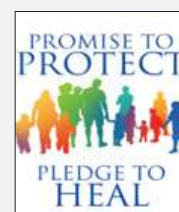

Reflection

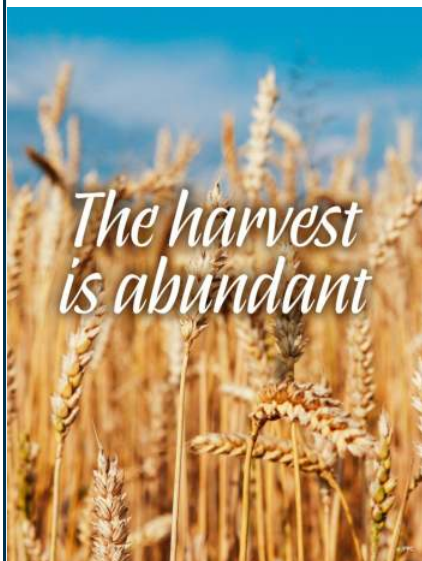

The popularity of TV game shows is proof positive that a lot of us like watching other people deal with both opportunity and choice. No matter which option they choose, there are always consequences. It is the nature of the game and the fun it provides.

Our lives, however, they may be demeaned by some as a “game,” are so much more. Certainly, more than TV shows. True, they involve both opportunity and choice, but the consequences are much more significant and lasting than prize money or some game show reward.

Robert Frost’s poem celebrates people who take “the road less traveled by.” The poet celebrates exceptional souls unafraid to be different. I believe we can confidently count the Twelve men Jesus chose as His Apostles to be just such special people.

Granted that the initial choice of them was all the Lord’s, yet each man responded positively to the call according to his unique nature. For all their acknowledged limitations, each man knew from the start that following this most charismatic a Leader as Jesus of Nazareth surely was the right decision and the only choice that mattered.



It did not take long for each of the Twelve to realize that there were consequences attached to the Lord’s choice. True, they may have enjoyed some of the acclaim Jesus received in His short public life in their days as preachers. But for sure they suffered for their loyalty and dedication to Him.

Sadly, we know that one of them experienced enough disillusion to become a traitor. All but one of them fled their positions at Christ’s side on the very day it mattered most. Only the youngest, out of the Eleven stayed with Him at the foot of the cross. Yet all but John died as martyrs.

We can all learn from their stories. To start, there is their very ordinariness that offers us encouragement if we are willing to admit that is us as well. None of them, for example, excelled as business leaders. No high scholarly degrees or academic honors came their way; they were none of them stars in the worlds of Arts and Literature. But oh, how they turned out to be models of faith, hope, and charity! Of loyalty and

love of God. Champions of that rare human achievement of being exactly what God wanted them to be, and of doing His holy will to the best of their ability.

The following worthwhile opinion is attributed to Theodore Roosevelt:

It is not the critic who counts, not the one who points out how the strong man stumbles or how the doer of deeds might have done better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred with sweat and dust and blood, who strives valiantly, who errs and comes short again and again; who knows the great enthusiasms, the great devotions, and spends himself in a worthy cause; who, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly. That his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who know neither victory nor defeat.

God love you and give you His peace.

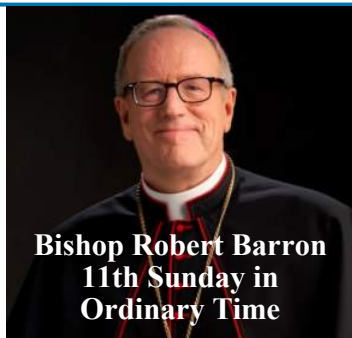

As we resume in the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, I want to talk to you about vocations, vocations specifically to the priesthood. It's not something I talk about that often in these Sunday sermons, but today's reading just jumped out at me. When I was a kid, when the priesthood was proposed or the priesthood was imaged or presented, it sang to me. It resonated in me very deeply, not against marriage, but at least for me in a deeper way. And so here I am now, many years later, I've been a priest for 40 years, been a bishop now for almost 11 years. But I'm looking up at my church and honest to God, I'm feeling the same thing. I felt that same sense of, yes, yes, that's what God wants me to do. That's the person God wants me to be. My brother and I are only 15 months apart, same parents, same education, same school, same everything.

And my brother never felt a call to the priesthood, but I did.

Now, here's why I'm thinking about this. Because our gospel for today from Matthew says: "At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned like sheep without a shepherd." You see, the Lord says to Ezekiel, I myself will come and shepherd my people. His heart moved with pity. It's the compassionate Christ who wants to shepherd his people because they're troubled and abandoned.

What's the priest called upon to do? To participate in this shepherding role of Christ. To feel that same pity, that same compassion for Christ abandoned and troubled people. Are there lots of troubled and abandoned people around today? Absolutely.

A lot of people are like sheep without a shepherd, and the same Christ is looking out in the same way at his church and feeling that same compassion. Listen, then he said to his disciples, the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. So, ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. What's he talking about? - The priesthood.

Yes, Christ could, I suppose, shepherd the whole church by himself, but he gives us the privilege and prerogative of sharing in his work. This is who I want to be. Someone that shares in Christ's shepherding ministry. I know there are people right now who feel that same attraction. If you're reading this right now. If you sense that, don't ignore it. If it's something that comes back to you again and again and again, even as you try to turn from it, but it comes back to you, that's a sign.

From the gospel again, "He gave them authority over unclean spirits." Are there unclean spirits around? You betcha. And Christ calls shepherds, pastors, warriors, and he gives them authority over these spirits. The real priesthood is this tough warrior's work. You don't dialogue with evil spirits. You drive them out. And it's priests who have been given that authority to do it, to cure every disease and every illness. I've known some priests who do indeed have the charism of physical healing. But more broadly speaking, disease and illness of the heart, of the mind, of the spirit, and authority now to heal. Priests are healers.

Look at the 12 disciples. These are hardly paragons of humanity. But yet the Lord called them and he equipped them and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He might be calling you. Jesus sent out these 12, instructing them thus, do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

There is plenty of work right now in our country, in our culture to find the lost sheep of the house of Israel. I mean, people who were born and raised Christian or Catholic, but who wandered far from Christ. That's the call of our time. Maybe you right now are feeling that call. Don't ignore it. Respond to it. Go and make the proclamation. The kingdom of heaven is at hand. But see, the priest is called upon to declare a different kingdom, the kingdom of heaven, the one that's come in power in Christ. And now we need people to proclaim it and to make it a reality. There's the call of the priest.

There are armies of people who are sick, who are leprous, who are demon possessed, who are spiritually dead, right? You know a lot of them. Maybe you've been there. You know about that.

You've been given gifts, grace. I think of my own vocation as that. It was a great grace. And it was weirdly awakened the other night when I looked up at my church and thought, yes, that's the life for me. That's what I'm supposed to do. Without cost, it was a grace. So now, without cost, you are to give. So give it without cost. Think about it. We need you, people right now reading this, who might feel this summons from Christ. Don't ignore it. Follow it. I have found it to be the source of the greatest joy in my life. That from the time I was a little kid, I allowed that call to kind of echo within my own soul.

And God bless you.

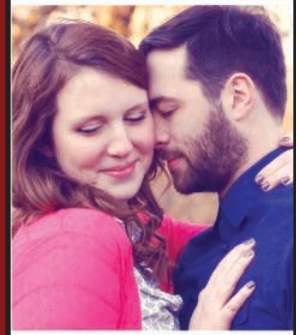
