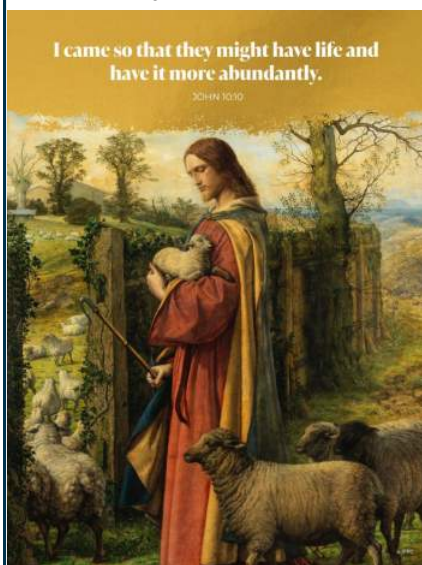
Reflection

Any holder of seaside property knows that he or she has an obligation to respect the laws of shifting tides and occasional flooding. Neglecting either would prove to be foolish. So, he or she wisely makes sure the house is built solidly on rock, or perhaps on strong piers rising from the sand high enough to escape damage.

The whole strategy can easily become a metaphor for our spiritual lives, which must have a firm foundation upon Christ as our Rock, or on the strong piers of belief and trust, enabling us to rise above any contemporary threat or cultural deviation.

Our modern Western culture follows upon two millennia's worth of threats to belief—a veritable stockpile of weapons, if you will—arising either from within or, at other times, from without the Church. From within, we can cite heresies that have plagued our community from its earliest days. God chose great saints, holy men and women, who used their prayer-driven insights and called upon heroic courage to fight these enemies of truth and lead the Church to new positions of strength. Often, they were obvious errors, like denying Christ's divinity despite the Scriptural proclamation.



Today, I believe the threats are more subtle. They cloak themselves in comfortable disguises so that they look just like good common sense. Take materialism, for example—the misguided belief that being rich is the way to true happiness. Most of the people in the advertising universe seem young and energetic and bursting with happiness as they hold a certain product in their hands. Or perhaps they are more mature and tell us about investments that have made them comfortable and worry-free. Just one false tenet of a fake joy.

So we must be vigilant. We must know Christ's teachings, which are the same as Church teachings, and hold to them when these "storms" come along. As the old hymn reminds us, time and time again: "The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ the Lord."

I don't understand electricity, but I'm no fool. I'm not going to sit around in the dark until I do. The same is true of salvation. I don't fully understand how God could become man, how He could die as the basis for my forgiveness, or how He could give you and me a new life. But only a fool would ignore such a great opportunity to build a life upon it just because he didn't understand it.

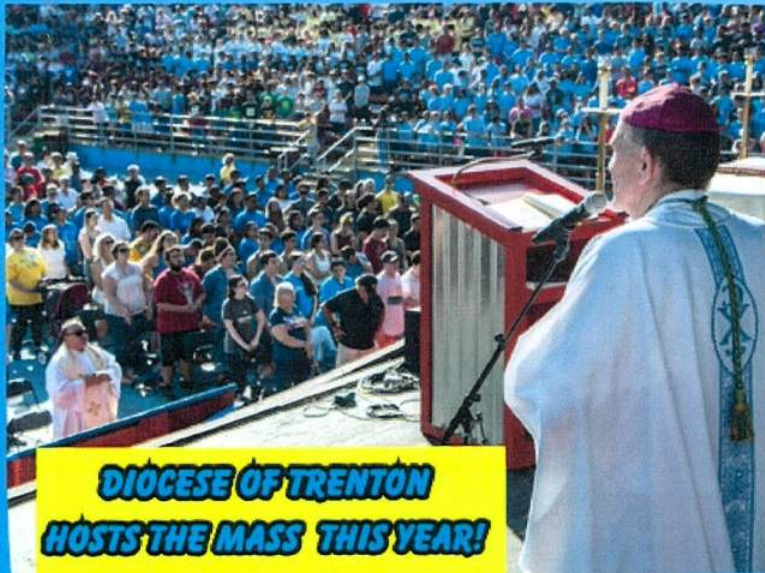

Bishop Robert Barron
5th Sunday of Easter
Dwelling Place of God

Peace be with you, friends. On this fifth Sunday of Easter, we have these marvelous readings that are linked in a really interesting way, but I think you've got to be attentive to a somewhat hidden theme that runs like a golden thread through them, and the theme is the Temple. The Temple in Jerusalem was the focal point of Jewish life.

Reading one is from the Acts of the Apostles. The first part of it is all about the choosing of deacons. Well, the priests, these early, early figures, understood that, the link between what they were doing in the Temple and what Jesus accomplished. Now, listen to reading two, which is from First Letter of Peter.

Peter, who would have been, you know, intimately aware of the Temple and its workings, he says, Beloved, come to him, Christ, a living stone rejected by human beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God. Well, I submit to you, the stone being referred to here is the cornerstone of the Temple, rejected by men but made by God the cornerstone of the true Temple, this place of right praise. Now, you say, well, wait a minute, why would you automatically think he's talking about the Temple? Well, listen to what comes right after.

So, come to Jesus, the stone chosen by God, and then listen, let yourselves be built like living stones into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. Now, that couldn't be any clearer. So, Christ is the cornerstone.

Ah, now the attentive reader will remember in the Gospel of John when Jesus says, I'm going to tear down this old Temple and in three days rebuild it, referring to the Temple of his body. Now, we understand what the church is. We understand what those priests, those early Temple priests understood, that in Jesus and his church, the work of the Temple is brought to fulfillment.

Now, what does this mean? The Temple was the place where God and humanity came together, where the human sacrifice was offered to God and the divine grace accepted that sacrifice and a reconciliation between God and humanity was effected. That's what the Temple meant. It was a kind of tristing place between divinity and humanity where a ruptured relationship was healed. We, embodying our relationship to Christ to the wider world, now serve to bring people to the Lord.

What's a priest? A priest offers sacrifice. What does sacrifice do? It reconciles divinity and humanity. Every baptized person is priest, prophet, and king. What do we do as members of the church? We tell the world, we prophesize, we speak the divine word to draw people into a relationship with the Lord. There it is. We're the temple, we're the temple, the place of right praise.

All right, so reading one, the priest. Reading two, the church is being built up on the cornerstone of Christ into an edifice of living stones. Now, the gospel.

Jesus, on the night before he dies, addresses his disciples and says, do not let your hearts be troubled, but have faith in God and faith also in me. Why? In my father's house, there are many dwelling places. What's the father's house? Most early Jews would say the temple. That's where the God of Israel dwells. But now wait, the Jerusalem temple, the temple of the church, the edifice of living stones, both of those are finally symbolic of and anticipations of the truest temple, which is what? Heaven.

The Holy Spirit is the love that connects the Father and the Son. Is there room for all of us? Yeah, in my Father's house, there are many dwelling places. Thomas says, Master, we don't know where you're going. How can we know the way? Jesus says, I am the way. How do you get into the Father's house? Follow him. He said I'm also the truth and the life. That means I'm the way in and I'm the goal of the process because the mansion I'm inviting you into is the mansion of God's own inner life.

See, Christianity is not just about being a nice person in this world. It's not just about making the world a better place. What it's finally about is this mystical insertion into the definitive temple, the definitive place of right praise. It's the heavenly temple, the Father's house, where there's room for all of us in the great space of the Holy Spirit. That, everybody, is the consummation really of what we call the resurrection of the Lord. That's the consummation of the whole life of the church to be gathered into that sacred temple.
