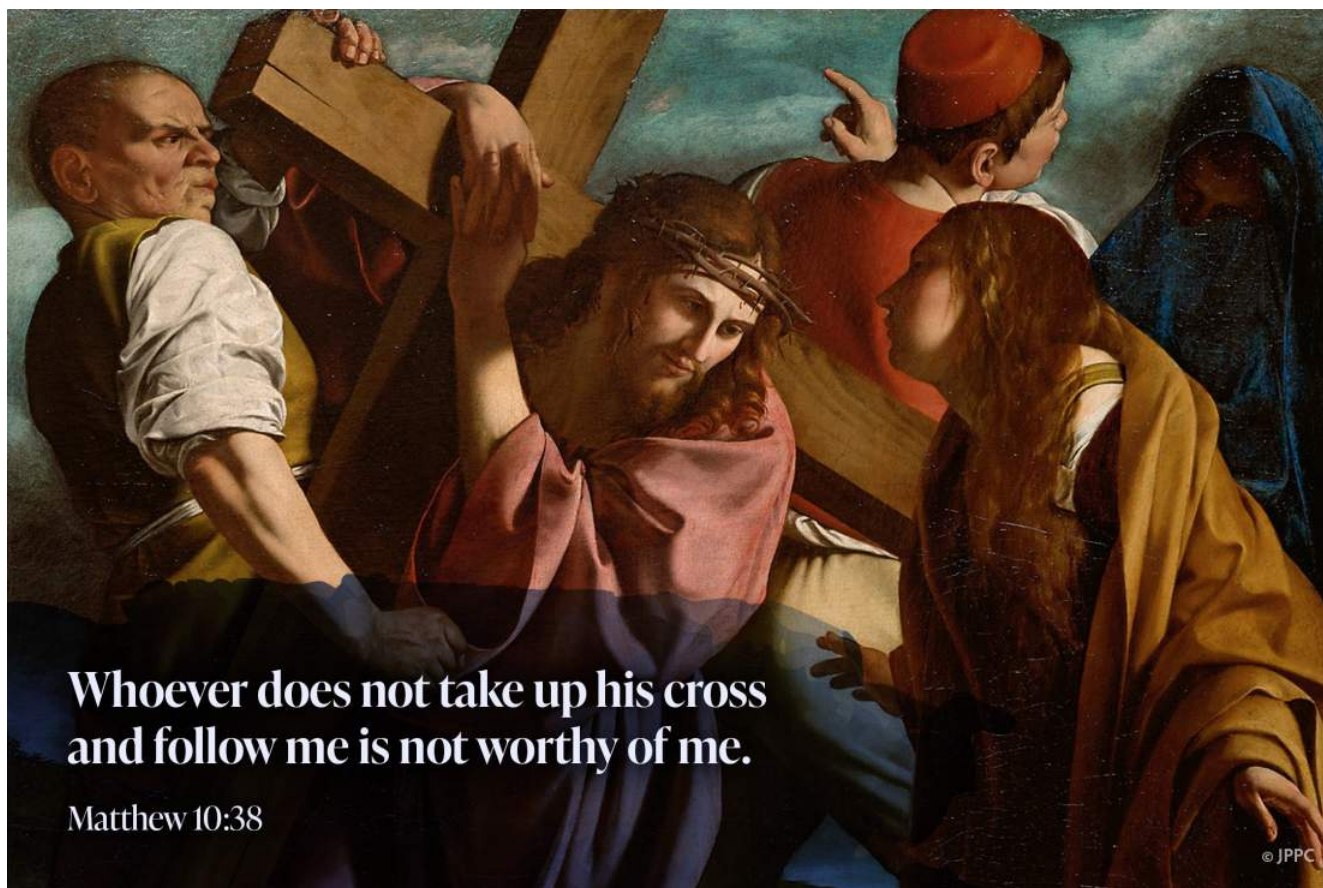

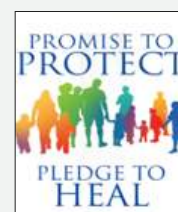

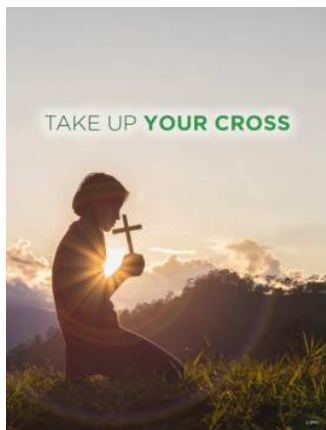

TOWN HALL DISCUSSION
Follow Up

Our thanks and appreciation to the Director of Security for the Diocese of Trenton, Mr. Adrian Mendez for his time and sharing his expertise in law enforcement while visiting our parish. He provided a detailed explanation of the unfortunate environment we live in today and why churches and schools are targets. Mr. Mendez also pointed out several best practices such as single point entry and why this was important. We also like to thank all those who took time out of their busy schedules to attend our town hall and asked questions during the Q&A and were provided feedback from the director and the St Monica Safety and Security Team on specific issues currently being addressed as well as our future grant application submission requirements. The discussion and questions have been extremely helpful in explaining the precautions and necessary best practice measures strongly recommended by the Diocese of Trenton and the State of NJ that were identified our diocese assessment and are undertaking to ensure our parishioners and students safety.

As we move forward implementing the St. Monica Safety Plan we will keep the parishioners, parents of students periodically informed of our progress.



Reflection

By definition, human interest stories that come our way through books or other sources are a welcome reprieve from the negative types that dominate the news these days. Otherwise, we would conclude that nothing good ever happens on our home planet. Smiles would be rare and laughter never heard. In today's Gospel section, Our Lord makes clear where He should rank in our list of loves, we agree. But note that truly loving Him involves embracing His cross.

He expounds on the simple but decisive ways we can attain the reward of heaven through service to others; such service is always of human interest.

So, who are the "little ones" in our world that deserve "even a cup of cold water?" In the context of this gospel, the "little ones" Our Lord refers to starts with the Apostles. Ordinary men called to be extraordinary. So, they must rely on the hospitality of others. Jesus insists that when we serve others we are actually serving Him.

