters for achieving our goals, whether in leadership, or personal development or Christian spirituality. It means identifying our core objective (life with Christ forever in heaven) and constantly re-aligning our efforts with it (e.g., making regular Confession), rather than getting sidetracked by less important tasks.

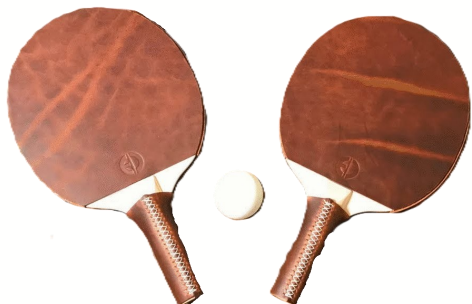
To cite just one example. We have noise of all kinds that distract us from "the main thing." It interferes with our time to reflect 24/7/365. We must work to get it back.

So, on this special Sunday, we need to be putting side bunny rabbits and all sorts of cute verses about the coming of Spring. Here is the main thing: "Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God, who was crucified and died for the remission of our sins, was also raised from the dead on the Third Day by God the Father, never to die again." This is the Day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

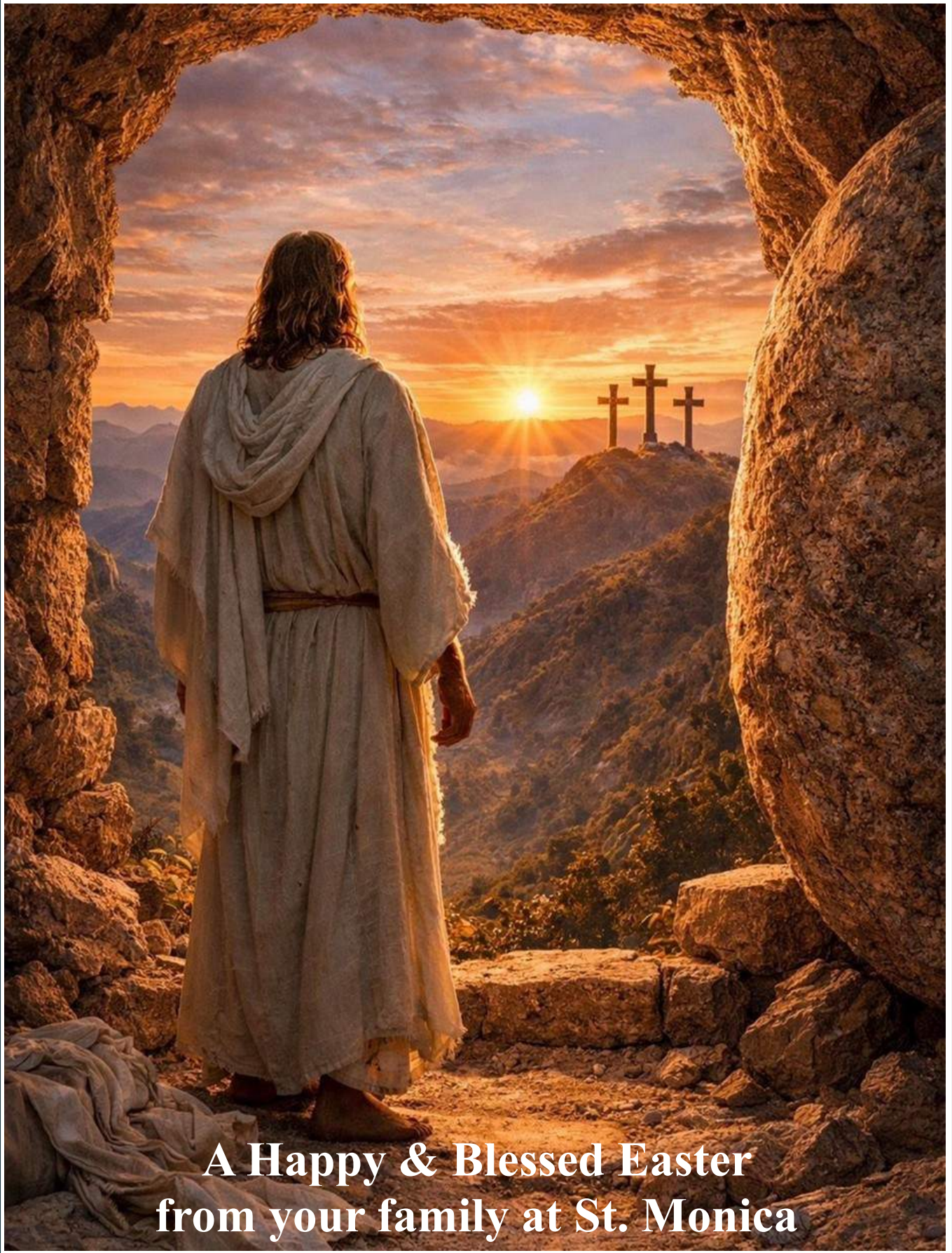

**A Happy & Blessed Easter

**Bishop Robert Barron  
on Easter Sunday**

This is the great day. This is the day of days. Everything else in Christian life flows from the resurrection of Jesus, and flows back to it. I've often said, when the first Christians came to preach, this is what they preached, Jesus risen from the dead. Easter is our day. And the church asks us every Easter Sunday to meditate upon this magnificent passage in the 20th chapter of John's Gospel.

Listen to how it begins. Early in the morning, on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away.

Throughout the Gospel of John, we see the theme of Jesus as the recreator of a world that had gone wrong through sin. Jesus repeating and recapitulating the great creative work of the God described in Genesis. So here, early in the morning, on the first day of the week, we're at the beginning. It's still dark, John tells us, like it was before the creation of light. And God said in Genesis, let there be light, and now a light is going to shine. The light of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, which is the recreation of the world.

So Jesus' body is placed in a tomb, placed on a shelf within this tomb, and then a great stone is rolled across to keep the animals and robbers and so on out. This mighty stone would take several men to move it in place. What's this stand for? It stands for the finality of death. This great stone that nobody could move. Death is final. It's absolute.

It's the end. When somebody dies, when a loved one dies, the reason we grieve is that we have this deep conviction that we will never see them again. That somehow a barrier has been established that we cannot cross.

