# Reflection

August could be called “the month for daydreamers.” I say that guardedly because not all of us are on vacation. But a lot of people are. Those lucky souls have the chance to stare up into the sky from wherever they go to relax and daydream as they note the shape of the clouds. Or they could lie back on the beach sand or their backyard hammock and think deep thoughts along with their dreams. May I suggest one such thought that would not arise immediately, but it is encompassed by the famous story we read in the gospel for today? It is “the priesthood of the laity.”

Obviously, there is what the Church calls “the ministerial priesthood.” This is the one instituted by Christ at the Last Supper table when He told his baffled Apostles to “Do this in memory of Me.” That’s the priesthood of the ordained gentlemen who graduated from a seminary.

But we can turn to St. Paul’s writings to tell us what the Church has steadfastly taught, and still does, about another priesthood more common and fundamental namely the “priesthood of the faithful.” Paul writes: “Through Baptism all the members of the Church share in the priesthood of Christ.”



Now this doesn’t mean that you should start shopping for Mass vestments. Or look for the nearest seminary. Rather, does this teaching give a formal name to what you have hopefully been living your whole life. That is, living as Christ would if He were in your place. It also encourages you “to share their ordained priests’ anxieties and help them as far as possible by prayer and active work so that they may be better able to overcome difficulties and carry out their duties with greater success.” (Vatican II, no.9)

So, you and I are in a certain partnership with Christ to continue His work here below. In that way, we are assured of a spot in the “place above.” Just by your example of being here at Mass to worship God on an August Sunday when so many “so-called Catholics” who should be here are not. This priesthood we share makes us both like the boy in this closing story who is flying his kite.

The boy’s kite was so high that it had disappeared into the clouds. A man came by and asked, “Why are you holding on to that string?” The boy said, “I’ve got a kite up there.” The man looked up and said, “I don’t see it.” The boy replied, “Well, I know it’s there because I can feel the tug.”

That’s like the tug we all feel from time to time in our hearts, which lets us know that God is for real and He cares for you. That’s a fact, and not a summer daydream.

God love you and let you feel His tug this week.



Peace be with you. Friends, our Gospel for today is one of the most beloved stories in the New Testament. Listen to how Matthew describes it. When Jesus heard of the death of John the Baptist, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. The crowds heard of this and followed him on foot from their towns. The people come out by thousands to look for him. And they find themselves with him in a deserted place.

How does it unfold? Well, the disciples realized the problem. Jesus has been healing and teaching this crowd in a deserted place. And there are thousands of them. Evening comes on and they say, Lord, dismiss the crowds so that they can go to the villages and buy food for themselves. Notice something here. The movement of sin is always in the direction of

dispersion.

Lord, send them away. Dismiss them so they can get some food for themselves. Every man for himself. There's the voice of sin. What's the voice of grace? Bearing each other's burdens in love. That's the voice of grace. That's the voice of God's kingdom. Jesus, as always, is the voice of communion. Communion, compassion, together. Listen to what he says. There is no need for them to go away. Give them some food for yourselves.

So these people are threatened. They're in an isolated place. They're hungry. There's no food available. They're in danger. Our first instinct is to disperse the crowd. Jesus says, no, we hang together, we stay as one. In the communion of the kingdom of God, we bear each other's burdens in love.

No food? We don't say, that's your problem. It's our problem. We're in this together. You do something to solve this problem. God loves dispensing his providence through secondary causes. God gives us the privilege of participating in his own providence. You do something about it. You take the steps needed.

What do we need? Then you act, you do something about it. That's all contained, I think, in this beautiful command of Jesus. You give them something to eat. Now, what do the disciples do? They say, Lord, all we've got are five loaves and two fish. There are 5,000 people here, not counting women and children. What are we supposed to do, we got five loaves and two fish.

What does Jesus say? Give them to me. And then he multiplies them in such a way that every person is fed and filled. And in fact, there are 12 baskets left over. Spiritual lesson, you give what you have, even if it's very little to Christ, it will be multiplied. You give Christ your mind, your will, your energy, your compassion, even if they're very small, even if it's only you and a couple of friends, you give it to Christ and you will find that the whole thing becomes multiplied for his purposes. Jesus wants us to cooperate with him, yes, and we do it by giving even the little that we've got and we'll be shocked and surprised to find the effect that it has in the world. You'd be surprised what Christ can do with it.

Think for a second of Mother Teresa, I've told her story before, but this nun in her 30s who left the relative comfort of the high school where she was teaching and she walked into the worst slum in the world and simply began caring for those who were dying. What if someone said to her, well, we have to do something about this crisis in Calcutta and she were to say, well, who am I to address it? Well, she didn't say that, she just went and began caring for the dying.

Soon she was joined by her former students and then by friends, then by admirers, and now the missionaries of charity, the order she founded, covers the whole world and its works have been of enormous power in transforming the world and in serving Christ and his church. We could tell these stories ad infinitum, it's the story of how the church works. The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, it begins very small, but in time it grows into this great tree and the birds of the air make their nests in it. The kingdom of God is like a boy giving five loaves and a couple of fish to Christ Jesus and then watching that grow into an enormous power.

Friends, no gift is too small and may God bless you.

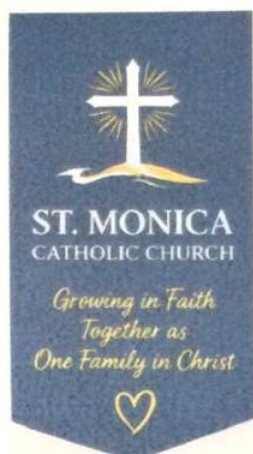

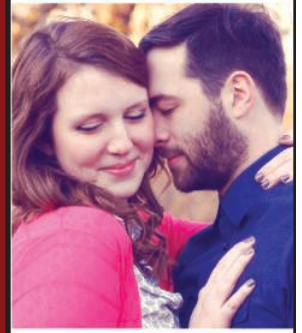

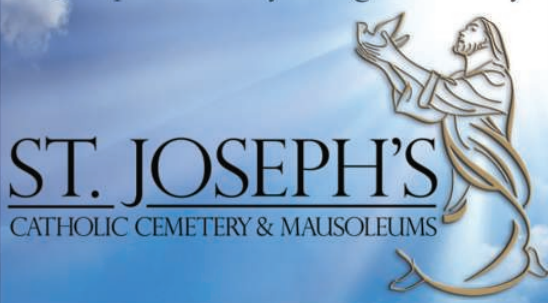