Another deserving group is that of children. Jesus often uses them as examples in His teaching on faith. They are literally "little ones." Children are innocent and trusting. So, they are apt pupils for learning the ways of right living in Christ. How awful when we adults let them down by our bad example. What delight there is in knowing of all the parents, teachers and other adults in the world who dedicate themselves to giving children good example.

As is so, often the case, the gospel acts as a mirror held up to our consciences for inspection. Could a human interest story or two be written about us? Does Sunday Mass have a lasting effect on our behavior? Good question to ask and answer on a Spring Sunday or anytime.

Of course, it is good not to look for praise to come when you are doing your good deeds. Once when George Bush the elder was president, he was doing his public relations thing by visiting a nursing home He came upon a wizened old man hobbling down the corridor. President Bush took the man by the hand and asked, "Sir, do you know who I am?" The man replied, "No, but if you ask one of the nurses, she'll tell you." God love you and give you His peace.



Peace be with you friends. The one thing Christianity is not is run-of-the-mill or ordinary. In fact, I'm going to go out on a limb and say there is no religious figure anywhere in the religions or philosophies of the world who is stranger and more demanding, more relentless, than Jesus. Therefore, the religion attached to Jesus could be the strangest of them all.

Now, I'm going to put Exhibit A to you today, and it's from our gospel, Matthew chapter 10. Jesus says to His apostles, listen, whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me. Whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.

I mean, a parent would say, this is the most important obligation of my life. I've known lots of people in my own generation who became parents, and I knew them when they were, you know, goofball teenagers, then they become a parent, and something happens.

Once that child arrives, they are different, because now that child is everything to them. They'll give their life to protect that child. Think of a little kid and their love for their parents, the intensity of that connection. Think of when a parent gets old and the children feel this obligation to care for their parents. Jesus is intentionally summoning the most powerful affect that we have in us. But then listen to him.

