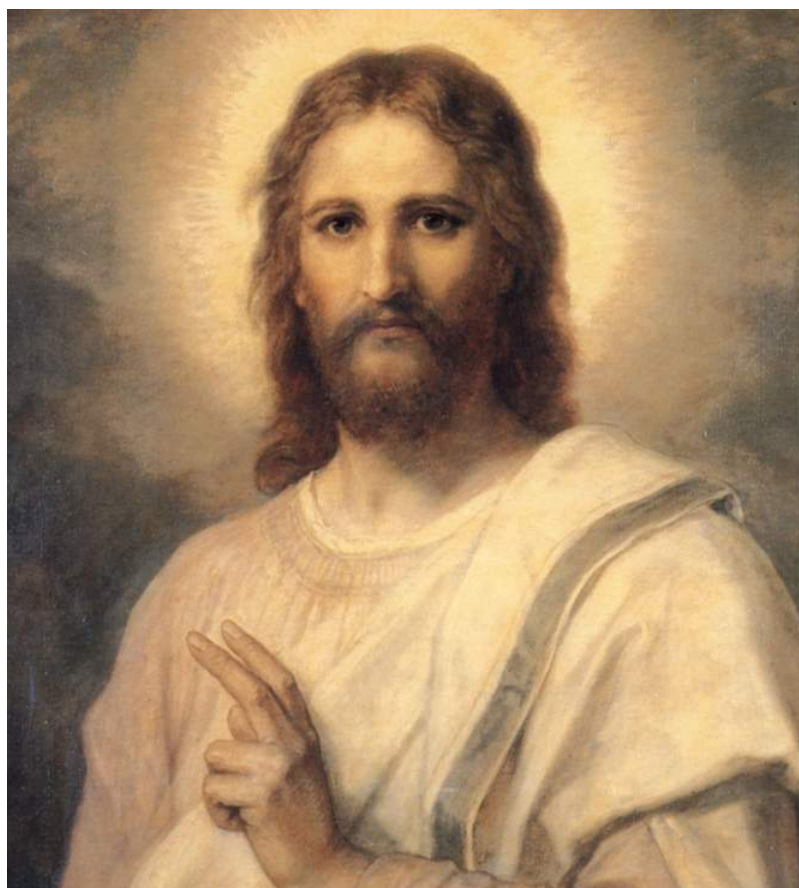

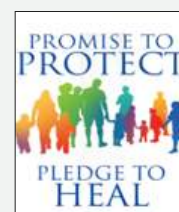

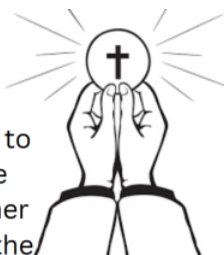

Reflection

Fifty-nine years ago, exactly, I realized my fear of heights. I was at the time a newly ordained curate (old title of an assistant priest, today a "parochial vicar") assigned to train the altar boys of the parish. (No girls allowed in the Eisenhower era.) Some of the boys' parents came up with the idea of a reward trip for the group to New York City. So, I joined in and rode the noise-filled yellow bus up to Gotham.

Of course, all the youngsters wanted to visit the top floor of the Empire State Building. So up we all went. When we all dashed out the enclosure there and walked to the fence to look down, one of us, yours truly, was caught to be suddenly stiff and scared to death. I slowly made my way back to the enclosed area. At least right away. Too long ago to recall exactly the reaction of the adults, but I am sure I told them (unless I had lost facial color!)

The point is that this fear of mine is a natural occurrence among a sizable portion of the population. But today Our Lord talks about a very different kind of fear. He boldly tells us not to fear those who can do us bodily harm, but rather those who can harm our souls. We know who they are.

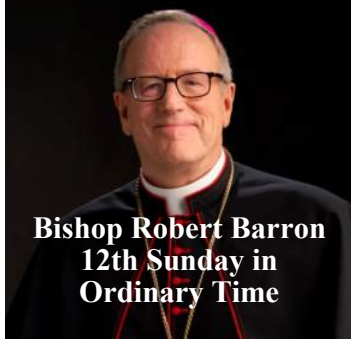


Satan as their leader. But oh, does he have his proxies. Consider the porn website creator, for example. They master the controls of the popular culture. We even make them celebrities. But note how they always make a mockery of Our Lord Jesus' ways even if they do so with a subtlety that often catches us unaware.

