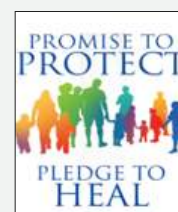

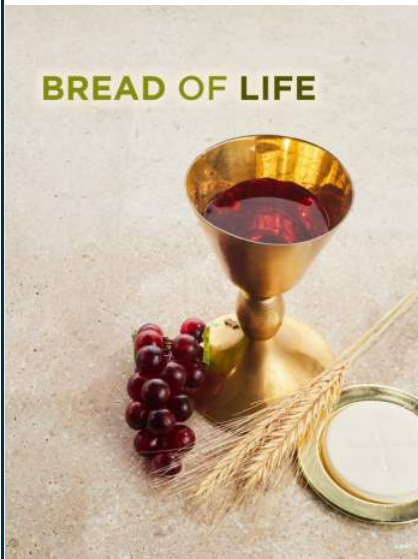
# Reflection

One of the great experiences of my life was my one and only trip to the Holy Land with 4 of my Philly priest brothers. Our natural leader was the Scripture professor at the seminary at that time, and a fine guide he turned out to be as we toured where Jesus walked. He helped energize my imagination to picture the various scenes as they would have been in Jesus' time, because many of the sacred places have over time had huge and beautiful churches built over them. Some of the locations he told us really developed from pious speculation because the gospel descriptions are difficult to pinpoint.

But I will never forget his measured voice when we came to the site of Pilate's headquarters and he said: "There is no doubt that Jesus passed under that arch." For some reason those words said then and there compelled me to intone a Latin hymn we all knew and the guys joined in.

Yet for all the "specializes" of that moment, it is still less than the most recent Mass I celebrated, because the real Jesus came to me and the congregation along with me in the Holy Eucharist,



Today we take time out to stop, look, and listen to the words of Jesus at that Supper we call "the Last." That name makes sense as the Lord's final meal before His death, but it was hardly the last time He would be with all those, like us, who believe in Him.

It is a cliché I know, to speak of repetition as a dulling agent for even this most sublime of realities. Most of us must struggle with that from time to time as the weekend rolls around and we come to worship the Lord and fulfill our Catholic duty. We speak so casually about going to "the 8:00 Mass" or "the 12:15" as the local schedule may be.

This feast, in the rhythmic Latin name of "Corpus Christi," compels us to think about what we do at Mass and whom we receive as our Food and Drink for strength to handle whatever the upcoming week will present us.

Even if we never make a pilgrimage to the actual land of Galilee and Judea; we meet in sacramental form the very Lord who assumed a flesh like ours and was like us "in all things but sin." He comes into our very flesh to "mingle with our mucous" as one Italian poet phrased it. He loves us so much that He comes to dwell within us, to "pitch His tent" with ours. As a result, we are never alone. Never without His presence. Unless by sin or neglect we invite Him to leave us.

Allow me to close with part of a First Communion hymn from an earlier time and place that still resonates with Faith:

***Jesus Thou art coming, holy as Thou art.  
Thou the God who made me, To my sinful heart.  
Jesus, I believe it, on Thy only word.  
Kneeling I adore Thee, as my King and Lord.***

Peace be with you, Friends. We come now to the marvelous feast that happens every June, the feast of Corpus Christi, of the body of Christ, the body and blood of the Lord. It must have made a massive impression on the first Christians, the fact that Jesus multiplies the loaves and fishes to the feeding of this great crowd. I'm going to look at the earliest version of it in the Gospel of Mark, because every part of it is worthy of meditation.

Here's how it begins. As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion for them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things. What's the first thing we learn here about Jesus? His compassion. A compassionate heart who understands our pain, our suffering, our need, our hunger.

Jesus looking out of the crowd and having compassion upon them is expressive of the heart of God on display throughout the Bible. Our God is a God of love and compassion. Never feel, even when you're going through tough times God is absent.

God is never absent, but always looking upon his people with compassion. And then we hear he began to teach them many things. How's the mass begin? With the priest or the bishop operating in persona Christi, the person of Christ, looking out upon his people with compassion.

And then he channels the words of God, I myself will come and shepherd my people.

Jesus is now the God of Israel in person, shepherding his people out of compassion. There's the whole Bible in a way.

When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, this is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late. Okay, deserted place. It's a straightforward description, you might say.

But anybody listening with biblical ears, when they hear deserted place, what do they think of? They think of the desert that separated slavery in Egypt from the promised land. They think of the 40 years of wandering in the desert. One of the most painful times in the 40 years of wandering in the desert.

And what does God do during that time? But he sends manna from heaven, It's this mysterious bread from heaven, this food from heaven came. That's when God, out of compassionate love, will feed us. He wants them to feed the crowd.

He wants them to contribute even the little they have as long as they give it to him. As long as they entrust the little they have to him, then they can feed the crowd. He gives us this wonderful prerogative of cooperating with his grace. So what little do you have? Give it to me, and you will find it multiplied unto the feeding of this massive crowd. And of course, that's what happened, the five loaves and the two fish multiplied into the feeding of this massive crowd of 5,000.

Think of something else here. It says before the multiplication, he ordered them to sit down in groups on the green grass. But again, listen with biblical ears. The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures.

Well, here he's doing it. He's led them to verdant pastures, to green pastures, and there he lays out a banquet for them. Now, remember I told you at the beginning of this story, it's like the mass.

Jesus looks out at his people. He's moved with compassion, and so he teaches them. There's the liturgy of the word. The manna is the liturgy of the Eucharist? Look at the offertory, you know a couple of people will bring forward to the priest a little wine, a little water, a few morsels of bread. There's a collection taken too at that time. We're giving to Christ the little bit that we have. But that little suborium of bread, that little bit of wine and water, what happens to it? It is transubstantiated, elevated into the body and blood of Christ, it feeds the soul to eternal life. That's the second part of the Mass, as the people lie down in verdant pastures, and the Lord, having multiplied what they gave him, eat to their satisfaction.

So everybody, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, have before your mind's eye the compassionate Christ looking out at you right now, perhaps lost, certainly hungry. He teaches you, and then he feeds you. How? Well, if you give him the little bit you have, you will find that multiplied unto the deepest satisfaction of your soul.

And may God Bless you all.

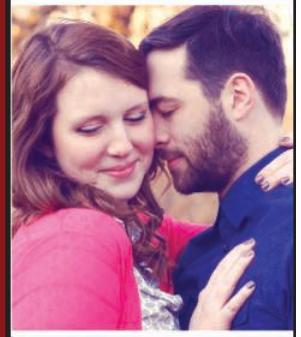