It's as though a stone has been rolled across, blocking us permanently from this person. The stone stands, if you will, not just for grief, but it stands for this existential frustration that we feel in the presence of death. And so it's been moved.

God opens our graves and he has us rise from them. He rolls back the stone, symbolizing the terrible facticity of death. Yes, the great grave robber has been at work.

Peter arrives, huffing and puffing and looks in the tomb and sees the burial cloths. Listen now how it's described. He did not enter, but bent down to peer in and saw the wrappings lying on the ground.

Simon Peter came along behind him and he entered the tomb. He observed the wrappings that had covered the head not lying with the other wrappings, but rolled up in a place by itself. Why this odd detail? First of all, to me, it signals the eyewitness quality of this story. But secondly they're noticing the odd way that these cloths are lying.

The implication of this story is that the burial cloths were lying undisturbed and the napkin that had been around his head was rolled up neatly and placed in another place. When they see this, they believe. Let me put it one step further. It is an indisputable fact that what's being witnessed to is the bodily resurrection of Jesus from the dead. What's being declared here is that Jesus rose bodily from the dead and is living a new and transformed life, making that life available to us, his followers. New life, a new embodied life made possible through God's grace. Somehow, everything they'd ever thought about the world had to be rethought. Everything they'd ever imagined as basic had to be re-imagined.

He didn't appear to Pontius Pilate, didn't appear to Herod, didn't appear to all of his persecutors. How come Jesus appeared only to some, only to a few? John Henry Newman said it's because he appeared for the sake of mission. And this announcement would happen through the punchy and clear quality of this small group. So on this Easter Sunday, let us be aware of the fact that Jesus is giving us the same mission. We who eat and drink and gather for the liturgy, we're eating and drinking with the risen Christ. He appears to us, so to speak, for the same purpose. That we might be galvanized in this mission to announce this startling fact, Jesus risen from the dead, which changes everything. Changes the way you think, live, see, act. Changes the hope that you have for this embodied and transformed spiritual life on high. Announce it today. Announce it for the rest of your life. That's the call of Easter. And God bless you all.