At times, they seem to have the upper hand. They zero in on Christianity, particularly our Catholic Church. So, we obviously need heroes of faith. Who are they? We can start by noting that in the long march of Church history we find people we call "saints." Once they were martyrs in the Roman arena. But we can name a teenager named Carlo with a laptop in hand to teach faith to his peers. But never undervalue the power of your good lives. Today we can hopefully honor your good father who made that choice for Christ and deserves a "Father's Day."

Allow me to honor the martyrdom of one St. Polycarp, who was burned at the stake for his faith in its early days. The aged Polycarp had been arrested by the Roman authorities and brought to the arena for execution in front of the cheering crowd. The proconsul pressed him hard and said, "Swear and I will release you. Just revile Christ." Polycarp replied, "Eighty and six years have I served Him and He never did me wrong. How can I now blaspheme my King that has saved me?" Talk about being fearless!

12th Sunday in
Ordinary Time

Peace be with you, Friends. In this the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time we're met with a bracing spiritual teaching from the Lord Jesus. The Church has very wisely, cleverly coupled our gospel for today with a passage from the Prophet Jeremiah. I'd like to begin with that passage. "I hear the whisperings of many, terror on every side, denounce, let us denounce him. Well, this is what the Prophet hears in the wake of his prophecy. All those who are my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine."

You know, you say something, you write an article, and people are just watching for you to say something wrong. Well, this is the reaction that Jeremiah gets to his prophecy. He says, "but the Lord is with me, like a mighty champion. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked." Now, notice here, this is not a game of either-or.

It's not, oh look, my troubles have all disappeared, and all that's left is the grace of God. Rather, if I can put it this way, it's in my struggles and during my conflicts and anxieties, I sense a power greater than all of them.

Not, oh God is with me, therefore I have no problems. But rather, in my struggles and in my troubles, I still sense a power that is greater. Okay? Now, listen to how all this is amplified and intensified in the teaching of Jesus.

Here's the Lord now speaking our gospel for today. "Fear no one, he said. No matter who's threatening you, no matter who is thundering denunciation, no matter who is coming at you with a furious intensity, don't be afraid." Now, why? Because in Jesus Christ, you become connected to the very power of God, to that power which is here and now creating the universe. You stand above all the vagaries of space and time. You are in the center of that famous wheel of fortune, which I've spoken of before. The wheel that turns. Sometimes you're up, sometimes you're down, sometimes you're losing, sometimes you're gaining. That's life.

It just goes that way. Health and power and pleasure and honor, the wheel turns all the time. But when you're in Christ, you're not on the edge of the wheel, you're in the center of the wheel that doesn't change.

Shift the metaphor. When you're in Christ, you're in the interior castle, to use Teresa of Avila's language. That means no matter how much violence and mayhem is going on outside, you have found a place of safety and a place of power.

Notice, please, now how wonderfully Jesus expresses this. He says, do not be afraid of those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul. See, the body passes. The body, if you want, lives on the edge of the wheel of fortune. But the soul, that place where you are in living contact with God, that soul endures forever. So, if I can put it this way, get your fears in right order and properly prioritized. Listen again to Jesus, "Rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both body and soul in Gehenna."

Where does courage come from? It comes from living in Christ. Don't be afraid of those that can kill the body and do nothing else. Notice too none of the great saints lived a serene life. That's to say, a life free of worry and threat and persecution. Just the contrary. Somehow it's assumed that those who believe in God expect their lives to be a bowl of cherries. People say, you believe in God, but how then could you explain the fact that you're going through suffering? Is there any page of the Bible that says, oh yeah, those who believe in God, they'll be perfectly fine. Nothing bad will ever happen to them. On the contrary.

It's not the either-or of, okay, you believe in God, or you have struggles. No, it's finding courage in the midst of the struggle. Finding the courage that gets you through the negativity of your life. I love the lines from that great hymn. No storm can shake my inmost calm, while to that rock I'm clinging. Since love is Lord of heaven and earth, how can I keep from singing? That's not someone who is just living an easy life.

That's someone who is experiencing the storm, but nevertheless clings to a rock in the midst of the storm. He knows that love ultimately is Lord of heaven and earth, and that's why despite the pain and the struggle, he can't keep from singing. There's our great spiritual lesson for today, and may God bless you all.

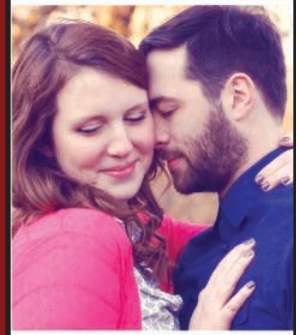
