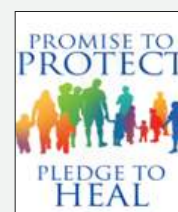

First Breath Initiative

Today we honor one of our parishioners, **Gabriella Graves**. Gabby, 15 has created, established and founded First Breath Initiative. The youth led program’s initiative is to support mothers and, most importantly, babies by collecting and redistributing gently used baby essentials like clothing, diapers, bottles, blankets, and other infant items. A lot of families already have baby items their children have outgrown, and she’s hoping to create a way for those items to be shared with families who need them and promote life.

A major part of this initiative is making sure mothers facing unexpected circumstances have access to real, practical support, resources, and community care so they don’t feel alone in caring for their child, and they understand abortion is not their only option. The goal is to help provide mothers in need with life promoting alternatives and resources. Gabby says, “By turning these used baby necessities over to families in need, I am hoping to support the birth of new life. I believe that every human has value and that no woman should think that abortion is her only option, and by showing mothers that they have other choices, access to baby essentials, and support, we can promote that.”

In the coming weeks look for the bin located in the church where you can drop off your gently used items. All collected items would be sorted and distributed locally to people in need through community organizations that can help do so, and all pick-up/drop-off can be done by us.

July 11: St. Benedict – The founder of the Benedictine Order and the patron saint of Europe.

Reflection

It can be a contemporary office seeker's response to a reporter. Or a remembered comment from a persecuted Christian missionary. Or your pastor's statement in his homily last weekend. Or even a remark made by your 6 year old granddaughter. You will note it. You may even remember it, at least for a while. But the odds are that you won't retain it for long. It's the way it is with us poor humans. Most of the time.

But today we meet a glorious exception to the rule. Isaiah the prophet "nails it," as we so often say. I refer to God's holy Word and how powerful it is. Here is the prophet's timeless assessment from today's First Reading: "For as the rain and snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth...so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I intend, and prosper in the thing for which I sent it."



This on God's part, is not a wishful hope or a mere possibility. It is a bold proclamation made in confidence. As such, it should give us confidence when we truly hear it. So many other "words" across history have gotten lost or contradicted by actual events. But not God's word.

The parable of the Sower teaches us how indifferent responses to the word of the kingdom prove to be unfruitful. Distractions come first of all from the world; and then from the flesh; and finally, from the devil.

On the other hand, fruit brought forth from the responsive heart is everywhere and abundant. "Fruit" is a word common in bible usage to represent the good works and faithfulness that flow from God's grace. And that can be measured as a hundredfold, or sixty, or thirty. The measurement is God's task. The producer of the response is either you or me or both.

The story has been told of a new commander who was sent to an army fort on the American frontier. He soon was involved in a conference with an important Indian chief. Working through a translator, he nervously asked the chief a number of questions and was surprised to get no reply. After the meeting, he asked the translator why he had gotten no response. The translator replied, "That's what we call Indian time." "He has enough respect for your questions to go away and think about them before answering them."

Maybe we all need to practice more "Indian time."

Peace be with you Friends, our first reading this week is from the 55th chapter of the book of the prophet Isaiah. It's one of the most powerful reflections we have in the Bible on God's word. The power of God's word, the effect of God's word. Listen now as Isaiah speaks.

"Just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth. In the beginning, God said, let there be light, and there was light." God's word does not simply describe a state of affairs, it creates a state of affairs. This expression of God's mind accomplishes what it says. When God spoke to the prophets, they were changed.

We hear, of course, in the Gospel of John, In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God, and that through this Word all things were made. This creative Word of God. You know, this intuition links all religions. All the religions of the world basically believe in this creative power. But it also links religion to science, art, technology, and philosophy. In all these areas, we hear God's Word. But then, the Bible tells us there's something more. God speaks an even more pointed Word. Now, not a different God, same God who creates all things, but yet speaks a more pointed Word. This time addressed to the freedom of His intelligent creatures. Addressed to us, God's Word is an invitation into friendship. Revelation, we call this.

Now, again in the words of John, the Word, yes, that same Word now becomes flesh, becomes this particular first century figure, Jesus of Nazareth. And in Him, we find the most pointed expression of God's invitation into friendship. In all these ways, God sows the seed of His Word.

You know, some people over the centuries have been brought to faith through the ordered intelligibility of the universe. Others are brought to faith through a deep meditation upon the prophets and teachers of the Old Testament. Others, then, through this living encounter with the Word made flesh. All of this is the background to our Gospel reading, this wonderful parable from the 13th chapter of Matthew's Gospel. Jesus speaks of the sower who sows the seed, some landing on good soil, some on rocky, some on thorny soil, some on soil with no roots.

And He speaks of the different ways that the seed takes root. How is God's Word being sown? All the time, everywhere, in every place. And listen now, the most important thing you can do in your life the most important decision you have to make is how you respond to it. God's speaking all the time, everywhere, sometimes whispering, sometimes very indirectly. All through life's daily events you get God's Word whispering to you, speaking to you. You might be hearing it in the words of Scripture. You might be hearing it from the lips of a preacher.

The Lord says, The seed sown in the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. God's Word, sown now into your mind, into your heart, whether it comes through nature, through science, through the Scripture, through Christ himself, it's sown in you. But now, you can allow that seed to die if you do not seek to understand it. In the great Catholic tradition, the Word of God is always something we are called upon to reflect on.

Second thing now, listen to what the Lord says. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the Word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a short time. This too is very common in the religious life. You hear the Word of God, and it penetrates very deeply into you. And you receive it with great joy and enthusiasm. But you don't allow it to take deep root in you. Notice people who become very religious. It's like a match being lit, and it flares up, and they're full of enthusiasm. But then when troubles arise, doubts arise, you return to the ordinary routines of life, that faith can sort of dry up. You have to hang in there through the ups and downs of life if you want it to come to fruition in you.

Last one. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the Word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the Word and it bears no fruit. A third way now, the Word of God, can be stopped in you. You hear it, but then all the distractions of the world, money and fame and power and pleasure, all those distractions come in, and like thorns, they choke off the seed. When you hear the Word of God, you must make that the central, abiding preoccupation of your life. If you don't let that happen, that Word can also fade away. So, how do you respond? The Lord is sowing the seed of His Word every moment of every day in everything and everybody you encounter. The most important question in your life, how do you respond to it? And may God bless you.

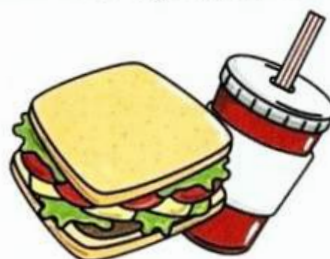

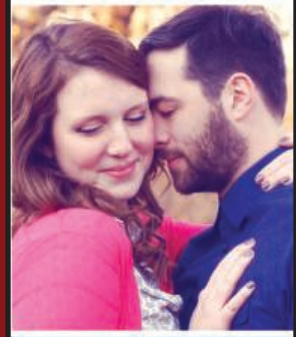