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me. Whoever loves son or daughter, think of again a young father, just had a child, and those feelings of passionate connection. I'll die for you, that feeling that the father has for a child. Whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me."

Now, I submit to you, the Buddha would not say this. Muhammad wouldn't say this. Moses wouldn't say this. Confucius wouldn't say this. You name them, I don't know anybody in the philosophical or religious tradition who would say such a strange thing, but Jesus says it. Your love for me, personally, has to go beyond the most intense loves of your life. I'd happily die for this child. Yeah, but you need to love me more than that.

Now, you see the point I'm making, and why I speak of the strangeness of Christianity? This is every bit as high a Christology as the prologue to John. In the beginning was the Word, the Word was with God, the Word was God, the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. We say, yeah, John's telling us that Jesus is God. Well, Jesus is saying the same thing here, just using a somewhat different rhetorical style and symbol system. I mean, who is the one who should be loved beyond the most intense loves you possibly have? Well, God, only God. Yes, Jesus is a very interesting teacher.

He wouldn't say this unless he himself in person were the highest good. You can't be neutral about this, which is precisely why the same Jesus says, unless the one who's not with me is against me, either you gather with me or you scatter. You have to make a decision about Jesus.

He goes on, whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Okay. So you're telling me I have to love you, Lord, more than I love my own children, more than I love my own parents? That's exactly what I mean. And now you're saying, unless you take up your cross every day and follow me, you're not worthy of me? That's not what he's saying here. It's not when bad things happen, offer up to God and accept it in a patient spirit. No, but instead He's saying, unless you take up your cross, seek it out on your own.—You do it! Just as Jesus took up his cross so that he might bear the sins of the world and thereby take them away, just as he suffered the death that we were owed, just as he bore our burdens, so we are actively to bear the burdens of others.

He means you who follow me, you who love me more than you love your own children. You need every day to bear other people burdens and to do so actively. Seek out opportunities to bear the burden of somebody else. What if you were to begin your day that way? Instead of saying, okay, how am I going to make more money today or become more popular today or become more successful today? Instead of asking those questions, ask, where's someone right now who's carrying a burden around and what can I do to lighten it? Whose cross can I pick up the way Simon of Cyrene helped Jesus carry his cross? Here's the test. Are you willing every day to do this? Because if you don't, you're actually not worthy of me. Is there anything else? I'm saying it on purpose that way, just to show how dramatic this is.

Now, listen to how this is summed up. Whoever finds his life will lose it. Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. That's a formula, everybody. Love Jesus more than you love your own parents, children, and life. And then do what Jesus did, bear people's burdens, and you will actually find your life. Okay, one more step. Listen to him. Whoever receives you, receives me. And whoever receives me, receives the one who sent me. I think in many ways, that's the whole gospel in a nutshell. When we love Jesus above all, we love him more than we love our own children, we bear other people's burdens, we take up the cross every day. When we do that, we become the most effective ambassadors possible for Christ. Again, whoever receives you, receives me.

So if someone sees you bearing the burdens of another, taking up your cross willingly, loving Jesus above your own life and your own children and parents, well, he'll receive Christ through you. And in receiving Christ, he'll receive also the one who sent Christ, namely the Father.

There it is, Matthew chapter 10 in a nutshell. As far as I'm concerned, everything else in Christianity is a footnote to that. And may God bless you all.

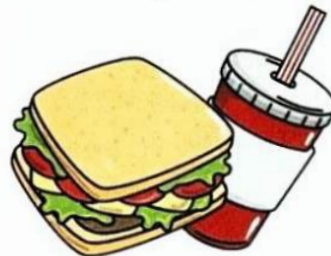

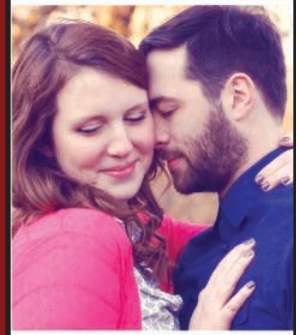
