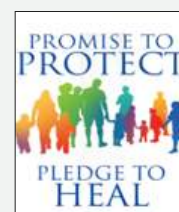

Reflection

Theology often reaches for the stars but sometimes cancels the trip because it gets lost in technical language that holds it back. To speak with any warmth about the great “Uncaused Cause” is not the language of poetry or song. So it is delightful for us to learn from Holy Scripture that our God is a loving family of Three Persons bound together by love. We hear about it and soon enough we not only long to be known by God but also to be loved by Him as well. Scripture tells us we are.

So it is that the original members of the Church had a certain confidence born from meeting and living with the risen Christ. When He promised them that He would send an Advocate, or Counselor, they automatically took Him at His word. So, what to do in the meantime? Pray.

Ah, there it is, the one item we frequently forget about when we’re in a difficult “place” in our lives, or when we have run out of our own resources to stay patient, hopeful, or confident.



Scholars of the Bible tell us, after reflecting on a passage like the one we hear today from John’s Gospel, that to possess life is to know the living Trinity in a bond of love. But how do bonds of love form? How do friendships thrive and grow? By spending time with the other person. By experiencing all the twists and turns involved in living on this great blue ball spinning on its axis day after day with God at our center. That is the essence of prayer. We do it often with words but sometimes with our respectful silence. Considering who we are with, our very Savior, listening is more of a priority than any of our talk.

In this world of talk all around us, available “24/7/365,” as they say, you might think listening is not important, or maybe a non-productive exercise in futility. What does the psalmist have God say? “Be still and know that I am God.” Turn off the big turntable of distraction and the smaller one of “ego” that makes us off-center. Stop what you’re doing and be “in the tent” with God as Moses was in the Exodus. Set aside perhaps 15 minutes to start and decide that in your day, “this belongs to God.” Let it become a habit. It will keep you focused and calm at

your center over time.

I note that our local PBS radio station offers a meditation time every day at 11:00 AM. That is the idea. Even if 11:00 AM might not be your best time, it shows that the producers of the program honor the habit of stopping the rush and being a thoughtful and loving person with God as your companion. The gathering of the Apostles with Mary and some other devoted women in that Upper Room as a unified family reflects the family oneness of the three Divine Persons. Today the Third Person comes to them with sound and power, signifying everything they need to know. And they rejoice in a rare peace through something called “prayer.”

We are nearing the close of Phase One of the St. Monica Safety Plan and we apologize if these changes have left a bad taste in your mouth but they have been implemented from the Diocese and the State of New Jersey from Security and Safety directives for schools and Houses of Worship. These protocols will eventually be required by all churches and houses of worship, St. Monica just happened to be one of the first asked to comply. Additional improvements that have been completed already are as follows:

- + Established single point-entry for both Religious Education Students and Parishioners.
- + Installed motion detection 360 degree LED lights around the church.
- + Coordinated with ushers to setup cones for safe walkway
- + Installed outdoor cameras to provide 360 degrees surveillance around the Church.
- + Installed Ring Doorbells cameras on 6 exterior Church doors.
- + Installed deadbolt locks to 4 interior Church doors.
- + Developed evacuation (egress) diagrams with primary and secondary re-assembly areas.
- + Purchased walkie talkies and 1 bull horn for communication and instructions.
- + Replaced 2 door's safety lock bars.
- + Installation of extenders and boosters to improve WiFi signals in church

As more changes are implemented we will keep you informed and we are looking into having Diocese and state officials address the parish ahead of any new updates and changes.

Bishop Robert Barron
7th Sunday of Easter
The Ascension

Peace be with you. Friends, we come together today on the 7th Sunday of Easter to the wonderful feast of the Ascension of the Lord, a very important feast and one that has all sorts of interesting theological and spiritual implications.

I want to draw your attention to our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. The risen Christ is gathered with His disciples on the mountain. When they had gathered together, they asked Him, Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?

Jesus answered them, It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by His own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and to all the world. Now, here's the important thing for us. Like the disciples, we very often want to ask Okay, Lord, when is all this going to come to fruition? Is it going to happen? What's it all about? When is all of this going to make sense? Reasonable enough questions, I suppose. And we hear the same answer, It's not for you to worry about. That's not the question you need to get resolved. Rather, what? The Holy Spirit will come upon you with power, and now go and witness to me around the world. In other words, don't worry about the ultimate resolution of all of this. Rather, get to work.

Now, I talked about Jesus moving to a higher dimension. Don't think of the Ascension as Jesus moving, you know, up through space within our dimensional system. Rather, the Ascension means that Jesus has now been translated into a higher dimension. We can call it heaven. But Heaven's a symbol, you know, the heavens, the sky, and the clouds. That's a symbol for what transcends our ordinary experience. Think of lines forming a square. It's two-dimensional. Now, raise that to three dimensions if the square becomes a cube. So, how many squares can fit in that cube? Well, an infinite number. At the higher dimension, it becomes inclusive of what is at the lower dimension. Jesus has ascended into heaven. Again, don't think of it as he's staying within our dimensional system He's moved to a higher pitch of existence.

So this is the image now of the ascended Christ who reigns and commands. The way a military leader, certainly would have gone up to a height from which you could survey the entire field of battle and give the commands how best to direct it. He's the commanding Lord now of the church, which participates in him. The mystical body, which is now being directed by the risen and ascended Christ. Stop looking up into heaven wondering when he'll come back, but rather get to work. He's going to send the Holy Spirit in power, and then he's going to direct you.

All of us are members of the mystical body. Do we see the grand plan? Is the Lord going to bring the kingdom to fruition? That's not for you to worry about. You worry about doing what the Spirit commands you to do.

When I was ordained did I understand the grand plan that the cardinal had in mind? No, much less the grand plan that Christ had in mind. But I had a confidence, I still have it, that in obeying that command, I was doing what I was supposed to do. I was making my contribution to the great task.

But here's where it links to the ascension. Because Jesus is not just an ordinary human being, because he's God from God, light from light, true God from true God, that act of his on the cross has an eternal dimension. It's not just happening at that one place in time 2,000 years ago, but it's been brought up into the heavenly temple where Jesus now eternally presents his sacrifice to the Father. That's the ascended Christ dwelling, as it were, in the heavenly temple. And every time we gather for mass and we represent the sacrifice of Jesus, we are in that same heavenly place. That's why at every mass, you should think about the ascension of Jesus in that heavenly temple, and we join our prayer and sacrifice to his. And this has been true for Christians up and down the ages, because Christ eternally stands outside of time.

So you can look up to heaven and say hey, when's he coming back? When will all this make sense? Just don't worry about it. Rather, when the Spirit comes, get to work. Do what you're told. Follow the prompting of the Spirit, even if you don't fully understand what you're doing. And I would also say, participate in the great sacrifice of the mass. In both those ways, we will realize the importance of this feast of the ascension of Jesus.
