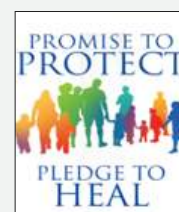

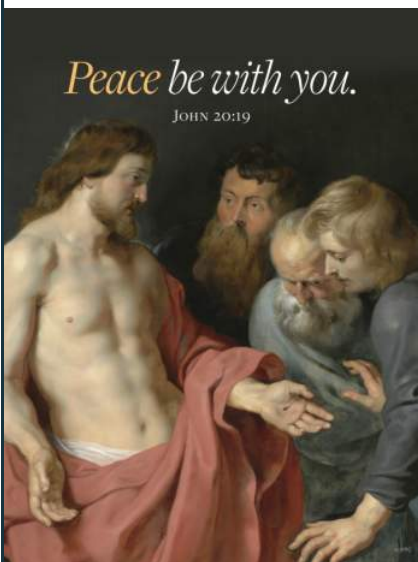

Reflection

Most of us have a favorite movie or TV show. Often enough there's a line or two that stands out and instantly connects us with it that can range from the sublime to the silly. Case in point: St. Thomas More's retort to a cynical Cardinal Wolsey in the Robert Bolt play *A Man for All Seasons*: "When statesmen forget their own private conscience for the sake of their public duties, they lead their country by a short route to chaos." How often do I think of that line when I hear elected officials avoid a thorough condemnation of abortion!



As for the silly, there's a famous nonsense question asked by Igor in the Mel Brooks farce about *Frankenstein* "What hump?" As if to deny his deformity.

All of this is prelude for me to suggest that in today's Gospel selection from John's gospel, wherein the beautiful story of St. Thomas and his reactions to the Resurrection is told to us. Thomas ultimately meets the living Jesus face to face. I can imagine him very embarrassed, having touched the Lord's bodily scars, and then slowly kneeling before Jesus. Then come his immortal words: "My Lord and my God!" Scripture scholars rightly claim that one sentence is the climactic moment of John's whole gospel. Capturing the essential point. Inviting us to draw the same conclusion about the identity of Jesus.

St. Thomas' phrase lingers in my everyday prayer at Mass, because I learned that those are the words we should say as the Sacred Host is raised by the priest at the Consecration of the Mass. The risen Christ is with us then, under the unlikely appearance of a plain piece of unleavened bread!

Pope St. John Paul II designated this Second Sunday of Easter as "Divine Mercy Sunday." It was to underscore the basis of Christian optimism. Only by and through God's merciful love do we have any hope of heaven. As we strive to live our lives as His faithful disciples, we need to remember this truth and never turn to prideful thinking that we cause our own salvation. Everything ultimately depends on this divine mercy.

Considering the matter of memorable lines from well-loved sources, allow me to add one more given to us by St. Augustine in his classical "Confessions." It too makes for a great prayer: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

God love you and give you His Easter peace.

Divine Mercy





**Bishop Robert Barron
on Divine Mercy Sunday**

Peace be with you, friends. We are continuing our celebration of the Easter season on this second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Thomas Aquinas says mercy is compassion in regard to someone else's suffering.

In John's Gospel, the account of the risen Jesus appearing to his disciples begins on the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews.

They were afraid for their lives, and there they are, cowering, because they know the next move of the authorities could well be to track them down, crucify them. They symbolize here, everybody, all of us in our fear. So take whatever it is that frightens you right now.

What are you afraid of? In terms of your family, or your career, or your health, or whatever it is, and then move into the space of the disciples. They're locked in fear, unable to move. Well, that's all of us, to some degree.

But despite the locked doors, Jesus came and stood in their midst. The risen Christ is more powerful than our fear, more powerful than anything that frightens us. That's the good news of Easter, the good news of Christianity.

On the cross, we look right in the face of all those things that frighten us. And in the resurrection, we know that God's love is more powerful than any of those. So he breaks through the locked doors of our fear.

He said to them, Peace be with you and Shalom. It means peace. Shalom is what God has always wanted to give his people. And Jesus speaks this word to them.

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. In other words, his wounds. Now, this is the combination that's so important to get right, because if it gets out of balance, we're gonna miss the spiritual power here. Jesus shows them his wounds. That means he's showing them their own sin. The Lord of life came, and we killed him. In the wounds of Jesus, we see our own dysfunction. But then we hear shalom. We killed God, but God returned in forgiving love.

See, who are those who suffer but all of us sinners? We see in the wounds of Jesus, in a way, our own woundedness, our own sin. And in answer to that sin, we hear the word shalom. That's the divine mercy.

As the Father has sent me, so I send you. And then he breathed on them and said, receive the Holy Spirit. He's been sent into the world as an agent of God's mercy.

Now, the extraordinary truth is that same Christ breathes on us. That means he gives us the Holy Spirit and now sends us into the world with the same mission. What if you woke up and said, my goal today is to be an agent of the divine mercy. To bring the shalom of God to places where people suffer. That is the Christian life. That is discipleship. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them.

Now, just a last-minute reflection on the next part of the story, which is about doubting Thomas. How come Thomas didn't believe? Well, because he was outside the church. What allows us to see and experience the risen Lord? It's our solidarity with our brothers and sisters in the church. In the wounds of Jesus, we see our own sin. So he doesn't discourage Thomas there. He encourages him.

The wounds followed by the Shalom. And with that, Thomas gives voice to the greatest confession of faith in the New Testament. He kneels down. That's the sign of worship. And he says, my Lord and my God. He's the prophet, he's teacher, he's healer, he's even Messiah. But it's Thomas who probed the wounds of Jesus and heard the Shalom, who gives the greatest profession of faith in the scriptures. So can I say a word here to the doubters out there? If you're like Thomas, maybe he's a patron saint for you. Don't give up. But allow that doubt perhaps to lead you to a deeper encounter with Christ. We're like the disciples in the upper room. Don't lose heart. Jesus can come through locked doors and windows and walls.

That's our hope. That is the expression of the divine mercy, God's compassion for us precisely in our suffering. That's what this gospel is meant to make us feel. And may God Bless you all.
