Reflection

When it happened to me, it felt like what I imagine a heart attack might feel like. Sudden, surprising, painful. The pain came from information relayed by a person who was, at the time, one of our diocesan officials in the clergy office. He told me what another priest had said in a negative critique of me. The assessment came from someone I happened to admire. Hearing his judgment of me hurt doubly for that very reason.

While this took place many years ago, the incident springs to mind immediately whenever I think of our good Lord's admonition found in today's Gospel: "So will my heavenly Father do to you unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."



Boy, is that hard to do sometimes! There have been similar examples in my life, but the one I cited stands out the most because of the hurt. After that wears off with time, a certain justifiable anger can still well up within us. We start creating a line of defense witnesses as we put the offending one on an imaginary trial in the courtroom of our minds.

In His human nature, Our Lord knew all about such hurt and anger. After all, He was like us in all things but sin. But listen again to those words of His as He hung, the victim of hate, on that Roman cross of pain and punishment: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

So, despite any and all efforts we might make to get out from under this teaching of His—and some of us are quite clever about that—we must either obey Him or walk away. It's the biggest mistake any of us can make, once we know and believe Him to be the Son of God: the One who really practiced what He preached, the One who loves us despite ourselves.

Once upon a time, a friend of Clara Barton, the founder of the American Red Cross, reminded her of an especially cruel thing that had been done to her years before. But Miss Barton seemed not to recall it.

"Don't you remember it?" her friend asked.

"No," came the reply. "I distinctly remember forgetting it."

You can't be free and happy if you harbor grudges, so put them away. Get rid of them. Collect postage stamps or collect coins, or model trains, if you wish—but don't collect grudges.

God love you as you collect new graces in your life.

God love you and give you that peace.



Peace be with you. Friends, our readings for this week are very powerful, and they're about a theme that is difficult to talk about. I'm talking about forgiveness. Now, we all love to be forgiven, but forgiving others, that's another story. Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight. We don't want to forgive. The vengeful will suffer the Lord's vengeance, for he remembers their sins. Forgive your neighbor's injustice, then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven. Oh, that correlation between God's forgiveness of us, our forgiveness of others, between our willingness to forgive, and our capacity to be forgiven.

We cling, we hold fast to our hatreds. The gospel story is that wonderful parable about the man who has been forgiven by his master for his many, many debts, and yet he strangles those under him who owe him much less than he himself owed. And the people find this terrible and off-putting. The relationship between God's forgiveness of us, and our forgiveness of others. You know, the key to this is actually in our second reading from Paul to the Romans. Listen as Paul speaks.

None of us lives for oneself. No one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord. Your life, it's yours, yes, but it's not about you. You belong to God. Whether you live or die, you live for the Lord, you die for the Lord. It's God's plans for us, God's desires for us, God's projects for us. Our existence, the totality of who we are, is not ours, but rather comes to us from God as a gift. Therefore, the whole of our lives is for God's purposes, serves God's ends. Friends, when we allow this to sink in, what we find is the capacity to forgive. Therefore, you exist to be an instrument of God's peace. When you make that transition, then you find that real forgiveness is possible. You don't need to cling to your hatreds or this terrible sense of self-righteousness. You exist under God and for God. And this is precisely why the scriptures make this link between the divine forgiveness and our forgiveness of others.

How often do you forgive your brother or sister? Seven times? No, says Jesus, not seven times, but I tell you, 70 times, seven times. How often do you forgive? Always, always, always. Even when it's a great injustice or supremely unfair what they did to you? Yes. Seven times that many times? No, 70 times, seven times.

So we are called to forgive those who harm us. How about some concrete advice in how to become better forgivers of sin? First one, keep your own sins frequently before your mind's eye. I know we want to forget them. We're very good, exceptionally good at keeping the sins of others before our mind's eyes. Don't you often sit back at the end of a long day and purposely remind yourself of all the ways that you've been offended? We're very good at that. That's very easy. What's very difficult is keeping our own sins before our mind's eyes.

Remember your own sins. Concrete ways to do this, use the confiteor at mass. You know, where we say "I confess to Almighty God." How often those words just kind of trip past the lips.

Beginning of Mass, when we say, Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy. When the priest says, let's pause for a few moments and call the mind our sins, are we daydreaming or do we take that opportunity concretely to remind ourselves of our need to be forgiven? Use the confiteor at Mass. Lord, I confess I've sinned.

Use the Lord's Prayer. Again, words that just sort of trip off the tongue, but at the very center of the Lord's Prayer, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. There's a correlation there that's not just accidental. We beg for the Lord's forgiveness in the measure that we become forgivers of those around us. You know, I could do a whole series of sermons on confession. We have to find a way to revive this sacrament, this central sacrament. Essential to Jesus' preaching was the word of forgiveness. Seeking the Lord's forgiveness, admitting our sinfulness, it's a way of making you a better forgiver.

Finally, forgive through a concrete act or a concrete sign. Don't let forgiveness simply stay as a validity in your mind, as a vague abstraction. No, signal it with a word, with a note, with a visit, with a phone call, with some concrete sign. Let people know. Let yourself know that you've offered forgiveness. Friends, practice these things. Forgive because we've been forgiven. Our lives don't belong to us. They belong to God. Therefore, why are we clinging to all these past resentments? Let's let God's forgiving grace flow through us to others. And may God bless you all.

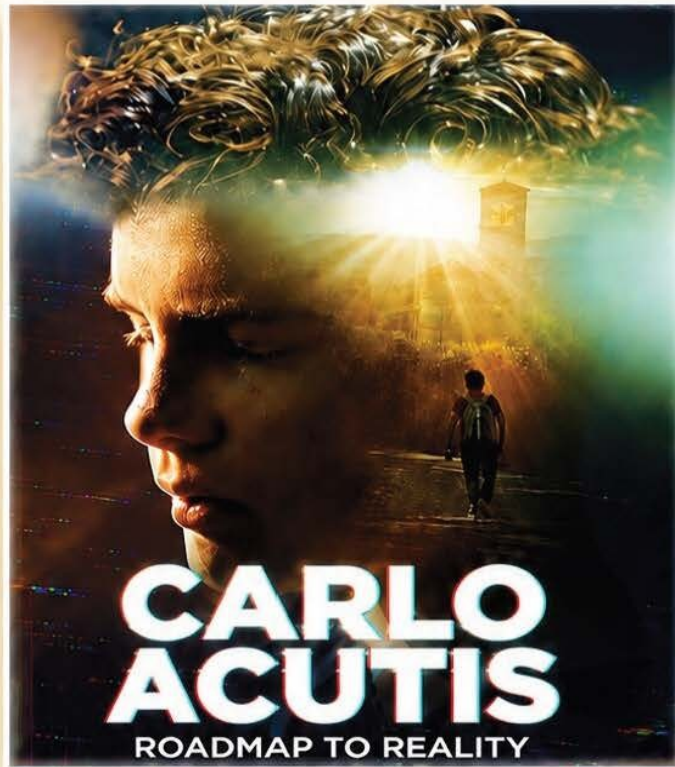

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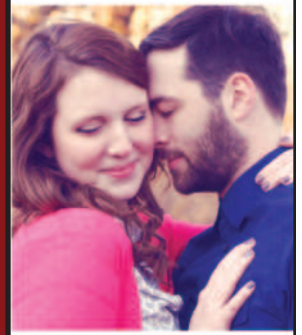
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
