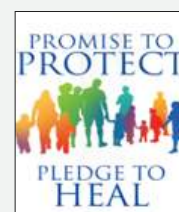

Reflection

It's a given, I believe, that a trip of any kind is best experienced with a trusted and beloved friend rather than with, say, an acquaintance of a lesser "vintage." I believe that is especially true when the trip comes after a major disappointment or setback. Such was the case when we read about a trip on the road to Emmaus. Cleopas, an early member of the Church, was walking with his unnamed friend. Both deal with sadness.

They decided to leave the scene of their great let down. That came with the death of their hero. A man they trusted with their whole heart and soul. He had been tortured and executed on a Roman cross, the worst punishment that regime had devised for common criminals.



Suddenly they are joined by another traveler, who seems blissfully unaware of last week's event. But then this Stranger starts to unpack the Scriptures in a way the other two men had never heard.

As sunset approaches, the two invite the Stranger to dinner, when it came time for the breaking of the bread, they recognized Jesus immediately. Just as suddenly as He had first appeared, He was gone! What a happening! The conversion effect was wonderful. Suddenly the two travelers became evangelists!

There is much to "unpack" in this appealing story. A Bible study group has enough material for several sessions. A preacher could "wax eloquent" and at length after his research

Allow me to pull just one phrase out of St. Luke's colorful narrative. It's the one traveler's question to his companion: "Were not our hearts burning within us as He opened the Scriptures?" Of course they were. This was the greatest bible study they would ever hear! It was wonderful and consoling at the same time. An excitement about future possibilities that flooded their minds as they listened.

Such is the invitation we receive for renewal of our spirit each week at Mass. The Scriptures are always a reminder of the incomparable love of God for us as conveyed by the Spirit.

It's true that sometimes in life we feel unloved or forgotten by God. Life can pack a lot of disappointment in just seven days. So, as we fellow travelers make our way through life, we need to hear that wonderful voice giving us a guarantee. "I am with you all days, until the consummation of the world."

God love you and give you His Easter peace.

**Bishop Robert Barron
on Divine Mercy Sunday**

Peace be with you, friends. For this third Sunday of Easter, we read once again the story of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. You know this story, it's such a masterpiece. It's about something that happened long ago, yes, but it's also about the church now.

So the two disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus. They're walking the wrong way. Everything in Luke, everything in the Gospels moves toward Jerusalem, the city of the cross and the resurrection, the sending of the Spirit. It's where everything's happening. Yet these two are walking the wrong way.

Well, that's all of us, most of the time, heading in the wrong direction and as it happened, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. How many times in your life has Jesus walked with you, but you didn't recognize him? I just think of, gosh, in my life, all the people from my parents and teachers and coaches and friends who, at decisive moments, set a new direction for me. Who were they? Well, they were Christ, even though I was prevented from recognizing him. Christ using people as secondary causes. At the first level, Jesus says to the 2, okay, tell me what happened, they recount accurately enough all the data about Jesus, right? Prophet, mighty in deed and word before God and all the people. Our chief priests handed him over to a sentence of death, crucified him. We were hoping he'd be the redeemer of Israel, but he's not. But then, besides all this, it's the third day, and some women in our group have astonished us with a tale of his resurrection from the dead.

It's exactly where they are now with Jesus. They have the data, but they don't have the pattern. And see, doesn't he himself say that? How foolish you are. Well, what makes them foolish? Not because their eyes weren't open, they did see all these things, but they didn't understand it

What was he talking about when he took them through all that referred to him in the scriptures? I don't know, but I bet he talked about Adam, the first man, and the Messiah, Jesus, is the first man of the new creation. I bet he talked about Noah. Noah builds the ark, allows him to survive during the great flood of sin. And so Jesus is the new Noah, and on that great ship we find salvation. I bet he talked about Abraham, our father in faith. I bet he spoke about Jacob, Isaac's son. Jacob, who puts his head on an unlikely pillow, this rock, and then he dreams of a ladder connecting heaven and earth and angels ascending and descending upon it.

Didn't Jesus say, you'll see greater things? You'll see angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man. I bet he spoke of the Messiah as the true ladder connecting heaven and earth. I bet he talked about Moses, the lawgiver who brought the law down from Sinai. Jesus, the lawgiver, who from the mount of the Sermon on the Mount brings forth a new law. Moses, who brought his people out of slavery into freedom.

Jesus brings them from the slavery of sin to the freedom of the sons and daughters of God. I bet he spoke to them of David. David, the great king, who united the tribes. I bet he spoke about Jonah. Jonah would spend three days in the belly of the fish. Didn't Jesus say, this generation wants a sign. The only sign it'll get is a sign from the Son of Man who would spend three days in the belly of the earth. They said Lord, stay with us. And so he sits down at a table and he breaks the bread and says the blessing and gives it to them, the great Eucharistic gesture. And in that moment, they get it. But what is the Eucharist, the sacramental representation of the cross. This is my body given for you. This is my blood poured out for you.

In the breaking of the bread, in the sacrament, in the Eucharist, that's when they get him. That's when they understand what his suffering means. That's when they got him. Can you see now, my fellow Catholics, every time we attend the Mass in the liturgy of the Word we read these stories and we understand these people, we listen to them again, our hearts are burning within us because the Bible is providing the template. But then we move to the liturgy of the Eucharist and we replicate this same gesture of Jesus.

Now that they get him, the 2 go back to Jerusalem. At the end of Mass, once we've taken in the word, once we've taken in the Eucharist, we get him. The priest or the deacon or the bishop says, now go, the Mass has ended. Go. to love and serve the Lord. Go in peace. Go out into the world now with the great message of who Jesus is.
